

Hennessey Town Trustees voted last week at the regular meeting to issue a request for a bid to replace all of the storm sirens in town that were installed in 1956. This was originally voted on in September 2018 but was not acted upon because an OG&E plan was needed. Mayor Bert Gritz said, "This will replace all of our storm sirens. There are currently 5. The siren on the water tower is not functioning. It has been there for 67 years. The ones near the school and on Oakwood Dr. were installed in 1973, the others in town were bought used from Stillwater and are about 20 years old." This new plan will replace several and relocate others to offer better coverage.

#### **Siren Locations**

The proposed locations include 625 N. Arapaho, the SE corner of Iowa and Walnut St. (replacing existing sirens), E 2nd St on the Senior Citizen property, the SW corner of the 200 block of W. 6th St., and the W end of Ike's Ave. in Ike's Acres. A different electronic siren would be placed in the 100 block of West 1st St. This one can play chimes at noon and also be a public address speaker during events.

Gritz explained that the current system is activated with a phone line and is subject to outages. The new system is activated via wireless radio and would have battery backup in case of power outages. Gritz said, "It will do a self-test daily without making a sound. The system could be activated via 2-way radio from the field by police or fire if needed.

## NEW STORM SIRENS HENNESSEY DISPATCH MOVES TO 911 CENTER

The conversation got a little tense at last week's Hennessey Trustee meeting as they started discussing moving the Police dispatch to the 911 center in Kingfisher.

Hennessey resident Barb Walter started with, "As you know at the last meeting I was not excited about you all making the change. And since then several people have come forward and said that they weren't. I worry about the safety of our police officers and of our town."

Currently, all 911 calls go to the 911 Kingfisher dispatch, are transferred to Hennessey dispatch, then an officer is dispatched. The new plan will connect the 911 dispatcher with the police, fire, and EMS directly.

Police officer Matt Bruner said, "The problem here is, and I think what the misunderstanding is, it's not the dispatcher at the police department that's the problem. What we need is another officer on duty to make us safe." Bruner explained if he needs help at 2 am all his backups live in Kingfisher or Ames.

Currently, Hennessey Police cannot talk directly to the Kingfisher County Sheriff's Department because their radio systems are not compatible. The contract will reprogram the Hennessey radio system to be compatible with Kingfisher.

At last month's meeting, Ryan Deatherage, the 911 Director told the board about the technology they have available such as tracking, caller location, and language translation.

The new 911 contract will cost \$41,000. Dispatch is currently costing Hennessey \$140,000

All calls to the police phone number 853-4444 will be forwarded to the 911 center. There will be someone in the police department during business hours doing administrative work but will not answer the calls or dispatch.






