EMR TRAINING AT THE HENNESSEY FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Hennessey Board of Trustees recently approved the Hennessey Fire Department to become an Emergency Medical Responding Agency (EMRA). This is under the direction of Heartland Medical Direction and Dr. Bill Worden. The Hennessey Fire Department is now certified in the state of Oklahoma.

This allows Hennessey Firefighters to be covered on medical calls and wrecks to actively participate in patient care. It allows our licensed EMTs to utilize their license for the Hennessey Fire Department. With this certification, the HFD is required to have some members with an Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) license or above on the department.

The EMR license gives a responder more knowledge of patient care before more advanced care arrives, the uses of equipment, and better basic knowledge of how to assist our own EMTs or Life EMS crews that are on the scene. They will be tested in skills such as patient assessments both trauma and medical, use of a bag valve mask(BVM) device, oxygen with a non-rebreather mask, and cardiac arrest with an AED.

Sara Kaiser, paramedic with Life EMS and Perry FD, is an instructor with Heartland Medical Direction that has offered to put on an EMR class at the Hennessey FD to work with schedules and get more licensed.

The Hennessey Round-Up Club is graciously paying for HFD firefighters Logan Macy, Kyle Keeton, and Dustin Grellner to attend. This class is about a month long and includes book material tests online and the skills. The classes are being held on Sunday evenings at the HFD. Hosting this class has also made it more accessible for some of our fellow firefighters. In addition to the Hennessey department, there are 4 from Loyal FD, 1 from Okarche FD, and 1 from Big 4 FD also taking the class.



Drummond sues Biden administration over emergency health powers delegated to WHO

OKLAHOMA CITY (Jan. 30, 2023) -Oklahoma Attorney General Gentner Drummond is suing the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) to remove an illegal regulation from federal law that allows the World Health Organization (WHO) to exert its authority over the United States.

Filed last week in U.S. District Court in the Northern District of Texas, the lawsuit notes that the HHS's definition of public health emergency exceeds the agency's scope by unlawfully giving the WHO the authority to invoke emergency health powers in this nation.

"This regulation is an infringement on U.S. and state sovereignty," Drummond said. "It is particularly egregious that the Biden administration would delegate such sovereignty to the World Health Organization in light of the WHO's many missteps during the pandemic. The WHO's poor management, lack of accountability and alarming ties to the Chinese communist government render it less than credible. The bottom line is, no country or organization other than the United States government should have the authority to declare a health emergency and invoke the corresponding powers."

The unlawful regulation was finalized in the final days of the President Obama administration. Last year, the Biden administration refused a petition filed by Oklahoma and several other states to eliminate a part of the federal code that inappropriately delegates excessive power to the WHO.

OBI SAYS BLOOD SUPPLY DANGEROUSLY LOW CANCELED APPOINTMENTS, BLOOD DRIVES IMPACT SUPPLY

As winter weather began moving in earlier this week, blood donors began canceling appointments and blood drives were delayed, forcing an already struggling blood supply to critically low levels.

Our Blood Institute (OBI) in Oklahoma is asking donors to reschedule appointments as the weather clears.

OBI says a significant number of appointments across its nine donor centers in Oklahoma were canceled. Before yesterday's storm, donations were already down from expected collections. OBI typically has a three- to five-day supply of blood available but is well below that level now. This could impact hospital needs.

Those who donate at a donor center Wednesday, Jan. 25 and Thursday, Jan. 26 will receive their choice of a winter hat, gloves or ice scraper.

On Friday, Jan. 26 and Saturday, Jan. 27, all donors in center will receive a \$10 gift card for a post-winter weather car wash.

All successful donors through February will also receive an alien themed "Save the Humans" T-shirt.

OBI needs 1,200 blood donations each day to maintain an ample supply of blood for state hospitals. OBI provides more than 90 percent of Oklahoma's blood supply to more than 160 hospitals and medical facilities.
