EAGLES AT THE BIG HOUSE!



THE EAGLES FACE OFF AGAINST THE 7TH RANKED POCOLA INDIANS IN THE BIG HOUSE, FOR A SHOT AT THE SEMI-FINALS.

The Eagles started out winning the tip off, and Jael Torres immediately put 2 on the board for Hennessey. James Sims would then put a three on the board for the Eagles. Pocola would respond with a bucket and a three of their own, as well as a few free throws. Shots by Layton, Jael, and James would both fall for the Eagles, but Pocola had a 6'7 Dakota Terrell down low, and had a lot of foul opportunities and put backs. The first quarter closed at a 13-11 lead for Pocola.

The second quarter was unkind to the Eagles, only getting 2 shots to fall down as Pocola's lead grew. Terrell had a lot of free throws, and Pocola was taking their time with each bucket. James Sims had 3 fouls at the half. Terrell was 6 for 8 from the free throw line, and have 12 points and 5 rebounds. The Eagles were led by James Sims's 3-4 from the field and 7 points. The Eagles lost the second quarter 11-4, hoping for a rebound in the 2nd half, something that has been all to familiar this season for the 4th ranked Eagles. The score was 24-15,

GETTING STORM READY

Members of Hennessey police, fire, town employees, and All About Hennessey met Monday morning, March 6th, to develop the severe weather plan for this storm season. Mayor and Fire Chief Bert Gritz laid out the plan as to how the fire department will used as storm spotters. Police Chief Aaron Pitts said that he would be at the station anytime we have the threat of severe weather for storms that happen after business hours or on weekends. Tony Hickey will man the police station and communicate with the police and fire via radio. The police department will be the one to trigger the siren if needed.

Jack Quirk, with All About Hennessey, spoke about the process he followed when he was a network TV news storm chaser. Quirk said, "My role has now changed. When I was chasing, it was my job to get under the storm and tell the meteorologist what I saw, and they broadcast it to the public on TV. I will most likely be stationary, where I can see the radar and gather information. The fire and police will communicate with me about what they see in the field. I will use All About Hennessey to broadcast the information to the public via Facebook and the AllAboutHennessey.com website."

Quirk told the group that when Oklahoma City is in a tornado warning, the television stations tend to focus their attention there and touch on our area as needed. That can be unnerving when our area is experiencing severe storms simultaneously. Our planning will allow us to better care for ourselves in those situations.

The group talked in detail about when to sound the tornado siren. It may be too late if it is sounded when we go under a warning. It

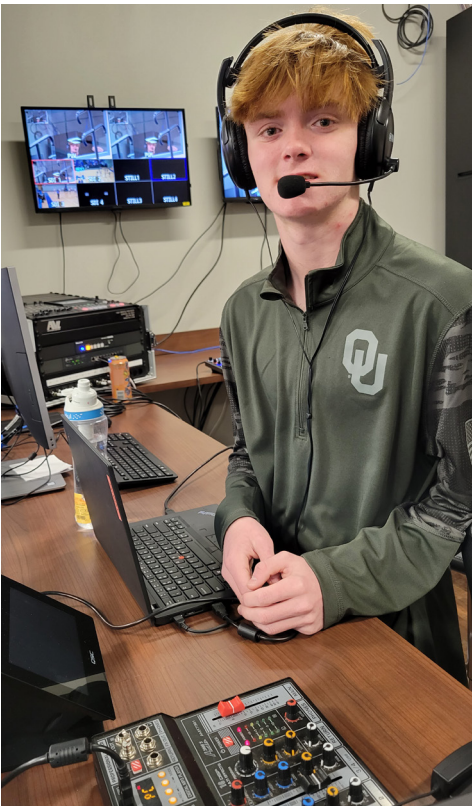

AREA CHAMPS!

Hennessey became the AREA CHAMPIONSHIP at the Stride Event Center last Friday night. It's the #4 Hennessey Eagles vs the #7 Hooker Bulldogs. It's the battle of HHS, it's to decide who goes straight to State.

The Eagles had a highly contested matchup against Fairview in the regional championship last week, they hope not to repeat the anxiety they most likely gave every team person wearing blue in the arena. They started out tonight (March 3rd) losing the tip, and then Hooker would score on back-to-back possessions to jump to a quick lead. Layton would respond, but Hooker would quickly disregard any momentum the Eagles wanted to go their way hitting back, to back, to back buckets for an 11-2 lead.

On the contrary though, following a timeout the Eagles may be turning things around, with a Jael Torres put-back bucket and 2-2 from the line from Layton Choate; the Eagles were back in the game. A few minutes later, Layton would make an alley-oop and 1 layup, unfortunately missing the free throw.

The 2nd quarter started really similar to the first, the common trend being bad shots that don't go in. The first points for the Eagles didn't come until half the time had ticked down in the second off some Jael Torres free throws and then a Layton Choate layup. The score sat 16-12, hooker had the lead.

Another common trend is Layton Choate becoming a beast in the clutch. He hit back-to-back buckets for the Eagles with not much time to play, and the score sat 18-16. As the seconds expired, Hunter Weber hit a clutch 3 to give the Eagles the lead at the half. The score sat 19-18, Eagles lead.

Hooker started the 2nd half with an And-One layup, with a tacked-on a layup to give the bulldogs the early advantage. A transition bucket for the Eagles fell from the hands of James Sims though, and it was back to tied. James may be catching a bit of fire in this second because he then hit a three a few possessions later, but Hooker responded right back to tie it.

The basketball gods then decided to throw it into a back-and-forth slugfest, with both teams trading shot for shot to extend the score to an Eagles 30-28 lead. Hooker followed it up though with a 3 of their own, giving time a one-point lead with 1:40 left in the 3rd. The time

would expire and another back and forth trade of buckets with set the score at 33-32, Bulldog lead.

The first shot of the 4th would fall in Hookers favor, but Layton would follow that up with 2 free throws of his own. Layton would then head to the line once again in which he would go 2-2. Then a Hunter Weber



bucket would lead to a 3-point lead, but Hooker would almost immediately draw some fouls, only getting one to fall through. James would come out of a timeout and get a layup to fall to extend the lead to 4. Then, a deep three would fall for Jael Torres and they had their biggest lead of the game at 7.

When it rains, it pours, and in this case, the Bulldogs didn't bring an umbrella. The lead for the Eagles grew to 11 points with just 2:00 for Hooker to turn it around. An And-One bucket for Jael would fall, and Hooker wasn't going to be able to turn this one around in time. Despite their deep three attempts, they trailed by 11 with a minute to play. As the time ticked down and desperation 3s were chucked up, once again the inevitable became evitable. The Eagles won 54 to 45 over Hooker and advanced to state. the Eagles with a 9 point deficit. Jael Torres started out his second half incredibly hot, with back-to-back-to-back baskets. He would then score AGAIN. On the next possession, I bet you couldn't guess who was headed to the line for 2 free throws. He hit both of them, giving him 10 in the second half. Finally, someone not named Jael would score following a James Sims bucket. Even though Pocola would respond occasionally, the momentum was on the Eagles side of the court, and a Layton Choate 3 pointer cut the Eagles deficit to just 1. Pocola would score the last bucket of the 3rd. The score 33-30 headed to the 4th.

TRAFFIC MESS

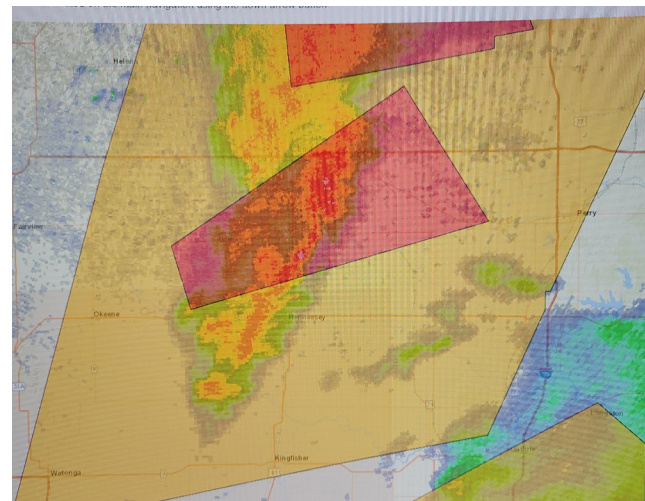
Last week the contractors working on Hwy 51 set up a traffic light at the intersection of 51 and Mitchell Rd in front of 4T's Market. Hwy 51 east is reduced to one lane at a time cycled by a traffic light. This has closed 4T's east driveway while they are paving making it challenging to get to 4Ts' from the east. The Taylors said, "Our west entrance is open, we are sorry for any inconvenience this may cause but we ask you to please continue to shop 4T's."

The traffic light at this intersection is confusing and is causing very long delays for traveling east of town on Hwy 51 while this stretch of road is being paved.

was decided that if there is a warning of a storm heading toward Hennessey, say in Okeene, but Hennessey was not in the warning yet, it would be time to sound the siren. Quirk said, "Every storm is different, but it would be best to get people into the shelters before the worst of the storm was already upon us."



The town has two storm shelters. One is attached to the old gym south of the library on Main St, and the second is the Eagle Event Center (The Dome). The shelter on Main Street will be unlocked and manned by a police officer if we are in the line of a storm. The Eagle Event Center's front doors automatically open when Kingfisher County goes under a tornado warning.

It is important that you are weather aware on potential weather days. Stay near a TV or radio. Make sure you have the weather warnings turned on for your cell phone. And regularly check the All About Hennessey Facebook page and the AllAboutHennessey.com website. AAH will constantly be updating information, and if we get a warning they will go live with updates.
