

# **DEVASTATING HOUSE FIRE HISTORICAL SOCIETY BEGINS**



Thursday morning, (March 9th) around 11 AM, the Hennessey Fire Department responded to a house fire at 6350 S. Mitchell Road, owned by Autumn and Tony Blackburn. Firefighters arrived to find the top story of the residence engulfed in flames.

Hennessey Fire requested help from Dover and they assisted with a water tanker and several firefighters. There is no fire hydrant in that mile section of S. Mitchell Rd so they were shuttling water from about a mile away.

There was no one home at the time of the fire and there were no injuries.

Tony Blackburn said, "I got a notification from my security system that the temperature in one of the bedrooms was 120 degrees." The cause of the fire is still under investigation but is thought to have started with wiring near the furnace near the center of the house.

Hennessey Fire was assisted by Hennessey Police, Dover Fire, Kingfisher County Emergency Management, and Kingfisher County Sheriff Dept. Fire crews left the premises at 4 PM. The Library committee appointed by the Hennessey Board of Trustees last year held its last meeting Wednesday, March 8th, and took the first steps to form a Historical Society. Chairperson Jack Quirk started with, "We are here to talk about the actual building, not the library and museum that is in it. The building shell is sound, but the interworkings are fragile and need a great deal of work. The town does not have the means to make the repairs that are needed to keep it up." Quirk continued, "It is time to bring the committee to an end and pass the baton to the Historical Society to raise funds for the building."

The committee spent almost a year looking into what the old high school building needed to make it functional and safe. The choices ranged from tearing it down to a complete remodel. The architect that was hired to give an opinion on the structure concluded in their report that it has many, very expensive needs. The biggest issue is the roof. It has reached the end of its lifecycle and needs to be replaced. The gutters have broken off the rear of the auditorium and caused water to collect in the basement resulting in mold. The report also stated that the heat and air systems are outdated and inadequate and the entire electrical system is in need of repair.

(Note) at the town board meeting on Thursday night Mayor Bert Gritz asked interim Town Administrator David Treanor to look into replacing the gutters as soon as possible.

The new Historical Society will be chaired by Kevin



Hopkins, and members include Jack Quirk, Barb Walters, Scott Hajek, and Frank Patton. This new group will become a 501-C non-profit and its main mission will be to look after this building and work as a fundraising mechanism to make the necessary repairs. The town will still own and operate the building.

# STORM SIREN FAIL

Last Tuesday Hennessey tested their tornado siren system and it failed. Mayor Bert Gritz reported to the board at the Trustees that none of the 5 town tornado sirens work. Parts of the current system are over 50 years old and operate using copper phone lines. Gritz said, "Most of the sirens work, we just can't communicate with them. The one south of town near Oakwood Dr. looks like an animal chewed through the wiring. The board took action on 2 solutions. The first action was to replace all of the sirens with all new equipment that can be activated via 2-way radio and each one will have battery backup. The problem is they will not be installed in time for this year's spring storm season.

The second action they took was to hire Farmers Electric to install a cellphone activation system on each of the existing sirens bypassing the old phone lines. Gritz told the board that this can be done in a few weeks and will get us covered for this year. This system can be reused for other things around town after the new sirens are installed, such as turning the sewer lagoon pumps on and off remotely.

# NOT YOUR PARENT'S VIDEO GAMES

Electronic sports, or Esports, is a competitive sport involving video games. Hennessey High School Principal & Coach Joshua Faulkner said, "Whenever we were in school, our parents told us not to play video games, or to get outside more. All of that has changed now. We have competitive video games in schools." This is the first year of the Hennessey Esports program. Currently, the Hennessey teams compete only online. There are state tournaments that take place at the end of each season that is in person in a tournament-like setting. They are affiliated with the OSSAA's league.

Teams function much like athletic sports teams. Each player is assessed on their abilities, and how they play with others, and the starting lineup is chosen, and they have second-string players.

Joshua and his brother Drew work together to coach the competitors. They organize the teams and register players as well as advise on how to play.

It gives kids that have never had an extracurricular activity a place to feel accepted and valued and learn to be part of a team. HHS competitor Joseph Davis stated that he likes to be involved because it gives him something different to do at school.

Universities offer Esports scholarships, and there are professional leagues that pay for competing. There are around 30 students involved in the program, and it is expected to continue to grow.




