
QUESTION AND ANSWERS

Blake Callaham, General Manager of Pioneer, spoke to the Hennessey Lions Club last Thursday, April 27th about the transition from Pioneer Cellular. Blake outlined how the cellular side of the company is a partnership with 3 others. Pioneer owns 58%, the other partners include Kanokla Telephone in Oklahoma and Kansas, SCTelcom, Kansas, and Hinton Telephone, in Oklahoma.

Pioneer customers will be able to port (Move) their phone numbers to the cell carrier of their choice starting in July.

The transition period will start in July and continue for 90 days. During the transition period, Pioneer Cellular will waive all early termination fees when customers switch to Verizon or another carrier. Customers choosing to port before the opening of that transition period will be charged applicable early termination fees. If you are a corporate customer with several phones contact Pioneer directly for details on the transition.

Verizon representatives will be at the following 5 Pioneer locations to answer your questions and simplify the transition process. These will be located in Kingfisher, Canton, Enid, Weatherford, and Woodward. There will also be mobile locations that have not been established yet.



HENNESSEY GRAD RUNS BOSTON MARATHON

Gina Driskell Denten attended Hennessey High School and graduated in 1992. During high school, she made the state cross-country team in 1990 and was part of the state track and basketball teams from 1989 to 1992. After graduation, she enrolled at Southwestern Oklahoma State University and continued her athletic career. Gina then moved to Colorado in 2005. She's always been an avid runner and ran her first marathon in 2009. Since then, she has completed eighteen marathons, three of them international, 30 half marathons, and a few trail races.

On April 17th of 2023, Gina had the fantastic opportunity to run in the Boston Marathon for a third time. Before this achievement, she had qualified twice previously, but those races were not traditional - her first chance was in 2020 which got canceled due to COVID-19, but she got to run it virtually. Her qualifying time for 2020 was also accepted or 2021, and that race was rescheduled to October. She ran the 2021 race with Jennifer Hajek Storch, a 1994 Hennessey graduate. This time, she qualified at a marathon in Arizona and now was finally able to take part in person on the usual Patriots' Day that the race is run on.

"This run went better than I thought it would," said Gina. "It was a perfect day weather-wise: rainy and cool." She finished with an impressive 3 hours 49 minutes 18 seconds which enabled her to re-qualify for next year's Boston Marathon.

FIRE STATION EXPANSION

The Hennessey Fire Station is about to change in a big way. They have been saving up County Sales tax funds for about 13 years getting ready for this remodel and addition. 100% of this work is being done with county sales tax money, no town funds will be used.

The plan is to completely demo the south end of the building and expand it in all directions, and add a second floor. Over the past few weeks, the Hennessey town crew has been helping the firefighters move everything out of the offices and meeting room getting ready for the demo. The building will be expanded to the south up to the driveway next to the Library, to the west, and to the east. The long-term plan is to purchase a ladder truck that will fit in the newly expanded building. Construction will start this week and will take about a year to complete.

Verizon will announce exclusive offers for Pioneer Cellular customers as they approach the opening of the transition period. Most phones should be able to transition to Verizon. There is a link on the **GoPioneer.com** website to see if your phone will work. Pioneer customers that have a payment plan on a device can make arrangements with Pioneer to move that payment to

another Pioneer account and continue to make the payments until it is paid off.

It is important to note that if you move from Pioneer before the transition period in July you may be charged cancellation fees. This is because Verizon and Pioneer are working on their contracts that allow Verizon to accept Pioneer phone numbers.
