

### FOR THE LOVE OF FLYING!

Gary Jordan's passion for flying came almost on a whim. He was fascinated with the aspect of flight and simply wanted to learn, so he did. He loved to fly more than anything and wanted to impart his new wisdom to others. In 1969, Gary got a job at Garden City Community College in Garden City, KS as an instructor. He taught many students to fly, including his four sons. He started

teaching his youngest son, Austin, and by the time he was eleven years old, he was flying his dad around.

In May of 1969, Southwest Kansas had an outbreak of green bugs in the wheat, and they were having trouble finding pilots. A cropduster from Hugoton, Kansas came to Gary and asked if he would like a job to which Gary replied, "I don't know how to cropdust." The cropduster told Gary, "Just fly low." That is how it all began.

Jordan Air Inc. was founded by the late Gary Jordan and was initially known as Ag Air Inc. Gary began his crop-dusting journey with a single-engine plane called the Cessna Ag Wagon. Jordan Air Inc. is a family-owned agricultural aerial spraying application business located in Okeene, OK, Hooker, OK, Hugoton, KS, and Elkhart, KS. Jordan Air Inc. has provided aerial application services to farmers and ranchers in a four-state region (Oklahoma, Kansas, Colorado, and Texas) since 1972. 
