
HOLY ART!

Many of you may know Rev. Ish Engle as the local pastor of the First Christian church in Hennessey or by his magic tricks performed at local events, but what you may not know is he's also a very talented artist.

HENNESSEY GRAD WINS INTERNATIONAL AUCTIONEER AWARD

Brandon Mendoza Valles's attraction to auctions started at a very young age when he would attend a cattle auction every Saturday with his dad. Brandon said, "It was the biggest highlight of my week."

At the age of 13, Brandon met his mentor, a local auctioneer from Hennessey, Justin Choate. "He took me to the company he was employed for and I got to sell a couple of items," Brandon said.

Selling in Spanish

One evening while feeding horses, Brandon thought if anyone had ever been able to sell in Spanish. Brandon said, "Just thinking of how unique that was blew my mind and filled me with excitement. It was not easy at all, auctioneering itself is difficult and requires practice, but now attempting to do it in a completely different language was very stressful."

The Competitions

In 2018, Brandon just missed winning the National Auctioneers Association's International Junior Auctioneer Championship by one-half a point in Jacksonville, Florida. After missing opportunities at several other major events in New Orleans and San Diego Brandon said, "I told myself

AUGUST 8TH SPECIAL ELECTION

On August 8, 2023, Kingfisher County will be holding a Special Election for a half-cent sales tax. This is dedicated solely to constructing, improving, maintaining, and repairing of county roads and bridges. The following are reminders from the Kingfisher County Election Board.

EARLY VOTING BEGINS THURSDAY, AUGUST 3, 2023

Early voting begins Thursday, August 3, 2023, for voters in Kingfisher County. Voters who will not be able to make it to the polls on Election Day have the option of voting early at their County Election Board. Kingfisher County Election Board Secretary Shawna Butts said early voting is open to all voters. "You do not need to provide an excuse to vote early. Oklahoma

allows early voting for all elections conducted by the County Election Board or State Election Board-from school board and municipal elections to state and federal elections. This is a great option for those who will be out of town on Election Day or who want to avoid long lines," Shawna Butts said. Early voting is available Thursday, August 3, and Friday, August 4 from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. at Kingfisher County Fairgrounds-MacCenter Building located at 300 S 13 TH St. Kingfisher, OK 73750. Shawna **Butts** reminds voters that early voting is not available at polling locations. Some voters may need assistance to vote because they are blind or visually disabled, physically disabled or infirmed, or illiterate. Such individuals may request to have an assistant or vote privately and independently using the ATI device attached to the voting device. Those require assistance should talk to their precinct official or contact the County Election Board directly for instructions.


