To be eligible, FFA members must have earned at least \$10,000 or earned at least \$2,000 and worked at least 2,250 hrs outside of class time through a supervised agricultural experience (SAE) program in which they own their own business, hold a professional position as an employee, or conduct research. Recipients must also complete 50 hours of community service and demonstrate outstanding leadership abilities and civic involvement through completion of a long list of FFA and community activities. Less than one percent of FFA members achieve the American FFA Degree.

Each recipient of the American FFA Degree receives a gold American FFA Degree key and certificate after being recognized at the national convention.

The National FFA Organization is a school-based national youth leadership development organization of more than 945,000 student members as part of 9,163 local FFA chapters in all 50 states, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands

## LONG AWAITED PAVILION HAS BEGUN

Many years ago the town acquired the old Lee Lumber property on W 1st Street. Shortly after there were ideas of making it a park or building a community building. The years went on and the town purchased several used buildings with intentions to erect them on this property at some future date. In the meantime, Richard Simunek purchased the adjoining land to the south and wanted to donate it to the town. Many years passed and nothing happened, Simunek proposed building a community building and do-



nating the land he owned to the town but it never got off the ground. It was determined that the 2 used buildings the town bought needed a great deal of work and would be best suited for storage buildings, not for public use.

About a year and a half ago the Hennessey Board of Trustees approved a plan from All About Hennessey to create the "Discover Hennessey" program that would oversee improvement projects and promote Hennessey.

This week the long-awaited pavilion is now underway. Jack Quirk, with All About Hennessey, said, "This is becoming possible with a great deal of help and donations from our community. There is no way this project could become a reality with just town funding." Last Thursday, August, 31st F5 Construction owned by David and Katrina Fuksa donated their services to prepare the site for the fill dirt to elevate the site. The 800 cubic yards of fill dirt was donated by Lightle Sand & Construction and was delivered by Dollar Trucking. David Fuksa said, "We need this much fill to make this sight drain property."

The next step will be constructing the concrete piers that will support the building. These will be installed by Daniel Construction.

Quirk said, "To date, over \$90,000 in services have been donated by F5 Construction, Lightle Sand & Construction, Dollar Trucking, Daniel Construction, Hennessey Metal Buildings, and Richard Simunek."

It is important to note that this is a multi-phase project that will continue as more companies and individuals step forward to help with the cost of completing it. So far Phase One is fully funded and includes erecting a 50x100 pavilion with open sides. Phase two will include adding 25-foot additions to each side making the total structure size 100x100. Phase 3 will include a concrete floor. Additional phases would include closing in the building and adding restrooms, kitchen, HVAC, etc. If you have the means and would like to help bring this project to completion please contact Jack Quirk at Jack@KJFilmWorks.com.

Quirk said, "We are very fortunate to have such a high quality of local contractors that are willing to come forward and support our community."

# Fresh Peach Cobbler

The end of the summer always has me thinking about the big of boxes of fresh peaches that are the juiciest and most delicious treat that I can think of! We know that there are so many ways to enjoy those fresh peaches, but a homemade peach cobbler in a cast iron skillet is at the top of that list for me. The skinning and slicing of the peaches is the most time consuming but good things are worth it, right?! I have a yummy cobbler-shortcut recipe that I have shared that uses a cake mix as the shortcut; but this recipe comes from a favorite bed and breakfast cookbook that I purchased years ago and I like to follow it exactly. I have tried using olive oil instead of vegetable oil and cannot recommend that. 0 out of 10 on using the olive oil instead of vegetable oil! I do not like using highly processed oils in my foods as I know they are inflammatory..but I need to keep trying to find a good substitute. Until then, just limit how often you use it.

Peach Cobbler in a skillet

8-10 fresh peaches 2 c sugar

¼ c butter 2 tsp baking powder

1/2 c brown sugar 1 tsp salt

1 tsp cinnamon 2 eggs

2 c flour 1 c oil

Preheat oven to 350\*F. Peel and slice 8-10 fresh peaches and spread in the bottom of a buttered cast iron skillet. (note: the cobbler topping is pretty thick, so I like to make sure my peach layering is substantial!) Slice ¼ c butter and scatter over the peaches. Mix together 1/2 c brown sugar and 1 tsp cinnamon and sprinkle this mixture over the top of the peaches and butter. In a medium bowl combine the flour, sugar, baking powder, and salt. In another bowl beat the 2 eggs with a fork until frothy and add the oil to the eggs, mixing well until combined. Add the wet ingredients to the dry ingredients and mix. Crumble this mixture all over the brown sugar-cinnamon topped peaches in the skillet. Bake at 350\* for 45 minutes or until desired doneness.

You guys, this is it. It is so good! Enjoy it fresh from the oven, piping hot with a scoop of vanilla ice cream..but also enjoy it later cold out of the fridge. It is good!


