

### TRAFFIC JAMS, PEOPLE **EVERYWHERE, IT WAS GREAT!**




Last Saturday, September 16th Hennessey opened its doors and garages to the hordes of people looking for deals during the annual Town-wide Garage sale and Crazy Day event.

### **BUSING REQUEST FOR EAST-SIDE STUDENTS**

Raquel Medrano along with three students and three parents spoke to the Board of Education at last week's meeting requesting school bus service from East 7th St at S. Cimarron St. Hennessey Middle School Principal Ricardo Tarango translated from Spanish to English for the board.

She was requesting the school board to provide school bus service for students who live on East 7th Street.

Medrano said, "We had it several years ago then it stopped." This bus route would allow 15 students to ride. "All the parents work," she said asking the board to consider adding transportation this year.

Medrano was listed on the agenda to speak to the board about the transportation but the board couldn't take action that night because it wasn't on the agenda for action.

State law says Schools are only required to provide transportation for students who live 1.5 miles, or more, from school. The school does offer bus transportation for some students that live on the west side of town because of the busy Hwy 81, Main St.

### 1) Cinnamon Chip Pumpkin Muffins:

- half to full bag of cinnamon chips Preheat oven to 350°F. Combine all ingredients. Spoon into a mini muffin pan. Bake for 15-20 minutes..

#### 2) Spiced Banana Bread

- 4 overripe bananas
- quarter to half cup of water (just enough to smooth out consistency)
- half a bag of white chocolate chips

Preheat oven to 350°F. Mash bananas then combine all ingredients. Pour into a loaf pan. Bake for 45-60 minutes or until done.

#### FIREFIGHTERS MEET AT GATHERING PLACE




