EVACUATION DUE TO GAS LEAK

Police and Fire departments took immediate action on Monday morning (December 18th) to evacuate buildings on the 100 block of S. Main St. The evacuation was necessary due to a gas leak caused by a construction crew working on the roof of the Hennessey First Baptist Church. The crew accidentally struck a large gas meter in the alley on the north side of the church. To ensure safety, the authorities blocked off roads in the surrounding area, preventing any traffic from entering. Oklahoma Natural Gas promptly accessed the situation and successfully contained the gas leak by 11:40 am. As a result, businesses were able to resume operations shortly after the leak was contained. The roads remained closed for a brief period of time until Oklahoma Natural Gas finished their work. Kingfisher County Emergency Management also responded to the scene to provide assistance.



TRUSTEES SAVE THE SENIOR CITIZEN CENTER

The Hennessey Senior Citizen Center located on E. 2nd St has been a lifeline for residents for many years. This beloved center provides a place for seniors to socialize, play cards, enjoy a meal, and even receive meal deliveries if needed.

STUDENTS MAKE TRUSTEES AWARE OF TOBACCO ISSUES

The CounterAct Tobacco Hennessey team recently addressed the town trustees regarding the issue of tobacco regulation in Oklahoma. Currently, our state is one of just five that still maintain preemption, which limits local authority in areas such as licensure, smoke-free indoor air, and youth access to tobacco products.

During a recent town board meeting on December 14th, two Hennessey students, Abigail Holsten and Addison Null-Kelly, along with campaign manager Aisha Ensley, highlighted the absence of an ordinance against e-cigarettes in the town. The board, previously unaware of this fact, attentively listened to their presentation. CounterAct Tobacco, a youth-driven program advocating for a tobacco-free future, is extending its efforts throughout Oklahoma.

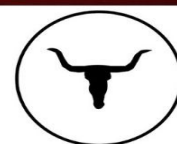
Presently, Oklahoma lacks retail licensure for e-cigarettes, vapes, and nicotine-only products. With only a sales tax permit required, the whereabouts of these products and their sale locations remain unknown. The absence of regulation for retailers may result in increased accessibility of tobacco products among youth.

The board of trustees expressed their gratitude to the team for their presentation and for bringing the issue to their attention. However, as it was not on the agenda, no immediate action could be taken.

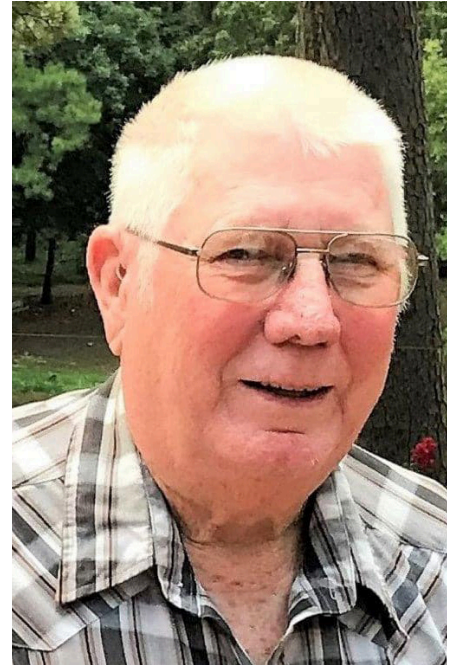
Kathy was preceded in death by her parents, husband Mannie; two sisters, Lisa and Deborah, and one brother David, and one niece Khillian.

ACCIDENT WITH INJURIES

Hennessey Police and Fire responded to a collision with injuries at the intersection of Hwy 51 and N. Mitchell Road on Monday, November 6th at approximately 7:30 am. According to the police report, the 2004 Chevy pickup driven by Alfred Davis of Hennessey was traveling north on Mitchell Rd, when it was struck broadside in the intersection by Andres Benavides of Port Arthur, Texas who was traveling East on Hwy 51.

Davis was pinned in the vehicle and had to be extracted by Hennessey Firefighters. 2 minor passengers (names withheld) were also in the pickup with Davis and were transported to OU Medical Center in Oklahoma City by Kingfisher EMS with unknown injuries. Davis was transported via LifeEMS to Howdy's Travel Plaza and then flown by AirEvac Helicopter to OU Medical Center in Oklahoma City with unknown injuries.

Andres Benavides was not injured and was arrested and transported by Hennessey Police to the Kingfisher County Jail for no driver's license, no insurance, an expired tag, and speeding. Agency's Hennessey with the scene included Kingfisher County Deputies and Oklahoma Highway Patrol.



ELECTRIC UTILITY TRUCK BURNS

Monday morning NS2890 near EW710 Rd. Northeast of Dover was closed while Dover Firefighters worked to extinguish a bucket truck closed while Dover Firefighters worked to extinguish a bucket truck that was on fire. 4T'S GOES SOLAR

It's no secret that the cost of groceries has gone through the roof and Tim Taylor is going to the roof for savings! Tim said, "We did a major remodel in 2015 that reduced our energy load by 40% but over the years with inflation all that savings has gone away."

The Taylors are constantly looking for ways to save on operating cost designed to assist smaller communities that lack sufficient fiscal capacity. This essentially allows the Taylors to get a rebate on the taxes they paid over the past 3 years to pay for the system.

This grant allows them to install the 320 solar panels on the roof of the store all pitched at a 10% angle to the south to collect the maximum amount of sun. When done the roof will be covered with panels that are held on with 750 cement blocks that are evenly distributed across the roof. Before the work began everything had to be engineered to be sure the weight load on the roof was sufficient.

Tim said they started the application process in February 2022 and after filling out many forms got word they were approved for the grant in June 2023. After many delays and working through the government paperwork, the work was finally scheduled to start in July. But the work didn't actually get started until last week when the contractor arrived and started the installation.

When complete the system should offer the Taylors a 30% savings on their electric bill. This is a direct-use solar system meaning there are no batteries for storage and the energy produced is used right away. The system is designed to sell any excess energy produced back to OG&E but Tim said they expect to use everything produced.

HENNESSEY TEEN DIES IN ACCIDENT

15-year-old Hennessey boy died Monday afternoon in a single-vehicle rollover accident southeast of Hennessey.

According to the report issued by the Oklahoma Highway Patrol, the 15-year-old boy was taken to Integris Bass Baptist Health Center in Enid by LifeEMS, where he was pronounced dead. Oklahoma Highway Patrol does not release names of juveniles in its accident reports.

The accident happened at 2:45 p.m. Monday, November 20th on County Road E0640 (Conoco Rd) about three-quarters of a mile east of Mitchell Rd.

According to the report, a 17-year-old boy was driving a 1986 Chevrolet S-10 Blazer east on the gravel County Road E0640 when he lost control due to speed went off the road to the left, and rolled one and a half times, with the vehicle coming to rest on its top.

The driver, also a minor from Hennessey was transported by personal vehicle to St. Mary's Regional Medical Center in Enid. According to the report he was treated and released later that day.

Oklahoma Highway Patrol, Hennessey Police & Fire, Kingfisher County Sheriff, and LifeEMS worked on the incident. No other official information was available at the time of this paper's deadline.

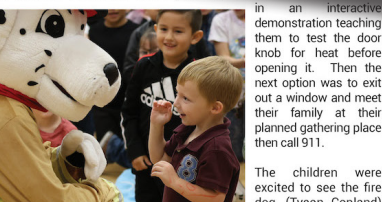




