SEMRAD FILLS SCHOOL BOARD POSITION



At Monday night's Hennessey Board of Education meeting, Dakota Semrad was chosen to fill the board seat vacated by David Tillman last month. Dakota is a 2011 graduate of Hennessey High School and owns a law practice in Enid. Dakota is married to Terrah Semrad. The couple has two children, and they live in Hennessey.

David Tillman resigned from his position on the HPS Board of Education in a letter sent to Superintendent Jason Sternberger on Saturday, January 6; Tillman explained that he feels unable to give the necessary attention to the students and faculty at this time in his life. After discussing with his family, Tillman believes that resigning is the best decision for himself and his family.

Dakota will fulfill the remaining duration of Tillman's term. The process to elect a successor will commence in 2025, and the actual election will be held in 2026.

TOWN TRUSTEES GO DIGITAL

The Hennessey Board of Trustees listened to an online video presentation during their regular meeting last Thursday night February 8th about automating the meeting agendas. After the presentation, the board approved purchasing the automated meeting software. Trustee David Jones has been pushing the town to modernize the way it does business and this is the first step to streamline the way things are done. This is the same system that The City of Kingfisher and Enid use for their meetings.

During the meeting, the board was questioned by an individual in the audience about the ongoing audit. Town Administration Tiffany Tillman stated that they have asked for several items and have questioned all of the board members. There were no updates to be reported and there is no completion date as of yet.

There was a discussion about moving the ATV races that are held during the annual car show from north of town to next to the soccer fields at the corner of Oklahoma St and Cemetery Rd. Jack Quirk told the board the goal was to move all of the events this year south of Hwy 51 and keep everything inside town limits. Tillman told the board that they got permission from ODOT to close Hwy 81, Main Street between 9 am and 6 pm the day of the car show. The board took no action because they wanted more information on insurance for the event.

Kingfisher County Emergency prepared a proposal to manage Hennessey's emergency management needs but the board decided to appoint Police Chief Aaron Pitts and Tiffany Tillman as the co-emergency managers for the town.

The town revived 2 bids to drill a water well at the Hennessey cemetery that will serve the new restroom nearing completion. The board approved the bid from Lang Well Drilling Co.

Derek passed away on January 31st and was laid to rest on February 8th.

The Hennessey Lion's Club displays American flags throughout town on national holidays. Last week was the first time the flags were presented for an individual from our town.



POT FARM KILLER, LIFE WITHOUT PAROLE

Wu Chen a Chinese national accused of killing four and wounding another pleaded guilty in the Kingfisher County Court Room last Friday morning (February 9th). The plea agreement lasted only 24 minutes and was accepted by Kingfisher County Judge Lance Schneider. Chen will serve life without parole for each of the four first-degree murder counts and 20 years for the assault and battery with a deadly weapon. These charges are from the 2022 quadruple homicide at the Lacey marijuana grow facility west of Hennessey.



Derek Ivan Grimes - Obituary

Derek Ivan Grimes, 57, of Enid, OK, went to be with the Lord on January 31, 2024. He was born May 20, 1966, in Waurika, OK, to Charles Ivan Grimes and the late Betty Lou Miller.

The family lived in Hammond, OK, and Carleton, IN, before settling in Hennessey, OK, in 1971. Derek grew up working on his father's farm and was involved in band, choir, and basketball during high school. He graduated Valedictorian from Hennessey High School in 1984—the first of many academic achievements. Derek earned a Bachelor of Arts in Speech Communication and an Asian Area Study Certificate from Oklahoma State University in December 1988. Derek married his college sweetheart, Kathleen "Kathy" Deloryse Blythe, in July 1989 and started law school in August. He earned his Juris Doctorate from the University of Kansas School of Law in May 1992.

Derek was appointed to the United States Air Force as a Judge Advocate General (JAG) in October 1992. Commissioned as a 1st Lieutenant, he rose to the rank of Colonel and spent nearly three decades proudly serving his country. During his 28-year distinguished military career, Derek received the Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit Medal, Iraq Campaign Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, and Meritorious Service Medal. Derek was first stationed in Mountain Home, Idaho, where his eldest son, Bailey Ivan, was born. He then transferred to Panama, where he ran the defense counsel office, and his second son, Cole Ivan, was born. In May 2000, Derek earned a Master of Arts in Organizational Management from The George Washington University while attending the prestigious—and highly competitive—Air Force Intern Program associated with the Pentagon in Washington, D.C.

Derek's next assignment was at Randolph AFB in San Antonio, Texas, where his third and fourth sons, Dylan Ivan and Austin Ivan, were born. Derek then got the opportunity to attend The Judge Advocate General's Legal Center and School at the University of Virginia in Charlottesville. After earning a Master of Laws in Military and International Operational Law in May 2003, Derek was asked to stay on as a law professor. After a two-year teaching assignment, Derek was sent to the Azores off the coast of Portugal. In 2007, Derek fulfilled his dream of being stationed in Japan. He and his family departed for the first of two tours at Yokota AFB, outside Tokyo. During this time, Derek was deployed to Iraq for six months while his family remained on base. A one-year move to Hawaii followed, which was Derek's first opportunity to run his own legal office. While in Hawaii, he was promoted to his final rank of Colonel. Derek had several more assignments, including moves to Sheppard AFB in Wichita Falls, Texas, and Barksdale AFB near Bossier City, Louisiana. He was then awarded a second assignment in Japan, where he led his own office and was the senior legal counsel in all of Japan.

Derek's final station was in Ramstein, Germany, where he spent three years serving as a deputy to the Four-Star General. Following Austin's high school graduation in 2020, Derek retired from military duty, and the family moved back home to Oklahoma. Retirement didn't last long. Derek was appointed Chief Operations Officer at Davis Business Law in Enid, OK, in December 2020. He spent just over three years helping CEO Matthew Davis grow his practice. Under Derek's leadership, the firm expanded its reach to include nine law offices in three states. Derek loved people and loved sharing his extensive knowledge and worldly adventures with others. Most of all, he loved his family and beamed with pride whenever he spoke about his children. Derek loved being a father and was overjoyed about becoming a grandfather. Derek was a man of Christ and loved sharing his faith with anyone he could. He was a gifted storyteller and an enthusiastic Cowboys fan (Go Pokes!). Derek and Kathy shared a wonderful life together raising their four boys, traveling the world, and proudly serving their country. Derek could not have asked for anything better in this life and is now rejoicing in Heaven.

Derek is survived by his wife, Kathy; sons, Bailey (Carlee), Cole (Hannah), Dylan (Julianne), and Austin (Kenadie); his father, Charles (Beverly); his sisters, Stacy (Perry) Cline, and Jenny (Ryan) White; his granddaughters, Za'Vaylah, Martin Grace (due March 2024), and Baby Girl (due May 2024); and many loving uncles, aunts, cousins, sisters-in-law, brothers-in-law, nieces, nephews, and friends. He was preceded in death by his mother, his unborn sister, and his grandparents.

A Celebration of Life will be held at First Christian Church of Hennessey, 500 E. 3rd St., on Thursday, February 8, 2024, at 1 p.m. Cremation arrangements are by Cordry-Gritz Funeral Home.

In lieu of flowers, memorial donations may be made to the Lacey Community Center, where Derek played pitch with locals who knew his grandparents, or to A2Z Therapeutic Petting Zoo in Enid, where Derek enjoyed feeding the animals and loving on them whenever he had a chance. Cordry-Gritz Funeral Home in Hennessey, OK (405-853-2364) will serve as custodian for the two memorials.





A DIFFERENT TAKE ON SOURDOUGH STARTER AMISH FRIENDSHIP BREAD

Don't be afraid! If you like the idea of sourdough but are intimidated by the process... let this be a way for you to get more comfortable with starters! Consider this your sourdough initiation, lol. If you have heard of Friendship bread, then you are probably remembering your childhood with the baggies of friendship bread starter every 10 days that you had to find a home for or throw away... well we found a way to prevent that. While we encourage you to share the love by sharing starters with your loved ones, this recipe allows you the flexibility to add enough ingredients to give starters away, or add less so that you are only keeping enough reserve for your own starter.

Amish Friendship bread is a sweet, dense bread. Perfect for Valentine's Day and your sweet, dense significant other. It is great for breakfast or after school snacks. It is a hearty bread, but with a sweetness that is just right.

We have a video up on TikTok showing exactly how to make this bread. @okseasonedsisters. We are going to share this video to Facebook when this post goes to print, so be looking for that!

Please refer to our website www.okseasonedsisters.com for the entire recipe of the starter, how to make the starter, how to keep it alive, how to make enough to give starters away, or how to just make enough for yourself, and the recipe for the actual bread. Our very first post back in 2020 on our website was this very bread! Go check it out and let us know what you think.

Here is the Starter Recipe to get YOU *started*, lol

- ½ tsp active dry yeast
- 1 oz warm water
- 1 Tbsp sugar
- 1 Tbsp vinegar
- ½ tsp salt
- 1 cup flour
- 1 cup milk

Dissolve yeast in the warm water. Add all ingredients into a large bowl and stir until creamy. This can be put into a covered bowl or a gallon ziploc baggie. Cover the bowl with a clean tea towel. If using a ziploc baggie just mush the ingredients around instead of stirring. Also, if the bag gets air in it, let the air out so it won't burst. Let the mixture stand in a warm place for 2 days to ferment. It will bubble and have a pleasant sour aroma. After the 2nd day, you will start the friendship bread starter countdown, just like the old days. (refer to our post on www.okseasonedsisters.com for complete instructions). Only refrigerate if you are needing a break from baking. When ready to begin again, allow the starter to come to room temperature and *feed the starter to begin the process again.

Friendship is one of the types of love (philia, in Greek) and February is the month of love; so we are encouraging you to make and share your very own friendship bread starters. The Bible says that "There is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friend" -John 15:13 NLT

We feel like the second greatest act of love is to share one's food with one's friends. :) This recipe gives you the perfect opportunity to share food/love at the perfect time (Valentine's Day). You are welcome!
