EMBEZZLEMENT AT THE SLEEP INN HOTEL AND SUITES

According to reports from Hennessey Detective Brad Logan, Larry Lovely, the Regional General Manager of Hennessey Sleep Inn Hotel and Suites, contacted him regarding allegations of embezzlement by an employee named Christina Chon. Christina allegedly embezzled approximately \$12,948.51 in cash through fraudulent activities in 2023. The embezzlement involved funds from the hotel's Event Center deposits and the hotel side of the business. Larry had noticed discrepancies in the deposit books, along with complaints about Event Center deposits not being returned, and confronted Christina, who admitted to taking the money to pay for medical expenses and her daughter's care.

Lovely had an audit conducted, which revealed the extent of the embezzlement. Christina admitted to the theft during an interview with Detective Logan, confessing to taking money for bills, rent, and other expenses. Christina explained her process of embezzlement, stating she only took cash payments and not credit card transactions. The investigation included interviews, review of documentation, and video recordings, leading to a detailed case file for further action by law enforcement and the District Attorney's Office.

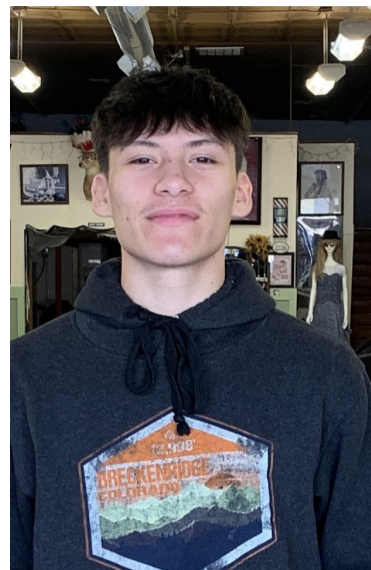
The All About Hennessey POST Features students from the Hennessey High School intern program each week. This week's students are Angel Escamilla and Victor Sigala

Angel Escamilla is a senior at HHS and is looking forward to a career as a barber. He is currently interning at Bluejays Barber Shop under mentor, barber, and owner of the business, Josh Ward.

Angel was born in Enid, Oklahoma. Sometime later, the family returned to Mexico for several years and returned to the Hennessey area where Angel became a student at HMS as a seventh grader. He participated in wrestling at HHS this year and has been very involved in the Shah Mat BJJ Academy in Enid. It is the first and only Brazilian Jiu Jitsu Academy in Enid.

Becoming a barber first came to Angel during the Covid shutdown. At some point, he needed to get a haircut. Since he couldn't go to a barbershop during the shutdown, he cut his hair and went online to watch some instructional YouTube videos. He asked his dad for some clippers and did his best, based on the videos he watched. After the shutdown, he continued watching videos and learning about cutting hair. It was through this experience that he decided on a career as a barber.

The Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security will host the Oklahoma Youth Preparedness Camp (OKYPC), July 28-August 2nd on the Oklahoma Panhandle State University Campus in Goodwell, OK.

Midway Mark in Legislative Session

We've reached the midway mark in our legislative session. All House bills that passed have moved to the Senate. We'll begin hearing bills from that chamber in House committees soon. We've even had a few bills signed into law by the governor already.

One bill that deserves some discussion is House Bill 2950, which would cut personal income taxes by .25% during any year in which the total state tax collections exceed \$400 million or more. The goal is eventually to reduce the individual income tax rate to zero. This bill initially contained a \$1 per megawatt hour charge on renewable energy, but a recent floor amendment removed that.

According to the U.S. Dept. of Energy, Oklahoma is the fourth-largest generator of renewable energy, with enough wind, solar and energy storage capacity to power all of the state's households two times over. In 2021, the department reported that wind supplied more of Oklahoma's electricity generation than natural gas for the first time.



The Oklahoma economy has been reliant on oil and natural gas since statehood and still is. That fact is especially true when the wind doesn't blow, the sun doesn't shine and most importantly during severe weather events when we have come to rely on it the most. Despite many obstacles created by the Biden Administration, our petroleum industry is still a major job creator and economic driver for Oklahoma. But today in our state, so is wind and other emerging renewables. It is incumbent upon us to make sure we're not

penalizing one industry above another when it comes to our tax structure. Acknowledging that, any discussion on taxation of wind must include the protection of ad valorem dollars for counties and school districts where those facilities have been located. It is my job to ensure that happens here in the House.

HB2950 is authored by Speaker Charles McCall so it should pass the House with ease. Senate leadership, however, has made it clear they are through considering tax cuts for the year after the recent passage of a bill that removed the state portion of the grocery tax.

There's still plenty of political capital to spend at the Legislature as we have a half a session remaining before us. We'll see what happens with this and other pieces of legislation as the session progresses toward its finale.

FIREFIGHTER TRAINING

Hennessey Firefighters spent Sunday afternoon, March 17th about a mile north of the Cemetery on N2860 burning a house for the LaPorte Family. The house needed to be taken down and the easiest way was to burn it. This created a wonderful training opportunity for the Hennessey and Marshall firefighters along with Kingfisher County Emergency Management to put classroom training into practice.
