Snickerdoodles

Funny name; serious deliciousness.

We've tried some Snickerdoodle recipes out looking for the *perfect* one. You know what we mean..crunchy outside, chewy inside. Yum. We finally came to the conclusion that the most important thing you can do is take those bad boys out of the oven at 8 minutes. Even if they don't look done. Just take them out. Set the cookie sheets on top of your oven and set a timer for two minutes. They will finish cooking right there on top of your stove and they won't get too crunchy!

Now of course, if you prefer your cookie to be a crunchy mess, then by all means leave them in for a minute or two longer. Or, leave them on the stovetop longer than two minutes, too. That'll do it for ya also!

Important tip: Don't forget to set your timer for two minutes and then take the cookies off the cookie sheets onto a cooling rack immediately after the two minute timer is up or they will just keep on cooking (= crunchy cookies). So, even though we feel like timing is the most important aspect of snickerdoodle baking; this recipe is still Summer's all-time favorite that she has tried out. It is originally from one of her favorite cookbooks, Buns in the Oven - a collection of recipes that Summer and her friends at work collected and sold for a fundraiser benefiting The March of Dimes. A big thank you to Rhonda Macy & Tami Frakes for this delicious Snickerdoodle recipe! This recipe has both butter and shortening. We make a lot of all-butter recipes, so here's one for all of you shortening-cookie enthusiasts.

I use the butter-flavored crisco sticks and it is so easy, so perfect.

Snickerdoodles

- 1/2 c (1 stick) butter, softened
- 1/2 c shortening (butter flavored crisco stick for ease!)
- 1 1/2 c sugar
- 2 eggs
- 2 3/4 c flour (I prefer unbleached all-purpose)
- 2 tsp cream of tartar
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 3 Tbsp sugar
- 3 tsp cinnamon



Preheat the oven to 400 degrees. Mix butter, shortening, and sugar well. Add eggs and mix very well. The mixture will be nice and fluffy when ready. While your mixer is mixing, combine flour, cream of tartar, baking soda, and salt in another bowl. Slowly add the flour mix to the sugar/butter mix, being careful not to over-mix now. Combine the 3 Tbsp sugar and the 3 tsp cinnamon in a small bowl. Shape your dough into balls (just try to make them uniform in size so they all bake evenly). Roll the balls in the cinnamon/sugar mixture and place them on your cookie sheets approximately 2 inches apart. Bake for 8-10 minutes (remember what we discussed earlier!) Remove to the cooling rack. Enjoy! Oh and by the way...Cream of tartar- what a misnomer! It isn't creamy at all.

Did you know that cream of tartar is the acidic byproduct of fermenting grapes into wine?! The acid in cream of tartar gives snickerdoodles that distinctive tangy flavor and chewiness because the cream of tartar prevents the sugar in the dough from crystallizing. (Info source AllRecipes.com).

FIRE AT D-K RECYCLING BLANKETS THE TOWN IN SMOKE

On Tuesday afternoon, at about 3:30 p.m., black smoke filled the air, driven by 20 mph southerly winds, darkening the sky over Hennessey. According to the Hennessey Fire Department report, the fire was located at D-K Recycling, located southwest of Hennessey at 17130 E 640 Rd (Conoco Rd).

The report stated that employees made some cuts with a torch, against D-K policy on excessive wind days, which caught some dead grass on fire and then ignited about 30-40 10' joints of poly pipe and, in turn, also caught a couple of box semi-trailers and various tires on fire.

The report said after a conversation with the business owner, Tiger Calvert, about anything of value, the fire department decided to take a defensive approach and monitor. Hennessey Fire Chief Brandon Scott stated, "I also didn't want to chance ruining tires or depleting resources. Once the threat of spread wasn't a concern, it was decided to return to service." *photo by Tony Blackburn*

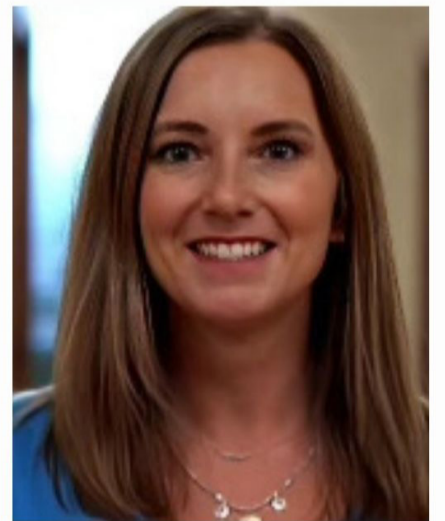

ELECTION BOARD POLL WORKERS NEEDED

The Kingfisher County Election Board announced today that it will be accepting poll worker applications from April 19 through December 2024. Applications are being accepted for the following positions: Inspector \$110.00, Judge \$100, Clerk \$100. This is currently what the pay is, but in August the amount of pay will double.

Kingfisher County Election Board Secretary Shawna Butts said that all applicants must be willing to work long hours on election days and that training will be provided. "This is a great opportunity for anyone interested in the election system. While the hours can be long, poll workers are only needed a few days each year." Poll workers are compensated for their time and, in some cases, mileage for travel if you are more than 10 miles from the polling place, Shawna Butts said. The compensation schedule is outlined in state statutes.

To qualify, an applicant must be a registered voter in the county where he or she would like to work. If hired, a poll worker cannot hold any other offices under the laws of the state (such as school board member or city councilman) and may not be related to or employed by a candidate for office.

Those interested in becoming a poll worker should contact the Kingfisher County Election Board at 405-375-3895 or Kingfishercounty@elections.ok.gov. The County Election Board is located at 101 S Main St, Room#8. Office hours are 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

In terms of duties, Inspectors are responsible for verifying voter IDs against the registration book, while Clerks handle the distribution of ballots. Inspectors also oversee the ballot machine and address any issues that may arise during the voting process. Shawna Butts reiterated that the county election secretary is available to offer guidance, address concerns, and handle any other issues that may come up while poll workers are on duty.
