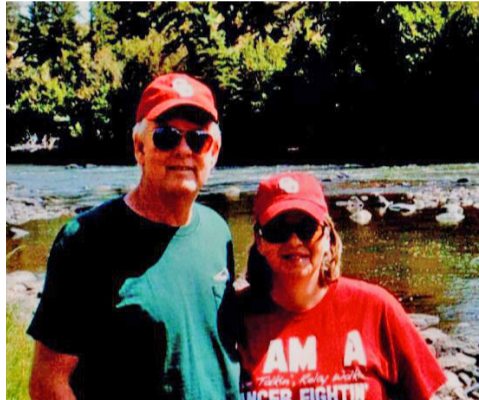

GAIL'S GRILL CELEBRATES 50 YEARS

As you walk down the main street of Hennessey, the delicious smell of sizzling fried onion burgers fills the air, teasing your senses and making your mouth water as you look forward to lunchtime. This tempting aroma is courtesy of Gail's Grill, which has been serving up these delectable burgers for 50 years! Gail Hardin opened Gail's Grill on January 7th, 1974, and her very first customers were Cecil and Kathryn Enix, keeping the \$2 payment as a memento of the occasion. Back then, Gail had a simple menu, offering fried onion burgers, french fries, and a bowl of homemade chili, along with her two signature items: The Gail's Special, an open-faced cheeseburger topped with chili, and the Toastato, a pile of chips, American cheese, a big scoop of chili topped with lettuce and tomato. Gail's motto was "We didn't invent the burger. We just perfected it," and it became popular, often

leading to a line out the door and down the sidewalk. Gail's Grill hasn't changed much over the 50 years, still seating only 14 customers at a bar with a view of the cook flipping burgers as you wait for yours to be prepared. Gail sold Gail's Grill to Randy and Sandra Hardin in 1983. Sandra owned and operated it for a combined 30 years with several leasing operators, including Nadine Hardin, Trish Streck, and the current operator, Tammy Dobbs. Tammy has worked at Gail's Grill for 17 years and mentions that the menu has expanded to include several unique items. She is willing to make anything as long as she has the ingredients to do so. Tammy has made it easy for hungry

Hennessey's Coach HUNT is Successful

Dallas Hunt is a 2015 graduate of Garber High School. After graduating, Hunt continued his education at Northwestern Oklahoma State University in Alva. While attending NWOSU, he began coaching at Garber Public Schools. He was the boy's assistant basketball coach, the football assistant coach from 2017-2022, and the assistant baseball coach from 2016-2022. During his five years as an assistant basketball coach, the Garber Wolverines made four state appearances, won the 2020 Class A state championship, and were the 2021 and 2022 state runner-up. Hunt obtained his bachelor's degree in 2019 and spent his first two years in education as a teacher's aide before teaching history at Garber. It wasn't until his move to Burlington, Oklahoma, in 2022 that he solely focused on boys basketball as he took his first head coach position. After coaching at Burlington for a year, Hunt made the move to Ringwood, where he led them to the regional consolation championship, giving them a 20-8 season. During his first two seasons as a head coach, he reached out to Jones and Reed, whom he previously coached under. Both played a vital role in his coaching style. Hunt came highly recommended, and the Hennessey School Board believed him a good fit to take over after Coach Brady Page's resignation as head basketball coach. He makes the move with his wife, Melissa, and his two stepsons, Tallas Sullivan and Taye Sullivan. Tallas, an upcoming fourth grader, and Taye, a UCO college student. Hunt will start his coaching effective immediately and will begin teaching history at the high school in the fall.

NEW HENNESSEY HIGH BIOLOGY TEACHER

Doug Boyd is a former teacher and coach from the Texas Panhandle area. Boyd is a 1984 Turnip High School graduate and a Northwestern Oklahoma State University alum. While attending the college in Alva, Boyd obtained his Bachelor of Science in Education. He served the communities of Canadian and Farwell, Texas, for 31 years before deciding to retire in 2023. After a year away and a move back to his family's home state of Oklahoma, he is eager and ready to return to the classroom and coaching in whatever capacity that might be. During his 31 years, Boyd has coached an array of sports, including girls' basketball, boys' golf, football, track, and strength and conditioning. His teaching, however, has always been that of sciences, more specifically that of health, physical education, and Biology I and II. The Hennessey board has approved Boyd's hiring as the new High School biology teacher and has been given coaching opportunities undisclosed at this time.

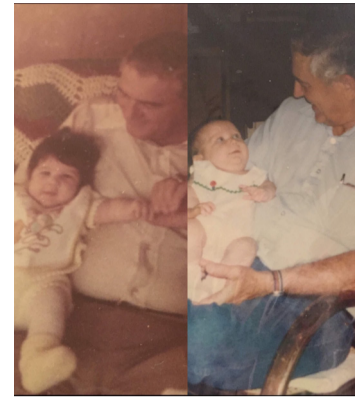

UPCOMING VOTING INFORMATION

SAMPLE BALLOTS AVAILABLE FOR June 18 PRIMARY ELECTION

Sample ballots are now available for the June 18 Election. Voters can download a sample ballot using the State Election Board's OK Voter Portal at oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp or pick up a copy at the Shawna Butts County Election Board during normal business hours. Sample ballots are specific to each person. "If the OK Voter Portal indicates that you have no sample ballots available, you are not eligible to vote in an upcoming election. We recommend checking the OK Voter Portal to make sure you have an election before heading to the polls." Sample ballots will also be posted outside every precinct polling place on Election Day, so voters can review them before casting their votes. The Kingfisher County Election Board is located at 101 S Main St., Room#8 and is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. EARLY VOTING BEGINS THURSDAY, JUNE 13, 2024 Early voting begins Thursday, June 13, for voters in Kingfisher County. Voters who will not be able to make it to the polls on Election Day have the option of voting early at their County Election Board.

Kingfisher County Election Board

Secretary Shawna Butts said early voting is open to all voters. "You do not need to provide an excuse to vote early. Oklahoma allows early voting for all elections conducted by the County Election Board or State Election Board—from school board and municipal elections to state and federal elections. This is a great option for those who will be out of town on Election Day or who want to avoid long lines," Shawna Butts said.

Early voting is available Thursday, June 13, and Friday, June 14, from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and Saturday, June 15, from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at Kingfisher County Fairgrounds-MacCenter Building located at 300 S 13TH St. Kingfisher, OK 73750. Shawna Butts reminds voters that early voting is not available at polling locations. Some voters may need assistance to vote because they are blind or visually disabled, physically disabled or infirmed, or illiterate. Such individuals may request to have an assistant or vote privately and independently using the ATI device attached to the voting device. Those who require assistance should talk to their precinct official or contact the County Election Board directly for instructions. For questions, please contact the Election Board at 405-375.3895 or Kingfishercounty@elections.ok.gov.

PRIMARY ELECTION REMINDER

Primary elections for federal, state, and county candidates are scheduled for June 18. On Election Day, the polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Early voting will be held Thursday, June 13, and Friday, June 14, from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and Saturday, June 15, from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. A list of early voting locations and the election list are available on the State Election Board website. You can find your polling place using the OK Voter Portal. Voters are reminded that Oklahoma has modified, closed primaries.

CLOSED PRIMARIES In order to participate in a party's primary election, you must be a registered voter of that party – unless the party opens its primaries to Independent (unaffiliated or "no party") voters. Oklahoma has three recognized political parties: Republican, Democratic, and Libertarian. For the 2024 to 2025 election years, the Democratic Party has chosen to open its primaries to Independents, while the Republican and Libertarian parties have chosen to keep their primaries closed.

Independent voters who wish to vote a Democratic Primary ballot must request one, whether voting in person or by absentee ballot. Independent voters may not vote a Republican Primary ballot or a Libertarian Primary ballot.

HOW PRIMARIES WORK

A primary election is held if more than one candidate from the same recognized political party files for a single office. Candidates who receive the majority of the votes cast for their office in their respective party's primary election will advance to the general election. If more than two candidates file and no candidate receives a majority of the votes, the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes will advance to the runoff primary election. If candidates from only one recognized political party file for office, the elected official will be chosen during the primary election or runoff primary election. (Primary election laws apply.) A general election will not be held. More information about primary elections can be found on the State Election Board website at <https://oklahoma.gov/elections.html>. Joan Dowell Norman, 82 passed Leroy M. Milton, M.D., a beloved physician and community leader, passed away peacefully at the age of 88. Born in 1935 near Shawnee, Oklahoma, he graduated from Bethel High School in 1952 and continued his education at Oklahoma State University and the University of Oklahoma School of Medicine.

Dr. Milton served as a Captain in the U.S. Air Force Medical Corps from 1963 to 1965 before beginning a distinguished 60-year career in private practice in McAlester, Oklahoma. He played a key role in developing McAlester Regional Hospital, serving as Chief of Staff and holding various leadership positions.

Married to his beloved wife, Kathryn, since 1957, Leroy was a devoted family man, raising four children: Susan; John; James (Robin); and Mark (Nicole). He was a proud grandfather to six grandchildren: Austin, Lauren, Alex, Emily, Alice, and Sam.
