



RESIDENTS EVACUATED



About 125 Hennessey residents were evacuated Monday, July 29th due to a major gas leak at the northwest corner of E. Iowa St and N. Mitchell Rd. The initial 911 response came in at 4:58 pm when Town Administrator Tiffany Tillman received a call from the Hennessey Aquatic Center manager Larissa Macy. Tillman stated, "Larissa said there was a very strong gas odor at the pool burning everyone's eyes." Tillman

instructed her to evacuate everyone right away and called 911.

When Hennessey Firefighters arrived they found that Gradeworks, the contractor working on the water main project in front of the school had struck a 4-inch gas line with their excavator. Following procedures Hennessey Firefighters along with Hennessey Police and Kingfisher County Emergency Management started evacuation going door-to-door to all of the homes and softball fields north of Iowa and both sides of Meramac St to Hwy 51.

Several residents refused to leave stating it was not a big deal. The Hennessey Town Hall was open as a cooling shelter for residents who didn't have anywhere to go.

ONG representatives were on-site at about 5:15 pm and called for backup from OKC. It took about an hour and ONG came out in force taking it very seriously with 7 trucks and about 20 crew members taking gas measurements and surveying the situation. They located the line about 200 feet north of the damage and dug a hole to expose the 4-inch "Polyline" and installed a clamp to cut off the gas flow at about 8:15 pm. At this point, it was safe for residents to return to their homes.

ONG then started making repairs to the damaged line that serviced all of the school properties along Mitchell Rd. Crews working the emergency included: Hennessey Fire, Hennessey Police, Kingfisher County Emergency Management, The Hennessey Utilities Department, and Oklahoma Natural Gas. photo by AAH Jack Quirk

Ramón believes in serving his fellow human beings and has quite the reputation working with the homeless population in Oklahoma City.




Ronnie Renshaw was born and raised on a farm northwest of Lacey, OK by Johnny and Colleen Renshaw. He was one of three children they raised there. Ronnie's hard work ethic and friendliness came from the examples his parents set. Johnny and Colleen had a dairy and farmed; this is where Ronnie's story begins. Ronnie has always been a worker on his family's farm, but when he was twelve years old, he worked for Robert Malone, a neighbor of theirs. Ronnie would plant Bermuda grass and help them farm. Ronnie said his feet could

barely reach the pedals of the farm tractors. Ronnie attended Lacey Schools until consolidation with Hennessey. While at Lacey Schools Ronnie loved playing baseball. He graduated Hennessey High School in 1975. After graduation, Ronnie worked laying brick with Jimmy Nelson and then Hennessey Rental Co., but the oilfield was calling his name. Ronnie went to work for Pratt Drilling Co. and then Welltec Oilfield Services. Ronnie's hard work ethic, dedication and knowledge led him to running the Oilfield Rig's for over 30 years. He then went to work for Frontier Oil Services for 8 or 9 years living in OKC; while working for Frontier, Ronnie decided it was time to move home and drove to OKC daily to work. As Ronnie put it, he was doing good, money was good- so he decided to buy a semi-truck and fix all that. Kidding aside, Ronnie drove a Semi-truck to Tulsa hauling scrap iron for Dale Choate for several years. He also had stories of working for Don Choate, but some of those can not be published!

A cat and their nine lives don't have anything on Ronnie. Just to mention a few incidents because this is an article not a book. Ronnie broke his sternum at the Hennessey Rodeo while trying to get a ribbon off a bull. Ronnie said "he got me, but he didn't get me down" Ronnie went to the rodeo dance afterwards. He also did a swan dive off a homemade bridge on the farm and broke his neck. He's had Rattlesnake bites, Ronnie's advice don't wait 12 hours to go get it looked at. He replaced the window on the camper and fell, with his hand going through the glass, cutting a main vein- thanks to a neighbor he got an ambulance and to the hospital before he bled out. All I can say is Ronnie keeps his guardian angel busy watching over him!

Ronnie has been retired now for about 4 years. You won't find Ronnie running any Oil Rigs these days, but he is running Preacher Creek Social Club, signing off every post with Ronnie Said. Ronnie's love for his family and friends radiates through the stories he tells. The memories that have been made in Lacey, OK. Ronnie is blessed with a son, Clint Renshaw, three grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

If you ever get a chance to have a conversation or sit on his swing with him, a person needs too. Ronnie's smile and laughter are contagious. The memories, stories and reminiscing will take a person back to what seems like a lifetime ago. Ronnie said "times are hard, but we lived a good life. I am lucky to be alive." CASE RE-OPENED FROM 1977 TRIGGERS ENVIRONMENTAL TESTING AT IOWA AND MAIN

If you have passed the Hennessey Tag Agency and CNG station lately, you have probably noticed huge trucks and drilling equipment. This is because a remediation project at Iowa and Main was recently re-opened for an old case involving the old Farmers Oil Supply fire. The environmental study will take 4 to 6 weeks to complete.

Many of you might remember March 27, 1977, because at 8:40 a.m., things took a wild turn in Hennessey, Oklahoma. Jerry Rothmire and Rick Bohnstedt were working on one of the gasoline pumps behind the Farmers Oil Supply when a spark ignited a serious fire. Rothmire, who managed the station, recalled, "We ran in and called the fire department and tried to put it out with our small extinguishers, but they didn't work."

The fire broke out in the middle tank of several that held gasoline and diesel. It spread quickly, prompting fire trucks from Hennessey and nearby towns like Kingfisher and Dover to rush to the scene. A foam truck from Vance Air Force Base showed up and controlled the fire for a bit, but it ran out of foam.

At about 9:15 a.m., a massive explosion rocked the area, sending flames across Main Street and causing onlookers to scramble for safety. The blast was visible from miles away. A five-block area was evacuated, but thankfully, no one was seriously hurt. Local oil companies and many from the Kingfisher County area pitched in with equipment, and dirt dams were built on Highway 81 to stop the gasoline from flowing out. Unfortunately, when the big tanks exploded, they ignited a fire in the back of the station and the nearby car wash. The Farmers Oil Supply had been around since the 1920s, originally built by Perry Stewart. Rothmire's family had owned it for years, delivering fuel to local farmers. The fire was intense, injuring three firefighters. Hulin "Hap" Kelly slipped on anti-freeze and caught fire; Jim Wilson and Bill McCartney had close calls, too, but managed to put their flames out quickly. By 3:00 p.m., the fire was finally under control but had caused much damage. It consumed 100 barrels of oil, 12,000 gallons of gasoline, and 20,000 gallons of diesel. The estimated damage was around \$100,000, with several surrounding businesses left without power and phone service. Despite the chaos, the community rallied together. Tomato Feta Pasta

"Garden Eats-Food from the Garden" series continues with a great way to use your garden tomatoes. Full disclosure-We only have tried cherry tomatoes in this recipe. We use the big beefy tomatoes and Roma tomatoes for salsa, hamburgers and marinara sauce! This recipe was found on TikTok about 3 years ago and has become a favorite at Summer's house. She adds cooked, shredded chicken or seasoned beef or pork to make it a whole meal that her son especially enjoys!

- Tomato-Feta Pasta
- 2 pints cherry tomatoes
- 8 oz feta cheese
- Herbs de Provence
- Olive oil
- Balsamic vinegar



- Bow tie pasta, half a package, cooked
- Chicken, cooked & shredded or ground beef/pork, browned and seasoned (as little or as much as you want!)

Spray a baking dish (9x9...Summer got hers from an estate sale and it's old and a little bigger than a standard 9x9 dish) with non-stick cooking spray. Wash and dry your tomatoes and dump them into the baking dish. Create a space in the center of the dish for the feta cheese. Dump the 8 oz package of feta cheese in the center of



the dish with the cherry tomatoes surrounding. Sprinkle the Herbs de Provence seasoning all over the top of the tomatoes and cheese, as desired. Drizzle olive oil over all as well. This is going to create the sauce so be generous. Finish with a little balsamic vinegar over all. Bake at 400°F for 30-40 minutes or until the cherries are tender and juicy and the cheese is browned. Mash the cherries and cheese all together to create the "sauce". You have a lot of freedom with this recipe because you really can use as many tomatoes as you want. It all depends on how "saucy" or "cheesy" you like your tomato sauce to be. After you have combined the tomatoes and cheese, add in your cooked pasta and cooked meat, if desired. Bonus- add in heavy whipping cream and stir it all up to make a Creamy Tomato Feta Pasta! Yum!!

And there you have it. A simple, versatile, and delicious meal that you based from your garden!
