SEMI TRUCK JACKKNIFE ON HWY 81

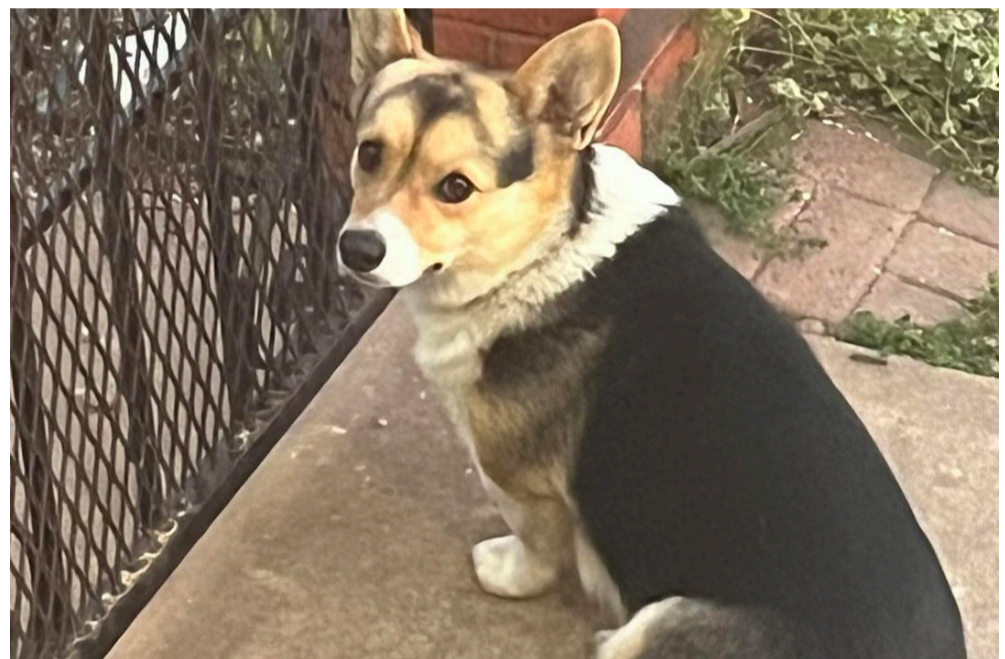

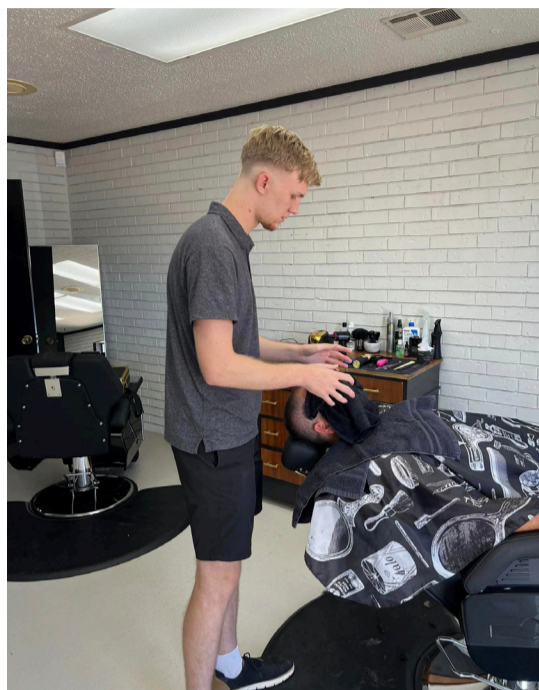

Officer investigation continued

by officer Baxter, was that the dog, if let loose would be caught by coyotes, so he put him down.

This bad decision by Officer Baxter led to a firestorm of social media posts and calls for news media to investigate. Social media comments found many derogatory remarks and threats towards the officer and Hennessey PD. Even activists from other states posted phone numbers doxxing our local agencies and tying up our 911 phone lines. This did nothing but hinder active emergencies in the county. All of the Hennessey emergency calls are routed to Kingfisher. Hennessey does not have a dispatch.

AAH reached out to Hennessey PD on Tuesday morning, September 3rd. Aaron Pitts, the Hennessey police chief, said in a statement that it is under investigation, and he could not speak on the matter. We also reached out to the Town Administrator, Tiffany Tillman, who, under the advice of the town attorney, was not able to speak on the matter.

On September 5th, Kingfisher County Sheriff Dennis Banther commented on one of All About Hennessey's posts, "I was contacted by Chief Pitts yesterday afternoon at 4:24 pm to request our agency conduct a criminal investigation. Please be patient as we conduct it. We have to start from zero and work through this matter. Any information gleaned from an internal investigation may not be used in a criminal investigation. Our staff will meet with Mr. and Mrs. Whittenburg soon and proceed from there. We are cognizant of the high emotions in this matter and the public's interest in knowing what happened. We will convey as much information as we can. I have assigned staff who will give priority to resolving this matter quickly and turning it over to the District Attorney's Office to determine if/ what charges will be filed." All About Hennessey reached out to Sheriff Banther four times for an update and he would not respond. It is reported that Assistant District Attorney Jimmy Bunn has recused himself from the case, and the investigation findings will be handed over to the district attorney in Canadian County.

On Friday, September 6th, Officer Baxter resigned from his position as Hennessey Police Officer.

Many have asked why a sweet, friendly little dog would be put down without even trying to locate the family. The town does have kennels. We are still looking into the details and will report on the findings once the investigation is complete.

While speaking to Mrs. Tucker, she said that the family was very upset and did not wish any harm to the officer or his family. They would like to see him fired but not jailed. McKenzie also posted on her facebook page this statement. "Guys I know what has happened is beyond a doubt just down right cruel but please don't judge all of our officers over this. It was one individual who chose to do wrong and we shouldn't judge our whole department. And please leave his family out of this. It was him and him alone. We live in a great and caring community and appreciate all of the support. Thank you."

Okl. Stat. tit. 21 § 1685 states that Animal cruelty is defined as the willful or malicious torturing, destruction, beating, maiming, mutilation, or killing of any animal, regardless of ownership and regardless of whether the animal is wild or domesticated. The crime is a felony in Oklahoma. It is punishable by up to a year in the county jail or a prison term of five years at the court's discretion. the Kingfisher County Sheriff's Department is handling the criminal investigation. We will report the findings when they are available.

All About Hennessey will always post lost animals on Facebook. Once posted, the animals are usually reunited with their owners within minutes. We do our best to post right away, but on weekends, if it is sent to us via FB messenger, we do not always see it until the week starts.
