The Hennessey Eagles coming off a tough rivalry loss in week one vs the Longhorns needed a bounce back game against the Tigers. Early in the game it didn't seem that they get the break they needed, as the Tigers started out converting three 3rd and long situations to punch it into the end zone for a 7-0 lead on the first drive. The Eagles did respond well though, with Hunter Weber bringing in a receiving touchdown, but a failed 2pt conversion made the ball game 7-6 Tigers. The Eagles offense was down their top 2 running backs, but 3rd string back Mario Lopez had himself a career game, and his touchdown put the eagles up 14-7 with a completed 2 point conversion to Jakob Johns.

The Eagles would take the lead into the 2nd, and in the 3rd, QB Gunnar Holder would punch it in from a yard out. Followed up by a 41 yard touchdown to Beau Vinson to start the 4th, and the Eagles led 27-7. Crescent would respond with a touchdown, but would be held scoreless until about 4 and a half minutes to go in the 4th, where their QB fired a beautiful ball to the corner of the end zone to cut the lead to just 6 for the Eagles. Lopez and Holder's combined running attack would be enough for the Eagles to hold on though, as they move to 1-2 following 27-21 win. 
HENNESSEY 7TH & 8TH GRADE VOLLEYBALL




