
MOTORCYCLE ACCIDENT

On Saturday, October 26, Jaxson Parkinson 17, was involved in a motorcycle accident while traveling two miles east on Highway 51

and 1/2 mile north. Jaxson hit an object on the road, which caused his motorcycle to go into a dangerous wobble, throwing him into a ditch. Following the accident, Jaxson was airlifted to OU Medical in OKC, where he initially required ICU care. Thankfully, Jaxson is now in stable condition and recovering in his own room. It is worth noting and emphasizing that Jaxson's decision to wear a helmet at the time of the incident likely played a crucial role in mitigating potential injuries.

SPECIAL MEETING FOR TRAFFIC SAFETY



The recent special meeting of Hennessey's Board of Trustees, held on October 23, aimed at enhancing safety and accessibility in the downtown area. The primary focus was angle parking on both sides of Oklahoma and 1st streets, and ADA handicap spots were added on all four corners.

Trustee Bert Gritz recommended the removal of parking spots at intersections on select streets and the adjustment of side street angle parking to 45-degree angles. These changes would improve driver sight lines and contribute to overall safety in the area.

Administrator Tiffany Town Tillman mentioned using stateapproved paint for the parking project. This decision was made following feedback from Trustee Gritz regarding the durability of the town's previous paint.

The Board acknowledged the importance of providing adequate handicapped parking spaces and ensuring that existing spaces are clearly marked in accordance with ADA regulations. Trustee David water management.

Jones emphasized the need to evaluate handicapped parking spaces across the town to ensure compliance with accessibility quidelines.

During the meeting, Mayor Harold Shaw brought attention to a specific area where a "No Parking" sign near a handicapped parking spot needed to be removed.

Additional discussions included the necessity of expanding downtown parking facilities to accommodate the increasing number of businesses in the area. The potential for re-purposing vacant spaces was also discussed as a solution to the growing demand for parking spaces.

The Board approved resolutions to enhance the town's electronic water meter system through a grant application. The purchase of remote antenna and reader systems will streamline meter readings, improve leak detection, and provide greater efficiency in


Where are they now? Jan Handley

While in high school, Jan played basketball and ran track, was involved in FCA and FHA, and was voted class favorite, Jr.-Sr. Prom Server, FCA Secretary, and FHA Beau. Jan graduated from Hennessey High School in 1974. After graduation, Jan continued to pursue his basketball career. He was an Oklahoma All-State and Honorable Mention All-American in high school and was hoping to go to the University of Oklahoma. Jan's basketball career plans changed when OU



changed coaches. He decided to go to The University of Central Oklahoma, mainly because Dana Amata was there playing football. After a year, Jan was not where he felt he needed to be, so he transferred to Murray State College and played for Wayne Cobb. He played there for one year, was recruited to The University of Texas, and played for the legendary Abe Lemons in Austin, Texas. At the end of Jan's junior year, a series of injuries ended his time at Texas, and this was when he transferred to Oklahoma Christian College. Jan played his final year of college for Jerry Jobe and graduated with a teaching degree and master's degree in education in 1980. Jan started his coaching career as an assistant coach with Jerry Jobe at OCC. He was at OCC for 5 years and then took a coaching job at Tuttle, OK. He was at Tuttle for one year and chose to take a coaching job at Murray State College in Tishomingo, OK. Jan was there for 5 years as the Athletic Director, Head Men's and Women's Coach, fitness center director, and full-time teacher in the PE department. Jan married Cindy Bowman in 1980. Cindy was from Kansas City, Missouri, and they chose to move closer to family. The move led Jan to be a coach at Wyandotte High School. He took the team to the state tournament and won third place game in the state tournament. After being there for 5 years, he took the Head Basketball position at Fort Osage High School in Independence, Missouri. Jan was there for 10 years and then went back to coach in college at William Jewell College in Liberty, Missouri. He was there for two years as an assistant coach and then took the Head Basketball and Assistant Athletic Director position in Pratt Kansas at Pratt Community College. Jan was there for four years and came back to Kansas City to coach the Kansas City Knights, a professional basketball team in the ABA professional league. The team folded after two years, and he went back to coaching in high school at Raytown, Missouri, a community within the Kansas City Metro area. Jan taught PE and Health and was the Head Girls' Basketball Coach for 14 years. Jan retired from teaching in 2019; this came after coaching and teaching for over 40 years. He is currently still coaching golf at Raytown High School and has a summer basketball program called the Kansas City Spurs Basketball Club. Jan has been coaching his club for 18 years, from 2006




OK2A HOLDS A FLAG PARADE



Friday, October 25th, 2024 DISTRICT SLUGFEST

Friday night's 2AII-District 1 slugfest between the Luther Lions and the Hennessey Eagles was, at times, one of the worst and greatest high school football game those lucky enough to be in attendance had the pleasure of experiencing.

The worst, with 22 accepted penalties, 7 total turnovers, and 11 punts between the two teams. The best, with 5 lead changes, including 2 pick-6's, a game-winning field goal, and for the Hennessey Eagles – victory! Hennessey 22 - Luther 20.

With neither team scoring in the 1st quarter, Junior Placekicker Luis Montoya got the Eagles on the board first with a 38 yard Field Goal into the north wind.

After the Eagles shut the Lions out in the first half (the second time in as many weeks the Hennessey Defense has not allowed a first half score), QB Gunnar Holder extended the lead in the 3rd quarter with a 1 yard dive and a 2-pt conversion run. 11-0 Hennessey.

Luther got their first score late in the 3rd on a 49yard run by Colt McCaslin, but Jessin Hardin's solo tackle on the conversion attempt kept the damage to a minimum, with the Eagles holding on to an 11-6 lead going into the final frame.

And then..., the 4th. The quarter's first lead change happened on a 28-yard interception return by the Lion's McCaslin (one of four INT's thrown by Holder on the night). Yet, once again, the Eagles D stood tall, with Braedyn Richardson and Titan Root stopping the conversion attempt short of the goal line. Lions now lead 12-11.

After both teams traded punts and Hennessey turned the ball over in their own territory, the Lions took possession with a short field, seemingly ready to ice the game with another score.

Then, the Eagles FIRST play of the game occurred. After getting knocked to the ground by a pulling offensive tackle, Senior DE Hunter Weber got to his feet just in time to step into the passing lane on a RB screen, snatching the pass and returning it 55 yards for his first career interception return for touchdown. After Jakob With the victory, the Eagles move to 5-3 Johns made the 2-pt conversion reception, the Eagles retook the lead 19-12, but with lots of football still to play.

Following a flagrant face mask on a long kickoff return, the Lions proceeded to march the field in six plays, retaking the lead 20-19 on a 3-yard run and a 2-pt conversion run with 1:55 to play in the game.



With their backs against the wall, into an autumn wind, with 62 yards to go, on their opponent's Senior night, the Eagles put together the drive of the season, exhibiting their growth, maturity, and tenacity that this coaching staff has instilled in them. Despite throwing 4 interceptions previously in the game, with only 10 completions for 69 yards to this point, Senior QB Gunnar Holder put his team on his shoulders and led the Eagles on a 9-play game-winning drive, going 6 for 7 for 57 yards passing, converting 3 first downs - one of which was the Eagles SECOND play of the game.

On 4th down and 7 on the Luther 45 yard line, inside :30 to play, Holder hit fellow Senior Kevin Trillo on a 31-yard seam route, bringing in the fingertip catch at the Lion 14. Following an 8-yard throw to Richardson, Holder then ran for 2 more yards, setting up Luis Montoya in the middle of the field for a 21-yard field goal try.

Having had 3 PAT's blocked just one week prior at Kellyville, Montoya spent the week shortening his approach and quickening his stride. That work paid off, when Luis' game-winning field goal split the uprights giving the Eagles the come-from-behind District win – 22-20.

overall on the season, 4-1 in District play, sitting in 3rd place behind Alva (4-1) and Stroud (5-0). The Eagles need at least one more win or a Luther loss in the next two games to secure a playoff spot. Hennessey can do just that this Friday night as we host the undefeated District leader Stroud Tigers. Kickoff on Friday, 7 pm, at Eagle Stadium.
