FAKE MONEY TEST POSITIVE FOR DRUGS



On 09/28/2024, a concerning incident unfolded in Hennessey involving movie prop \$100 bills that were discovered at a softball field and turned over to a Hennessey Police Officer. What initially seemed like a harmless find took a disturbing turn when the Kingfisher County Sheriff's Office took a cut sample of one of the prop bills which tested positive for narcotics.

Fake bills were also found up and down Main Street on Wednesday, September 18th. Luckily, there were no reports of ill effects from the money picked up.

Authorities in Hennessey are diligently investigating the situation, and the public can expect to be informed once the investigation is concluded. In the meantime, a crucial message is being shared with the community to ensure safety. Parents are urged to advise their children not to pick up anything from the ground if they are unsure of its origin. Any suspicions or unusual discoveries should be reported immediately to 911.

When questioned about the specific drug involved in this incident, All About Hennessey was informed that a field test was conducted on the scene. Still, definitive confirmation of the narcotic type awaits results from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI) as updates



HOTEL UP FOR AUCTION

The Hennessey Sleep Inn Hotel has been listed for sale at public auction. The auction will be conducted by Lippard Real Estate & Auction based in Enid and listed as a no-reserve auction. This means whatever the high bid is the property will sell.

The hotel was originally constructed in 2013 by Hennessey contractor Kevin Fuksa of KT Development for the current owner, Hennessey Hotels, LLC & Hennessey Inn and Suites, Inc.

Prior to this hotel, Hennessey only had one motel located on the east side of town at the intersection of N. Mitchell and Hwy 51. The Colony House motor lodge and restaurant included a multi-unit motel and meeting room, a restaurant with a full kitchen and party/meeting room, family living quarters, and an in-ground pool.

Russel and Pauline Richter and their two children, Sara and Kevin, moved to Hennessey from Marysville, Kansas, in October 1964 to live in and operate the motel. Over the years, the Motel changed hands several times. In 2001, Ray and Dayna Gilbert, originally from Coweta, Oklahoma, purchased it and changed the name to the Sawmill Inn. Ray and Dayna worked to improve the Motel, but in 2003, a devastating fire destroyed the restaurant.

According to the auction company, this will be a live on-site auction, but you can also bid online. The auction will take place at the Sleep Inn & Suites Hotel at 600 N Main S, Hennessey, OK, on October 30 at 10 a.m. CT. The property is listed as a very nice 3-story, 50-room hotel with an adjoining 3,025 sq. ft. event center. The entire property has approximately 77,927 sq. ft. and a large parking lot.

It didn't matter whether I liked or disliked my art teachers I always learned something from their perspective. I took photography classes in college as well. Back then we did not have memory cards, we had dark rooms. Seeing the photos come to life in the trays of solutions was incredible. Same thing now when seeing the faces come to life whether drawn or painted. I have had the privilege to capture a moment in someone's journey that I hope they will cherish for many years. A lot of the faces I have drawn, I had no idea who they were. I just liked the shot I got with my camera. Getting those subjects their drawing has opened up many stories I would have never heard otherwise. I have gotten to be a fly on the wall in their journey! A lot have graduated and started their families. They don't get to relive their high school days. Some stories are very sad, but hopefully I provided them with a positive memory to look back on. And that awkward little girl made a difference in someone else's journey. Thanks Mrs. Pollard for believing and caring! May the legacy lives on!
