Rainy Morning on Main Street

OVERNIGHT SEARCH

Hennessey Police and Fire along with the Kingfisher County Sheriff's Department conducted an overnight search that started at about 11 pm on Sunday, November 3rd for a 40-year-old female. She was described as wearing a white shirt and multicolor pants and the search focused on the northwest part of Hennessey. At about 11:50 pm they called for help with a drone equipped with a thermal imaging camera.



Brandon McKay with ODRC, Oklahoma Drone Recovery Company piloted the high tech drone outfitted with a camera that can see in total darkness, detect body heat and was equipped with a spotlight. McKay flew for about an hour and located lots of wildlife, but did not locate the missing person.

The fire department and the drone were released at about 1 am but the KFSO and HPD continued to search for her throughout the early morning hours. She was found at about 4:30 am Monday, November 4th. No information as to the name or where she was found has been released. Photos by AAH Jack Quirk.



A VERY LONG FIREFIGHTER DAY

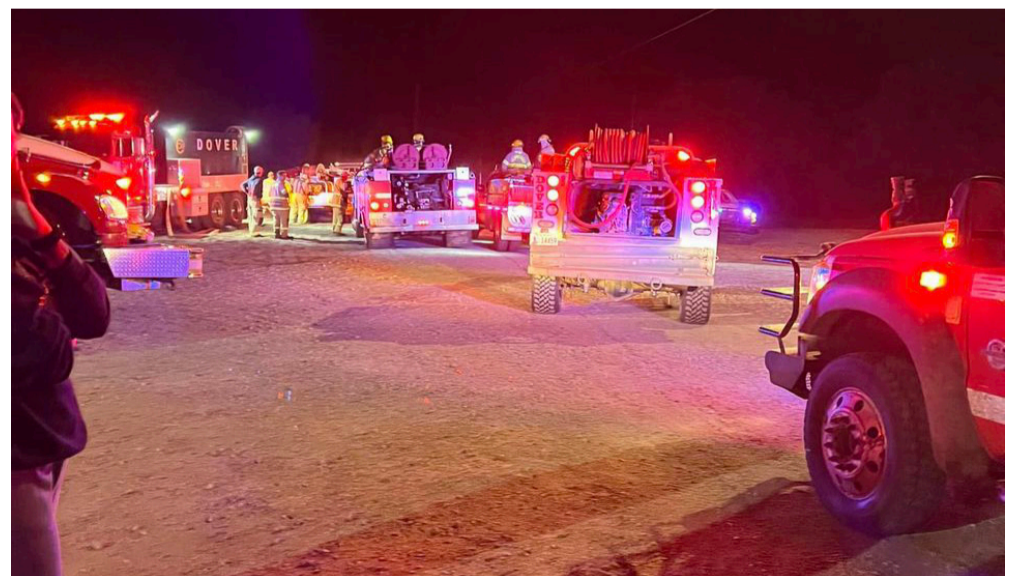
Hennessey Firefighters spent most of their day working a major multi-department fire east of Kingfisher on Hwy 33. At about 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, October 29th, they were called to fight a major fire in their own district. Several of the Hennessey crews left the Highway 33 fire and headed to the two fires west of Hennessey, one on Hwy 51 at the Cimarron River Bridge and the second at Hwy 51 & 2740 Rd.

Hennessey Fire Chief Brandon Scott said, "Our guys had not eaten all day, so I stopped in Hennessey and got food for them." This turned out to be a major fire consisting of about 50 acres and coming close to Jay and Joanna Goff's home.

HELP ARRIVES: A call went out for help to battle the 30 mile per hour wind-driven fire, and seventeen agencies converged on the scene. These included Loyal, Dover, Omega, Kingfisher, KFCO Emergency Management, Hitchcock, Okeene, Pafford Medical, Waukomis, Drummond, Pioneer, Ames, Fairview, Meno, Ringwood, Isabella, and Cleo Springs. About 80 firefighters were also involved.

The fire was advancing in two areas, one right at the Cimarron River bridge and the second to the east. At one point, the fire got dangerously close to Jay and Joanna Goff's home, but the firefighters quickly got it under control near the house and then concentrated on the overall fire.

The Hennessey crews were cleared and returned to the station at about 1:40 am. The cause of the fire is unknown. photo by Joanna Goff

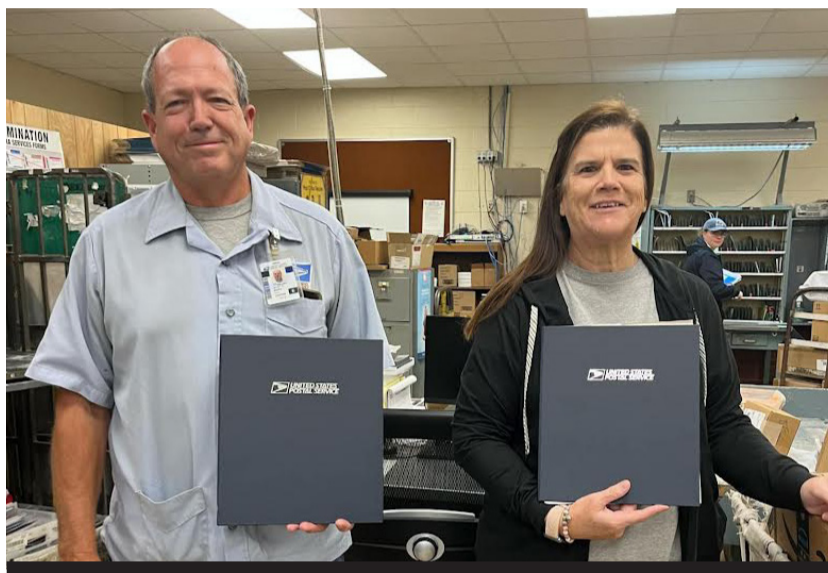

The Hennessey water department crew worked overnight on Thursday, October 31st, to repair a 6-inch steel water line. To lessen the disruption, they started work at 10:30 p.m. at the intersection of 2nd and Cheyenne St. and restored the water service at about 1 a.m.

One of the biggest challenges is the lack of isolation valves throughout the town. Therefore, the entire town has to be shut down to make repairs on large lines. Over the past few years, any time they make a repair on a main line, they have been installing valves to make future maintenance less disruptive.

Alyssa Kubat manages the water department. Alyssa was also recently hired as the new Public Works Director. Alyssa, Kyle Watkins, and Jamie Keel worked in the low temperatures and muddy conditions to complete the repair.

Renee was born in Enid, OK, and raised in Bison. She attended Catholic School until she was in 5th grade and moved west of town to Lacey, OK. The Simple Obedience of Showing Up

Over the past 25 years in America, an estimated 40 million adults have stopped going to church, marking the largest religious shift in the history of our nation. That's the latest research from Jim Davis and Michael Graham in their 2023 book, "The Great Dechurching" The potential reasons for this flight are legion: the rise of unbelief, the decline of cultural Christianity, pastor scandals, the COVID pandemic, increased political tension, youth sports, church hurt, distrust of institutions, widespread religious apathy, and the list goes on. Whatever the case, the trend is clear: many Americans, even confessed Christians, no longer value attending church.

It is a common sentiment that one can have a thriving relationship with God apart from involvement in a local church. And though I would never claim that church attendance is necessary for salvation, I would contend that the Bible holds a much higher view of the Church than many believers. Open the pages of Scripture and you will discover that God has always been about forming a people for Himself - not just isolated individuals. In the Old Testament, this was the nation of Israel - God's chosen people. In the New Testament, this God-formed community is found in the Church. In Matthew 16:18, Jesus proclaims that He is the one who will build His church. In Acts 2:46, the Church is portrayed as a group devoted to one another, meeting daily for worship and fellowship. In Ephesians 4:11-13 and 1 Corinthians 12, the Church is the body of Christ in which each individual part is essential for the growth of the whole. In Hebrews 10:24-25, the Church is a gathering that ought not be forsaken by the faithful. In 1 Timothy and Titus, Paul gives instructions for appointing proper church leadership. In Revelation 2-3, local churches are addressed, commended, and corrected by the resurrected Christ. In Ephesians 5:25-26, the Church is the bride of Christ, whom He loves and makes holy.

The manifold witness of Scripture is that the Church is valued by God. As such, Christians should not be eager to jettison a commitment to a local body of believers. Surely, we Christians often get church wrong. We're not as loving as we ought to be, we can be careless in speech and action, we sin and fall short. We are all works in progress. And yet, at her best, the Church is also a bastion of gospel truth, a hospital for the broken, a haven for the hurting, and a training ground for the saints. The Church was established by God for His glory and our good.

It's the Most Wonderful Time of the Year!

The OKSeasonedSisters love November and December and we love to celebrate the Christmas season for these two whole months. Our next article will go into Thanksgiving and why it's so special to us...but for now we just want to give you permission to put your Christmas tree up and be merry! Who really cares? It's okay. We need joy everyday. We believe that putting out Christmas decor and listening to Christmas music before Thanksgiving isn't disrespectful to Thanksgiving. Rather, it is extending our very favorite time of year to encompass one of our favorite holidays. If this upsets you, is it safe to assume you drink black coffee and don't smile back at babies? Kidding! We just love this holiday season so much that we wish to bring you tidings of good cheer before December. We know that there's more of you out there that feel the same. Go ahead with your holiday self! We appreciate your understanding in this matter, haha. On that note, here are a couple of favorite recipes that are perfect for this time of year.

Roasted Pumpkin Seeds

- 2 c (approx) seeds from a pumpkin
- butter or olive oil
- salt
- pepper
- Cavendar's seasoning
- Worcestershire sauce



Preheat oven to 250°F Rinse off your seeds and clean them from the pumpkin guts. Boil your clean pumpkin seeds in salted water (1 ½ tsp salt) for 10 minutes. After boiling, dry the seeds on a towel and mix up your seasonings. 3 Tbsp butter, melted or 2 Tbsp olive oil to coat the seeds in a bowl.

Seasoning mix:

- 1 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp pepper
- 1 1/2 tsp Cavendar's seasoning
- 2 tsp Worcestershire sauce

Add the seasoning mix to the buttered seeds. Spread out the seasoned/buttered seeds in a single layer on a baking sheet lined with nonstick foil. Bake for 45 minutes, stirring occasionally. Increase the oven temp to 325°F and bake for 5-10 minutes more to really get them crunchy. Super delicious, savory snack! Another yummy snack that is perfect this time of year is peanuts and candy corn. Seriously! Combine dry roasted (lightly salted) peanuts in a jar (that you can seal) with candy corn. The perfect eating ratio is one candy corn to 4-ish peanuts. So good! Enjoy this season, guys. Let people spread joy with their holiday cheer. @okseasonedsisters

SCHOOL NURSE SHELLEY MUZNY TEACHES CPR TO HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS

The Hennessey High School seniors were taught Hands-Only CPR (a requirement by the state to graduate), Stop the Bleed, and the Heimlich Maneuver. School Nurse Shelley Muzny taught the class. Stop the Bleed and the Act Fast Rescue Choking Vest was part of a grant Nurse Shelley received from The Hennessey Educational School Foundation. The Act Fast Rescue Choking Vest is an invaluable tool for easily and effectively teaching students the correct way to perform the abdominal thrust maneuver (Heimlich). When performed correctly, a foam plug shoots into the air. Stop the Bleed is a national campaign that aims to reduce preventable deaths from bleeding by teaching people how to control bleeding in an emergency. The students were taught to identify the bleed, pack the wound, apply pressure, and place a tourniquet on someone.

Raising Awareness: Gail Box, Founder of The Austin Box '12' Foundation, Inspires Students during Red Ribbon Week Assembly

The Hennessey Middle and High School had a guest speaker on Wednesday- October 30, 2024, in an assembly for Red Ribbon Week. Gail Box, mother of Austin Box and founder of The Austin Box "12" Foundation, spoke to the students regarding prescription pain medication and how addictive it can be. Austin Box was from Enid, OK, and after graduating high school, he joined the OU football team. He struggled with many injuries: knee, elbow and back. His last injury (a ruptured disc) in his back occurred at the beginning of the 2010 football season. This injury, Gail believes, is what set in motion his abuse of prescription pain medication. Austin died May 19, 2011, from an accidental prescription overdose. Austin's family started The Austin Box "12" Foundation in his honor, with the mission of educating the public on the dangers of prescription drug abuse. The students were a great audience and very receptive to the message.

"Iron Sharpens Iron As One Man Sharpens Another." When Austin died, he wore a wristband quoting this scripture from Proverbs 27:17. The Austin Box "12" Foundation has adopted a variation of that idea, "Sharpen Each Other," as our mission and founding principle. The CDC reports that a death from prescription drug abuse happens every 19 minutes in the United States, more than from car accidents. (austinbox12foundation.com)

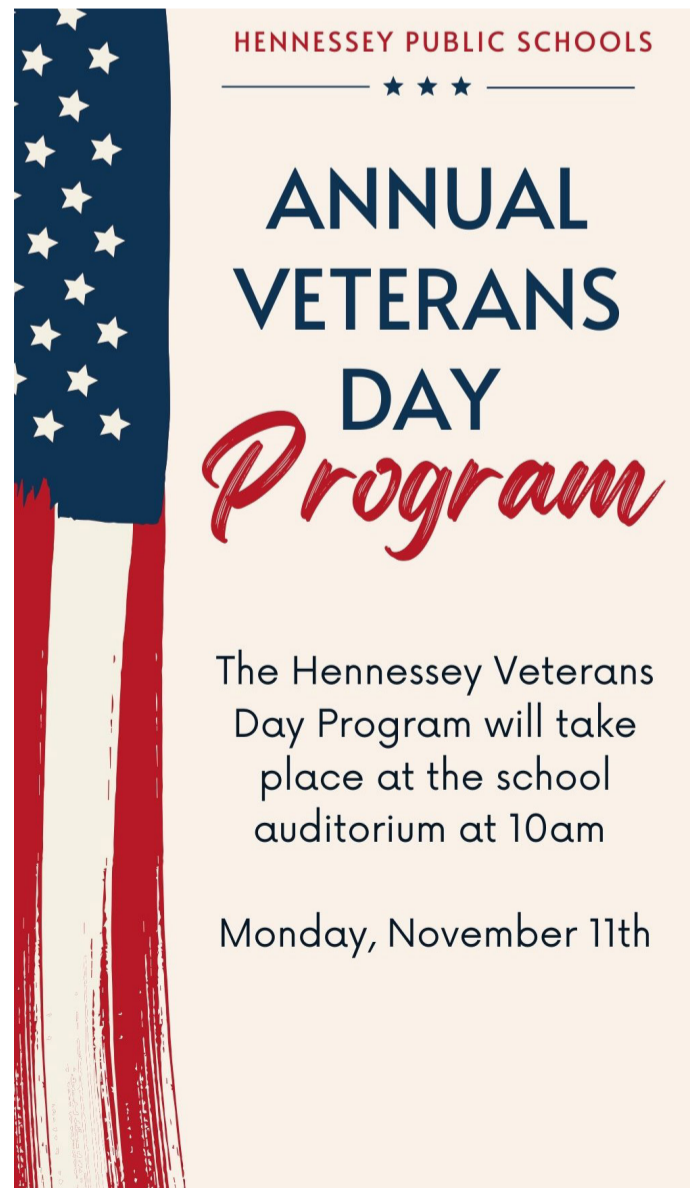


