OVERNIGHT SEARCH


Hennessey Police and Fire along with the Kingfisher County Sheriff's Department conducted an overnight search that started at about 11 pm on Sunday, November 3rd for a 40-year-old female. She was described as wearing a white shirt and multicolor pants and the search focused on the northwest part of Hennessey. At about 11:50 pm they called for help with a drone equipped with a thermal imaging camera.

Oklahoma Drone Recovery Company piloted the high tech drone outfitted with a camera that can see in total darkness, detect body heat and was equipped with a spotlight. McKay flew for about an hour and located lots of wildlife, but did not locate the missing person.

The fire department and the drone were released at about 1 am but the KFSO and HPD continued to search for her throughout the early morning hours. She was found at about 4:30 am Monday, November 4th. A VERY LONG FIREFIGHTER DAY

Hennessey Firefighters spent most of their day working a major multidepartment fire east of Kingfisher on Hwy 33. At about 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, October 29th, they were called to fight a major fire in their own district. Several of the Hennessey crews left the Highway 33 fire and headed to the two fires west of Hennessey, one on Hwy 51 at the Cimarron River Bridge and the second at Hwy 51 & 2740 Rd.

Hennessey Fire Chief Brandon Scott said, "Our guys had not eaten all day, so I stopped in Hennessey and got food for them." This turned out to be a major fire consisting of about 50 acres and coming close to Jay and Joanna Goff's home.

HELP ARRIVES: A call went out for help to battle the 30 mile per hour wind-driven fire, and seventeen agencies converged on the scene. These included Loyal, Dover, Omega, Kingfisher, KFCO Emergency Management, Hitchcock, Okeene, Pafford Medical, Waukomis, Drummond, Pioneer, Ames, Fairview, Meno, Ringwood, Isabella, and Cleo Springs. About 80 firefighters were also involved.

The fire was advancing in two areas, one right at the Cimarron River bridge and the second to the east. At one point, the fire got dangerously close to Jay and Joanna Goff's home, but the firefighters quickly got it under control near the house and then concentrated on the overall fire.



The Simple Obedience of Showing Up

Over the past 25 years in America, an estimated 40 million adults have stopped going to church, marking the largest religious shift in the history of our nation. That's the latest research from Jim Davis and Michael Graham in their 2023 book, "The Great Dechurching" The potential reasons for this flight are legion: the rise of unbelief, the decline of cultural Christianity, pastor scandals, the COVID pandemic, increased political tension, youth sports, church hurt, distrust of institutions, widespread religious apathy, and the list



goes on. Whatever the case, the trend is clear: many Americans, even confessed Christians, no longer value attending church.

It is a common sentiment that one can have a thriving relationship with God apart from involvement in a local church. And though I would never claim that church attendance is necessary for salvation, I would contend that the Bible holds a much higher view of the Church than many believers. Open the pages of Scripture and you will discover that God has always been about forming a people for Himself - not just isolated individuals. In the Old Testament, this was the nation of Israel - God's chosen people. In the New Testament, this God-formed community is found in the Church. In Matthew 16:18, Jesus proclaims that He is the one who will build His church. In Acts 2:46, the Church is portrayed as a group devoted to one another, meeting daily for worship and fellowship. In Ephesians 4:11-13 and 1 Corinthians 12, the Church is the body of Christ in which each individual part is essential for the growth of the whole. Roasted Pumpkin Seeds

- •2 c (approx) seeds from a pumpkin
- butter or olive oil
- salt
- pepper
- ·Cavendar's seasoning
- Worcestershire sauce

Preheat oven to 250*F Rinse off your seeds and clean them from the pumpkin guts. Boil your clean pumpkin seeds in salted water (1 ½ tsp salt) for 10 minutes. After boiling, dry the



seeds on a towel and mix up your seasonings. 3 Tbsp butter, melted or 2 Tbsp olive oil to coat the seeds in a bowl.


Seasoning mix:

Raising Awareness: Gail Box, Founder of The Austin Box '12' Foundation, Inspires Students during Red Ribbon Week Assembly

The Hennessey Middle and High School had a guest speaker on Wednesday- October 30, 2024, in an assembly for Red Ribbon Week. Gail Box, mother of Austin Box and founder of The Austin Box "12" Foundation, spoke to the students regarding prescription pain medication and how addictive it can be. Austin Box was from Enid, OK, and after graduating high school, he joined the OU football team. He struggled with many injuries: knee, elbow and back. His last injury (a ruptured disc) in his back occurred at the beginning of the 2010 football season. This injury, Gail believes, is what set in motion his abuse of prescription pain medication. Austin died May 19, 2011, from an accidental prescription overdose. Austin's family started The Austin Box "12" Foundation in his honor, with the mission of educating the public on the dangers of prescription drug abuse. The students were a great audience and very receptive to the message.

"Iron Sharpens Iron As One Man Sharpens Another." When Austin died, he wore a wristband quoting this scripture from Proverbs 27:17. The Austin Box "12" Foundation has adopted a variation of that idea, "Sharpen Each Other," as our mission and founding principle. 


