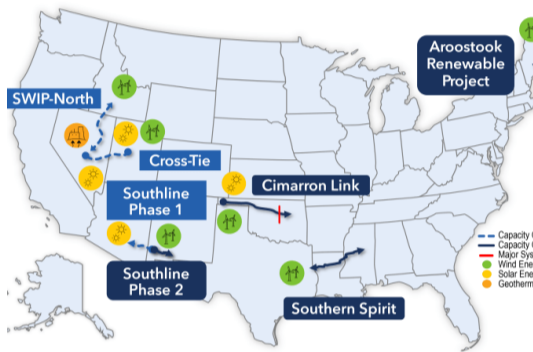

COMMUNITY UNITES AGAINST PROPOSED POWER LINE CORRIDOR IN NORTHERN OKLAHOMA



On Monday night, November 18th, about 300 concerned citizens from Kingfisher, Garfield, and surrounding counties attended a public meeting at the Enid Expo Center. The meeting was about the planned major power line corridor through northern Oklahoma.

Joe Keegan, newly elected Garfield County District 1

Commissioner, addressed the audience and outlined the key issues with the two proposed energy projects, which include two high-voltage direct current transmission lines proposed from the Panhandle to Tulsa. The proposed transmission corridor covers 18 Oklahoma counties, including Kingfisher County, which is 4 to 18 miles wide and is 646 miles long.

One line is part of the National Interest Electric Transmission Corridor (NIETC), and the other is owned by a private company. Oklahoma State Representative Mike Dobrinski stressed the lack of notification and local government involvement by corporations.

Enid attorney David Henneke said he was representing the Bryan family from Hennessey, which has been the first to be sued because they refused to allow a required survey. Henneke said he was new to this, like everyone else, and didn't know about it until just a few weeks ago.

Henneke said he spoke with the Arkansas attorney involved in pre-condemnation surveys, and he said they need to conform, or they will be sued. The topic that was stressed over and over throughout the meeting was the lack of notification to any public official, including county commissioners, state representatives, or senators. There was a lot of discussion on the rights of corporations to exercise eminent domain.

During the meeting, all of the speakers stressed the need for calls for legislative action to protect private property rights, Coordination with state representatives and senators, and more community involvement. You can view the complete meeting video at AllAboutHennessey.com

Storm Damage Monday Morning

Many Hennessey residents awoke to the tornado sirens sounding at about 5:56 am Monday, November 18th. Hennessey Fire, Kingfisher Emergency Management, and All About Hennessey were actively tracking the storm with spotters in the field as it rolled south of Hennessey, traveling to the northeast. Although there was no reported damage in Hennessey town limits, there was damage about 10 miles east of Hennessey. Thirteen OG&E poles were snapped off along Hwy 51, about 10 miles east of Hennessey. Bill Kusik's farm, located ten miles east and 1-1/2 miles south on 2970 road, received damage to 2 barns, and several trailers were blown over.



A semi-truck was blown off the road south of Hennessey at about the same time on Hwy 81 at 690 Rd. Hennessey Schools delayed school opening till 10 am due to the approaching storms. The National Weather Service has not yet determined if it was an actual tornado or straight-line winds. The Mesonet site reported 75 mph winds in the Hennessey area. Photos by AAH Jack Quirk

NOVEMBER FOL MEETING

Friends of the Library held their November meeting on Tuesday, November 12th. Several items were discussed, including the Dolly Parton Imagination Library, which is available to children from birth until their 5th birthday. The program provides each child with one book a month. Currently, there are only two Spanish language books, and they hope to add more in the future. The Hennessey Library and the Hennessey United Organization made funding contributions. Volunteers help cover the postage and administration fees, making the books totally free for the children. There are 341 enrolled in Kingfisher County, and it is estimated that a third of those children are Hennessey residents.



The Pumpkin Patch faced a few obstacles this year, one of which was a hot October. The group discussed whether or not this was something that they wanted to continue or add to it to attract more pumpkin sales. Although they did make a profit, the possibility of cutting back on the number of pumpkins and haybales was discussed to help with raise profits.

Librarian Steven Mitchell reported that about 900 people came through the Haunted Library, which was slightly lower than the previous year but not by much. The library ran out of candy in an hour, and Steven had to run and purchase more. This year, Hennessey High School students and community members really stepped up to help. It was considered to be a success.

The FOL Chili cookoff will be held at the school on February 8th, the Saturday before the Super Bowl. Discussions were held about changing it a bit this year to encourage our Hispanic residents to participate. Everything is still in the planning stages, but this year, they plan to add soups, stews, and Mexican beans to the contest. They would like at least 20 contestants overall. It is always a fun event, and door prizes and prizes for the winners will be given out.

CANDIDATE FILING BEGINS FOR BOARD OF EDUCATION

Candidate filing for the Board of Education begins Monday, December 2nd, 2024 for Kingfisher School District I-7, Dover School District I-2, Hennessey School District I-16, Cashion School District I-89, Lomega School District I-3, Okarche School District I-105, Chisholm Trail Tech Center District No. 26, Autry Tech Center District No. 15, Francis Tuttle Tech Center District No. 21, Canadian Valley Tech Center District No. 6, Crescent School District I-2, Okeene School District I-9, Piedmont School District I-22, Drummond School District I-85, Cimarron School District I-92 and Covington-Douglas School District I-94 Kingfisher County school districts.

Those who wish to file for a Board of Education office must submit a Declaration of Candidacy to the Kingfisher County Election Board December 2nd, 3rd or 4th, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Candidate filing packets are available on the State Election Board website at <https://oklahoma.gov/elections/candidates/candidate-filing.html> and at the County Election Board.

In addition to the Declaration of Candidacy, candidates must also submit a Voter Registration Verification Form, which can be obtained from the County Election Board or by logging into the OK Voter Portal at <https://oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp.html>. Information on the Voter Registration Verification Form must match the information provided on the Declaration of Candidacy. Shawna Butts, Secretary of the Kingfisher County Election Board, reminds candidates that Contests of Candidacy must be filed no later than Friday, December 4th by 5 p.m. and may only be filed by another candidate for that office. Contests against unopposed candidates may be filed by contacting the County Election Board.

If more than two candidates file for the same Board of Education seat, a Primary Election will be held Tuesday, February, 11, 2025. If one candidate receives more than 50% of the votes, that candidate will be named the elected official. If no candidate receives more than 50% of the votes, the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes will vie for the seat during the Board of Education General Election, Tuesday, April 1, 2025. If only two candidates file for the same Board of Education seat, those two candidates' names will appear on the General Election ballot in April.

4 Be glad in the Lord always!

Again I say, be glad!
5 Let your gentleness show in your treatment of all people. The Lord is near.
6 Don't be anxious about anything; rather, bring up all of your requests to God in your prayers and petitions, along with giving thanks.
7 Then the peace of God that exceeds all understanding will keep your hearts and minds safe in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:4-7)



As I write this, my to do lists sit next to my compute on my desk. Yes, lists, not just one but multiple ones. One for church, one for home, one for Thanksgiving, one for packing for Thanksgiving, and one for a things that need to be done before decorating for Christmas. Now I love a list, I have said before that lists may be my love language, but it can get overwhelming.

I know first hand that anxiety is real and if not addressed it can cause us to lose focus on what is important. It can make us think that if there is so much to be done, where do I start? This is why before I start my daily to do lists or really any list I ask God to clear my mind so I can focus on what is most important. This helps. It helps me to focus on prayer and the breathe in my lungs before I think ahead of what needs to be done.

Paul wrote the letter to the church at Philippi while in prison. I think he may have had some anxiety in life when writing this letter. But he also made it clear to the church that prayer was needed in all uncertain times. The church needed to know that prayers and thanksgiving were more important than the conditions you may find yourself in.

Paul wrote that God's peace "exceeds all understanding." You may ask, "How can I be at peace when _____ has happened?" Here's how: Paul emphasizes an active dependence on God. Our God hears our cries and takes care of us, if not always the way we expect, always in love.

Telling me not to be anxious is like telling me not to be obey the law of gravity, it is impossible, I will make lists and I will get overwhelmed at times, But I also will pray and ask for clarity and peace that only a God of love can give, I hope you can too.

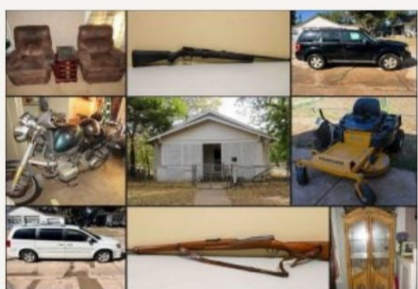

INCIDENTS

On 11-13-2024, Sergeant Solis from The Hennessey Police Department responded to a report of a credit card skimmer found at the Main Street Truck Stop. The skimmer was discovered on pump number 5 by Chester from Double Check, who works on pumps and is required to notify law enforcement of such findings. Attempts to contact his family were unsuccessful, but eventually, his brother acknowledged the ongoing issue and would address it later. The scene was cleared, and officers resumed patrol.

All About Hennessey moves into newly renovated building



After a long journey, All About Hennessey is in its new building.

Jack Quirk started All About Hennessey in 2017. Since then it has grown into a regional news and information company under the umbrella called The All About Network. Today the company employees 11 part- and full-time employees.

About a year ago, Quirk started looking for a building to house the company. On February 14, 2024, he sealed the deal on the 100-year-old Honey & Co. building, located at 300 S. Main St. in Hennessey.

"It needed a roof, heat and air, a lot of structural work, electrical plumbing and more, a lot more," said Quirk.

Quirk, who has been a bonded contractor for many

years, did much of the work on the building.

Contractors completely rewired the building and installed the new heat and air system in the attic.

But there was still more to do. The floors in the old building were uneven and needed to be leveled.

"This was a huge undertaking cutting about 100 stringers every one a different thickness to get all of the rooms straight," said Quirk.

One of the last big expenses was windows. Quirk said the two large 100-year-old wavy glass windows in the front of the house were salvaged. The rest were replaced.

"We installed over 1000 feet of computer network cable throughout the entire building to run all of the technology," said Quirk.

After a complete restoration project and already over budget, Quirk found a way to save money by purchasing kitchen cabinets, desks, chairs, meeting room furnishings and more at the Chesapeake Energy bankruptcy auction in Oklahoma City.

All offices in the newly renovated building have

workstations instead of desks to give the staff more room to work comfortably, said Quirk.

With the finishing details in place, the staff moved into their new building last month.
