



JOURNEY OF REMEMBRANCE

The Battle of the Bulge started on Dec 16, 1944, when German forces launched a surprise attack on Allied forces in the forested Ardennes region in Belgium, Luxembourg, and France. The battle lasted until Jan 16, 1945, after the Allied counter-offensive forced German troops to withdraw. Soldiers fought in brutal winter conditions, and the U. S. Army lost approximately 19,000 men and suffered 75,000 total casualties in what became the United States' deadliest single World War II battle.

Fast forward 80 years in Okarche, Oklahoma, Jeff Palmer was working on his family history when he came across a website dedicated to the 300th Engineer Combat Battalion, which his dad served in. Through



some correspondence, Jeff was invited to the 80th anniversary Battle of Bulge. iourney seven-day started at 10:30, boarding a plane on Dec 9. Jeff's father, Charles Palmer, passed away suddenly when Jeff was 12 vears old. Jeff told me he didn't take anyone with him on this journey, but I have to think he carried his 12-year-old self with him when boarding that plane. Jeff boarded a train on Dec 10 in the last leg to Liege, Belgium. Jeff said his tour guide spoke English

while touring museums, cemeteries, and battle sights—Jeff's first language is English, then German. The language barriers broke away when all came together in remembrance. Jeff laughed, talking about how intrigued his new friends were by the names of our small towns in Oklahoma.

Jeff's emotions came to the surface. He returned home with a plaque to honor his dad, who participated in the commemoration of Manhay, the site of the harsh combat in December 1944. Charles Palmer served with the Army Bulldozer Operation Combat Engineer's Pavilion. We have lost most of our World War II veterans. Jeff, being a veteran himself, understands how important it is to share history with children. He took this journey to honor his dad and give his 12-year-old self a gift of remembrance!



Mustang Gas Plant cont..



This gas processing facility is located 2 miles south of the Town of Hennessey on S Hwy 81, formally known as the Exxon Plant. It was purchased by Mustang Gas Products in 2002 and underwent a remodel several years ago.

When the firefighters arrived, the Mustang Gas crews had already safely evacuated and were in their muster positions at the intersection of HWY 81 and Exxon Rd (E650 Rd) and Exxon Rd and N2860 Rd.

Hennessey fire command called for an evacuation of the surrounding area, especially the Quick RV Park, which is located directly south of the facility. The Oklahoma Highway Patrol closed all lanes of US-81 from E0640 RD to E0660 RD just south of Hennessey, traffic was rerouted on county roads. Kingfisher County District 2 assisted by using road graders to block traffic on three county roads.

The Hennessey firefighter's wives opened the fire station for anyone needing shelter during the evacuation. Brandon McKay, with Oklahoma Drone Recovery Co, flew his drone over the plant to give the emergency crews a better look at what the issues were. By noon, the fire had been brought under control and Mustang employees, along with Hennessey Fire approached the affected area of the plant to survey the damage. Shortly after Hennessey Fire command called for the reopening of roads and to allow residents to return to their homes.

Agencies assisting with this incident included Kingfisher County Emergency Management, Kingfisher County Sheriff's Office, Kingfisher County 911 Dispatch, Kingfisher County District 2, Hitchcock Fire Department, Enid Fire Department, Dover Fire, Loyal Fire Dept. 

Determined to Obey



Tis the season for RESOLUTIONS. new year lends itself to opportunities for goal setting, selfimprovement, getting things done. In the month of January, motivation is at an all-time high. You're going to lose 20 pounds, pay off that loan, and finish that house project you said you were going to do this same time last year. New year, new YOU at least so they say.

New Years resolutions can get somewhat of a bad rap. As you get older, you know how often you fail to follow through on those resolutions. Still, being "resolved," or determined about something is not a bad thing - it can often be a good thing, when directed in the right ways.

In the book of Daniel, chapter 1, we see a positive example of determination. Daniel and his friends are teenagers going through one of the most tragic periods of Israelite history: the Exile. Israel has repeatedly disobeyed God and ignored His prophets, to the point that God must judge His people. God does this by allowing a foreign nation, Babylon, to conquer Judah and disperse God's people across the empire of Babylon. Daniel and his friends are among the first to be taken from Jerusalem and forced to live in Babylon, a pagan nation filled with idolatry. They are taken to the palace of the king and trained in Babylonian religion and culture, in order to serve the king. The question hangs over the first chapter of the book: Will Daniel and his friends remain faithful to God, or will they compromise their faith to fit in with their surroundings?

Daniel 1:8 gives us the answer: "Daniel determined that he would not defile himself with the king's food or with the wine he drank. So he asked permission from the chief eunuch not to defile himself." For whatever reason, Daniel identified the King's food as a matter of obedience and disobedience. Eat and disobey God. Refuse to eat and disobey the king. Daniel was "DETERMINED," "RESOLVED," not to eat the king's food. In other words, He determined to OBEY the Lord.

For followers of Christ, Daniel serves as an example for us. Obedience requires faith-filled determination. You do not passively turn into a more obedient person. It is a posture of heart that values Christ over culture, God's ways over the world's ways, and makes settled choices to obey God over people.

What does spiritual health look like for you this new year? Perhaps you need a "Daniel moment," a moment where you determine in your heart to OBEY the Lord and seek His will and His ways in the year to come, starting TODAY.
