ROADS CLOSED DUE TO TESTING

Several Kingfisher County roads have been closed for several days while Mustang Gas Plant runs tests on their gas lines. Kingfisher County District #2 was asked to close the roads on Monday, February 10th, but extended the closure through Tuesday night.

The roads closed included Highway 81 & CR 650 (Exxon Blacktop) to County Road 650 & 2860 (Cemetery Road) South on County Road 2860 to 660.

This gas processing facility is located 2 miles south of the Town of Hennessey on S Hwy 81, formally known as the Exxon Plant. It was purchased by Mustang Gas Products in 2002 and underwent a remodel several years ago. On Sunday morning, January 12, 2025, this Plant was evacuated because of a fire. When the firefighters arrived there were flames visible inside the gas processing plant near the south end of the facility.

WATER RESTORATION ACT BILL PASSES COMMITTEE

OKLAHOMA CITY – Rep. Mike Dobrinski, R-Okeene, recently passed a measure in committee that would expand a program to eradicate harmful trees and shrubs in certain watersheds statewide.

House Bill 2162 would create the Terry Peach Watershed Restoration Act. The act would build on House Bill 2239 enacted in 2023, which created a pilot program focused on the North Canadian Watershed with the goal of exploring solutions to the infestation of red cedars and other invasive species.

"These trees and shrubs create a great fire danger, and they draw away crucial amounts of water in already drought-stricken areas of our state," Dobrinski said. "Expanding this program statewide will help protect our environment – including grazing lands and wildlife habitats – and boost our economy.

HB2162 would remove the pilot status of the program and would create a revolving fund to be administered by the Oklahoma Conservation Commission to accomplish the goals of the program. The estimated cost of expansion is \$10 million, which would have to be approved through the appropriations process. Dobrinski said the return on investment to the state should be greater than this initial investment.

The bill today passed the House Agriculture Committee and now is eligible to be heard in the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources Oversight. Dobrinski said the pilot program created previously has already proven enormously successful, with the Oklahoma Conservation Commission eradicating many invasive species in the initial watershed area and around housing developments and critical infrastructure. The commission also has provided training and support for rural fire departments and burn associations to continue the work.

Trey Lam, executive director of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission, has said in the past that the rapid growth of cedar brush intensifies drought, reduces water levels, and fuels intense wildfires every year. While there is no one single short-term solution, a three-prong approach of research, eradication by utilizing prescribed burning and mechanically creating brush-free zones around communities and rural infrastructure, has been utilized effectively and is the basis for the new legislation.

David Macy is the son of Gary and the late Diane Macy. He has one brother, Logan Macy. David would cover the ambulance calls during the day while he was in high school because they were typically



short-handed. He carried a pager, and if they got an ambulance call during the day, he would leave school, run the ambulance call, and come back.

On David's 18th birthday, he got to run his first two ambulance calls. This was the beginning of a career in fire service, and it started in Hennessey, working for the fire department and EMS. David will tell

you his career path has undoubtedly been nothing short of an awesome ride. His time working in Hennessey was definitely the foundation on which he could build a career. Before David graduated on April 19th, 1995, he found himself serving the people. He was in Oklahoma City on a tour of News Channel 9 when the Oklahoma City bombing occurred. As an 18-year-old senior, he immediately sprang into action. He first went to Baptist Hospital, where he volunteered in the emergency room for a short time before getting in an ambulance.

After graduating from Hennessey High

School and serving on the Hennessey Fire Department for 3 ½ years, David attended Autry Vo-Tech in Enid to take EMT classes. He then moved to Yukon, where he served as a firefighter for the Oklahoma City Fire Department for 24 1/2 years. In 2021, he became the Fire Chief of Bridge Creek. Additionally, he had the opportunity to assist in southern Louisiana with Pafford Medical Services as part of an ambulance task force in the aftermath of the hurricanes.

David also worked for EagleMed from 2002- 2013 simultaneously with the fire department. He worked his way up to Lieutenant and retired in 2024. On August 6th, 2024, he officially retired.

David is an avid OU fan, always cheering on his Sooners. He enjoys spending time with family and friends. In 2015, David moved to Tuttle, where he continues to live. He currently works for NASCAR as an official on the AMR Safety Team. David goes to 16-20

Just a reminder for those procrastinators: Valentine's Day is sneaking up on you. I'm hooked on watching the Hallmark Channel movies. The girl always gets the guy, and they live happily ever after. My favorite love story isn't on the Hallmark channel. Bill Flesher was 18 when he joined the

Bill Flesher was 18 when he joined the Marines. He had never been away from



home, much less flown on a plane. As the homesickness set in, a mutual friend gave him LaJean Poe's address, and the pen pal's love story began. LaJean was in the middle of her senior year at Paul's Valley High School. She had written her pen pal Marine and dated him when he came home on leave.

December 19th, 1955, Bill had come home for a 3-day leave. Lajean was supposed to be babysitting, but instead, they took another couple for witnesses and headed to Texas, where they eloped. My dad loaded up his new bride and headed back to California to finish his last few months with the Marines.

Years later, after they raised their family, Mom went back and got her GED. She didn't even have a driver's license until after marrying my dad. She only mentioned that once, and I didn't ask who taught her to drive.



Figured there was a test of patience in that story. She told me she didn't know my dad when she married him.

I was the second of three children and the only girl. Yes, I was a daddy's girl, and my brothers would probably tell me I was a bit spoiled. When I was born, Daddy was working on a rig an hour away. Cellphones weren't a thing, and the

hand that was supposed to deliver the news waited over an hour before he told my dad of my arrival. We moved 22 times following the oilfield. When my older brother started school, we settled in Hennessey. As for me, I really didn't think school was necessary since I hung out with my dad, watching him clean cattle guards and check wells. When I did go to kindergarten, mom would let me out the car door, and I'd try climbing in the back seat. That's a different story for another time!

Back to the pen pal love story... Bill and LaJean Flesher were married for 49-plus years. I watched the love and respect my parents shared come full circle during the last 21 months of my dad's life. My dad was diagnosed with lung cancer. I watched my mom stay by Dad's side as they walked through his cancer journey. At one point, he told her to put him in the nursing home, and she didn't miss a beat explaining he wouldn't get biscuits and gravy at 3 in the morning there! During that time, Daddy told us many times life goes on. He just didn't mention the hole that was left in our hearts. Five years after my dad's death, I found myself standing by my mother, preparing for a valve replacement surgery. The last thing she told me was she would be ok either way. She went to heaven a few days later.

I know you think this was a sad ending, but in fact, I know their love lives on in our memories. Mom always said she would be singing alto in God's choir, and Daddy said he would be fishing. They left this earth loving each other, and I think they set the bar pretty high! Daddy would tell you to pinch someone for Valentine's Day. Mom would tell you to give someone your smile! The gift they gave me and my brothers was the love they shared. It certainly manifested in this world! Happy Valentine's Day!

Donald Dale "Coach" Venable Obituary

Donald Dale "Coach" Venable, 88, passed away on February 8, 2025. Born on July 12, 1936, he was the beloved son of Don and Mildred Venable. He and his three sisters were raised in the Beaver, Oklahoma area.

From a young age, Dale had a passion for sports. Determined to make every practice, he was one of the first in town to get a gas scooter just so he could make it into town for training. He played multiple sports but truly excelled in track and earned awards and a scholarship to play college football.



After graduating high school, Dale spent two years serving in the Army before his love for athletics led him to a lifelong career in teaching and coaching. He earned a Bachelor of Science in Social Studies from Panhandle State and later obtained a Master's in Education from Southwestern Oklahoma State University. Over the course of 31 years in education, he taught history and social studies while coaching every sport. His greatest passion was always men's and women's basketball, and his impact as a coach was profound.

Dale received countless coaching awards, but what mattered most to him were the athletes he mentored. In his later years, he cherished the visits and letters from former players, who often shared how his guidance, discipline, and "Willie Bucks" philosophy—his trademark "never give up" attitude—shaped their lives.

Beyond the classroom and the court, Dale had a deep love for horse racing. Growing up around animals, he developed a lifelong passion for raising and training quarter horses and thoroughbred race horses. After taking early retirement from education, he was able to dedicate more time to his horses and was always eager to share stories, photos, and videos with anyone who showed interest (and sometimes when they didn't).

On May 10, 1985, Dale married Shirley (Parcels) Stam and gained two step-children Tyler and Tara Stam. Together they built a life in Colony, Oklahoma, where they spent over 39 wonderful years together. He took great pride in maintaining their home, ensuring there wasn't a single gopher mound in sight. Even in his later years, he was known for outworking the "young bucks" on his property.

Dale was preceded in death by his first wife, Elaine Welch, and his three children: Brad Venable, Michael Venable (Michelle), and Kathi Baker (Steve).

He is survived by his loving wife, Shirley (Parcels) Venable; stepchildren Tyler Stam (Misty) and Tara Stam; numerous grand and great grandchildren; and his sister, Kay Sinclair (Don). He is also survived by many extended family members and dear friends who were like family—too many to name but never forgotten.

Dale's legacy of dedication, perseverance, and mentorship will live on in the countless lives he touched.






SCHOOL BOARD HEARS SOLAR PRESENTATION

Hennessey Board of Education Members listened to a Zoom presentation by Brightwell Solar Company at Monday, February 10th meeting.

Brightwell Solar presented a proposal to the school board outlining a cost-saving solar energy project aimed at significantly reducing utility expenses for local schools. The plan involves installing U.S.-made solar panels on four school buildings, with a 30-year performance warranty. The project is expected to offset 67% of Hennessey's schools energy usage, cutting annual energy costs from \$117,000 to \$46,000—an immediate savings of \$61,690 per year.

During the presentation, Brightwell claimed that beyond financial benefits, the solar panels would reduce carbon emissions by 482 tons annually, protect school roofs, and withstand extreme weather conditions. Brightwell will cover all maintenance and monitoring costs with zero insurance expenses during the service period. The board asked several questions and took no action.

BAR RAID IN HENNESSEY LEADS TO INVESTIGATION

On Wednesday, February 5th, at approximately 3 p.m., the Hennessey Police Department (HPD) was called to assist agents from the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement (ABLE) Commission in executing a search warrant at Friends, a bar located at 110 W 1st St in Hennessey.



While officials have not released full details, local sources indicate that several gaming machines

were discovered inside the establishment. It remains unclear whether these machines were legal or if they were being used in violation of state gaming regulations.

Hennessey Police Chief Christian Solis and Officer Matthew Bruner were among the officers who assisted ABLE agents during the operation. Law enforcement has not disclosed if any arrests were made or if charges are pending as a result of the raid.

Multiple attempts were made to contact the ABLE Commission for further information, but as of press time, no response had been received. The investigation remains ongoing and the bar remains open.




