### **PUMPING UNIT BLOCKS HIGHWAY**

On Thursday, February 20th, at approximately 11:20 a.m., a pumping unit slid off a flatbed truck and landed across the two southbound lanes of Hwy 81 at 1340 S Main St, in front of Liberty Lift. According Hennessey the Police report, the unit was loaded and



securely strapped down, but a sheet of ice on the trailer caused it to slide off and land on the road. The truck was not owned by Liberty Lift. The southbound lanes were blocked for around 30 minutes while the pumping unit was cleared from the roadway. Both Hennessey Police and Oklahoma Highway Patrol (OHP) responded to the scene. There was minor damage to the highway, and the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) carried out the necessary repairs.



### **SMOKE INCIDENT AT AUDITORIUM**

On Tuesday, February 25, at around 11 a.m., Hennessey Fire was called to the Hennessey Auditorium at a particularly inconvenient time. The funeral service for Joyce Holder had just concluded, and attendees were leaving when a school custodian noticed a smoky haze in the seminar room and hallway, prompting a call to 911. Hennessey firefighters responded quickly, utilizing their thermal imaging camera to identify the source of the smoke as a heating unit on the roof.

### A New, Very Different Fire Truck

A unique vehicle has arrived at the Hennessey Fire Station this week, looking guite out of place among the red fire trucks. This 1990 BMY M923A2 6X6 Army truck will soon become the newest addition to the Hennessey firefighting fleet. According to Fire Chief Brandon Scott, this truck will enable firefighters to access areas that the smaller brush trucks cannot reach.

Several nearby fire departments, including Dover, Loyal, Okeene, and Drummond, also use similar former army trucks. These vehicles, with their six-wheel drive, are particularly effective in navigating rough terrain, such as riverbeds and heavily wooded areas.

Scott explained that a committee of five Hennessey firefighters including Dustin Grellner, Cris Pribyl, Jake Streck, Levi Copeland and James Matousek conducted the research and developed a plan to purchase and equip the new truck. Singer Oil generously donated their plane to fly the team to Dallas to inspect the truck before the purchase was finalized. The truck was acquired and will be outfitted using Kingfisher County Sales Tax funds, meaning no Hennessey Town funds were used for this acquisition.

The truck will be sent to Myder Fire Support Services in Chickasha, where it will be converted into an extreme brush fire truck. It is expected to be ready for service in about 90 days. Notably, the new truck will feature a 1,500-gallon water tank, which is significantly larger than the 500 gallons that the smaller trucks hold. Additionally, it will have a remote-controlled water monitor on the front and various hose sizes on the back for tackling different types of fires.

Once the outfitting is complete, the truck will be painted red, and Hennessey's Royal Signs will install the graphics.

school sweethearts.





# **DEADLINE APPROACHES**

Friday, March 7, is the last day to apply for voter registration in order to be eligible to vote in the April 1, Board of Education General Election: Cimarron School, Drummond School and Piedmont School and Municipal General Election: Town of Dover, Town of Hennessey and Town of Okarche. Kingfisher County Election Board Secretary Shawna Butts said today.

Shawna Butts said that persons who are United States Citizens, residents of Oklahoma, and at least 17 ½ years old are eligible to apply for voter registration. However, you must be at least 18 years old to vote.

Applications must be received by the County Election Board or postmarked no later than midnight, March 7. Applications postmarked after that time will be accepted, but will not be processed until after the April 1, Board of Education General Election: Cimarron School, Drummond School and Piedmont School and Municipal General Election: Town of Dover, Town of Hennessey and Town of Okarche. Applications may also be submitted to any motor vehicle agency that is also an official voter registration agency by the submission deadline. Applicants will be notified in writing when their application has been processed. Approved voters will receive a Voter Identification Card in the mail. Some may receive a letter that explains the reason or reasons the application was not approved. Shawna Butts said those who do not receive a response within 30 days of submitting their application should contact the County Election Board office immediately.

The Kingfisher County Election Board reminds voters that applications must be approved by the County Election Board Secretary in order to vote. Registered voters who have moved to Kingfisher County from a different county or state will need to complete a new Voter Registration Application in order to be eligible for elections in Kingfisher County. If you have moved within the county and need to update your address, you may make changes online using the OK Voter Portal at oklahoma. gov/elections/ovp or complete a Voter Registration Application.

Voter Registration Applications can be downloaded from the State Election Board website at oklahoma.gov/elections. You may also complete a form at your County Election Board. Most post offices, tag agencies, and public libraries have applications available upon request. The Kingfisher County Election Board is located at 101 S Main St., Rm#8 and is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.
