AREA FOR THE FIRST TIME IN 11 YEARS!

The Lady Eagles competed against Oklahoma Christian School in the regional consolation championship, vying for a spot in the area tournament Saturday, March 1. This was their first opportunity to return to the area tournament since the 2013-2014 season. The Lady Eagles quickly took control, jumping to a 7-0 lead early in the game and preventing any baskets from the Saints for most of the first quarter. As Oklahoma Christian School found their offensive rhythm, the Eagles effectively responded with counterplays, maintaining their lead.

In the second quarter, OCS managed to hit a three-pointer and momentarily take the lead. However, after a basket from Hennessey, they were unable to regain the lead for the rest of the game. Katie Kennedy and Emma Copeland both scored in double digits, helping secure their advancement to the area tournament.

The first half ended with the score at its closest point, a narrow 20-18 lead for the Eagles. From that point on, the girls never allowed OCS back into the game, thanks to solid defense and consistent free-throw shooting. This victory also marked the Lady Eagles' first 20-win season since the 2013-2014 campaign, with a final score of 45-34. 





VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE APPROACHES

Friday, March 7, is the last day to apply for voter registration in order to be eligible to vote in the April 1, Board of Education General Election: Cimarron School, Drummond School and Piedmont School and Municipal General Election: Town of Dover, Town of Hennessey and Town of Okarche, Kingfisher County Election Board Secretary Shawna Butts said today.

Shawna Butts said that persons who are United States Citizens, residents of Oklahoma, and at least 17 1/2 years old are eligible to apply for voter registration. However, you must be at least 18 years old to vote.

Applications must be received by the County Election Board or postmarked no later than midnight, March 7. Applications postmarked after that time will be accepted, but will not be processed until after the April 1, Board of Education General Election: Cimarron School, Drummond School and Piedmont School and Municipal General Election: Town of Dover, Town of Hennessey and Town of Okarche. Applications may also be submitted to any motor vehicle agency that is also an official voter registration agency by the submission deadline.

Applicants will be notified in writing when their application has been processed. Approved voters will receive a Voter Identification Card in the mail. Some may receive a letter that explains the reason or reasons the application was not approved. Shawna Butts said those who do not receive a response within 30 days of submitting their application should contact the County Election Board office immediately.

The Kingfisher County Election Board reminds voters that applications must be approved by the County Election Board Secretary in order to vote. Registered voters who have moved to Kingfisher County from a different county or state will need to complete a new Voter Registration Application in order to be eligible for elections in Kingfisher County. If you have moved within the county and need to update your address, you may make changes online using the OK Voter Portal at oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp or complete a Voter Registration Application.

Voter Registration Applications can downloaded from the State Election Board website at oklahoma.gov/elections. You may also complete a form at your County Election Board. Most post offices, tag agencies, and public libraries have applications available upon request. The Kingfisher County Election Board is located at 101 S Main St., Rm#8 and is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. 

From the Pulpit ~ First Baptist Church

So I was in my quiet time, reading the book of 3 John. John outlived the other apostles and wrote letters to churches and people late in the first century, 50-60 years after Jesus ascended in to heaven. The book of 3 John is a letter that he wrote to a dear friend and faithful brother named Gaius. whom he encouraged to continue in godliness and love.





"I have written something to the church, but Diotrephes, who likes to put himself first, does not acknowledge our authority. So if I come, I will bring up what he is doing, talking wicked nonsense against us. And not content with that, he refuses to welcome the brothers, and also stops those who want to and puts them out of the church."

That sounds like some pretty hateful and hurtful actions going on in one of the churches during the lifetime of the apostles. A lot of people think that hateful and hurtful actions are a problem that happens today, but the first Christians didn't have. We read about the unity and spiritual power they shared in the book of Acts and somehow think that they didn't have any problems. But the rest of the New Testament recounts problems in several church, even serious ones. The book of 1 John was about a church split. 1 Corinthians addressed sin and divisions in the church. And Philemon was a letter pleading for reconciliation.


The fact is, people are people. Throughout the church age, just like every age before it and in every other walk of life, there have always been people who say and do things they shouldn't. People can be rude, selfish, unloving, or even just careless and cause hurt, perhaps without even intending it. This is because we are imperfect people, living in a world that is broken by our sin.

I want to encourage you not use these failures as a reason to avoid God's house or God's people. Most of them are anxious to show you His love and encourage you. God meets with us when we gather together and He creates the ground for true unity and love. So if this word hits home for you, let love cover over a multitude of wrongs, as Peter wrote, and choose forgiveness instead of distance. And may the Spirit of God give you peace as you worship Him.





Upon returning to Newcastle, he finished his primary education; he tested high enough to go to a prep school.

After that he was conscripted to service and learned the trade of tool and die making for five years. Next, he had two years of military service where he was in the merchant marines traveling the world as an engineer on a royal British tanker ship.

After he returned to Newcastle he met and married Margaret MacDonald. They had Susan, then immigrated to Toronto Canada where two weeks later Margaret was killed in car accident. He then met and married Lilian Jordan, they have been married 60 years. In 1967 they immigrated to the United States to Seattle to work for Boeing. In 1970 they moved to San Diego California where of the places he worked was Titleist making golf clubs, where he learned his lifelong passion of golf.

In 1974 they returned to Seattle he had many cutting-edge jobs in the scientific community until he retired in 1995. They bought a home in the mountains of Washington for the summer and Yuma Az in the winter and traveled the world until 2008 when they moved to Hennessey Oklahoma to be near family. He could be found at the golf course "punishing that little ball" playing with his grandchildren, and waging war on sand burs.

His last stop was at the Hennessey care center where we thank the staff for their loving care. Fred was preceded in death by his parents and older sister. 


