

Hennessey Woman Fighting Hard After Medical Emergency

Community rallies around Susan McCartney and family during difficult time



Susan McCartney, 42, daughter of Sally McCartney, longtime owner of Keith & Sally's Café in Hennessey, is currently in intensive care following a series of serious health events that began earlier this year.

Back in February, Susan began having blurry vision, prompting a visit to a retina specialist. What started as a concern about her eyesight quickly unraveled into a complex medical diagnosis. Doctors found a detached retina, dangerously high eye pressure, and discovered that Susan had been unknowingly living with uncontrolled diabetes and high blood pressure.

She underwent several eye procedures in the weeks that followed, including a retina re-attachment, a pressure-relieving shunt, laser treatments, and injections. Though her vision began to improve, Susan was still in the healing process when she made the decision to return to work at the café on Tuesday, April 1.

Just two days later, tragedy struck.

After closing the café on Thursday evening, Susan stepped outside ahead of her mother. Moments later, Sally found her collapsed on the ground, gasping for air. Susan had gone into cardiac arrest. Sally called 911 and began CPR until emergency responders arrived. Susan's heart stopped and had to be shocked twice before stabilizing.

Doctors later discovered 90 percent blockage in a main artery and inserted a stent. Though there are other areas of blockage, those will be addressed later. To make matters worse, Susan sustained a scratched cornea from gravel during the fall.

By Friday night, she was transferred from Enid to St. Anthony's in Oklahoma City due to complications including seizures and dangerously low blood pressure. She spent several days on a ventilator in the ICU. There have been moments of hope along the way. On Sunday, April 13, Susan responded to some commands from a neurologist. The following day, she had limited responses, likely due to exhaustion from tests

Orco Service, LLC, a local and family-owned oil and gas business owned and operated by Junior and Norma Orozco for the past 16 years. and treatments. Her care team attempted to ease her off the ventilator several times, and finally succeeded in removing it on Monday, April 14. She was placed on oxygen, which she tolerated for several days until it was also removed.

Susan was briefly moved out of the ICU on Tuesday, but had to be rushed back the next day due to several setbacks, including pneumonia. She continues to struggle with regulating her blood pressure, heart rate, and blood sugar, creating a roller coaster of complications. A planned surgery to place a defibrillator has been delayed multiple times due to her condition.

Still, signs of progress remain. Susan is slowly becoming more responsive, opening her eyes more frequently, slightly moving her head, and attempting to mouth words. On Saturday, April 19, she even

managed to make a few audible sounds in an effort to talk to Sally.

"It's been one day at a time," Sally shared. "But we're incredibly thankful for everyone who's reached out, prayed, and supported us through this. The love we've felt from this community is overwhelming."

Special thanks go out to the first responders, including Dustin Monroe



and Brandon Scott, who acted quickly and helped save Susan's life in those critical first moments. A fund has been set up under the CAT Team at Community State Bank 525 N. Main Street P.O. April and May are bustling months for school children. Anyone who has raised children knows that you often find yourself running in circles. Joe is the son of Ginny and John Grellner from Okarche. I mentioned Joe in a previous story about the chuckwagon gathering. Although Joe's mom had said he was a chatterbox at home, on that particular day, he was a man of few words. Well, that quiet demeanor was about to change.

April 12th was the opening day of turkey season. Joe had been practicing with his .410 shotgun. He loves to hunt, fish, and play golf. This Saturday, his practice shooting was about to pay off. In the early hours of the morning, Joe, his dad John, and their family friend Kyle set up a turkey decoy. They had the gun in place on its stand and then they waited. As the turkey approached the decoy, BOOM! Joe pulled the trigger and shot his first turkey. Then the celebration began. Joe had worked up an appetite, so the celebration continued at the Sunrise Cafe in Kingfisher. The cafe was bustling with many early morning hunters. Joe had an audience to share his adventure with, and he didn't hold back.

This story takes me back to my own hunting adventures with my dad. Daddy didn't hunt turkeys; he was an avid quail hunter. He never took me with a group, but I'd get to go afterwards. I had to stand right behind Daddy, placing my hands in his back pockets. He always knew where I was. My dad spent summers training his bird dogs to hold point and retrieve quail. I can still hear him saying "Biiiirrrd" in a low, calm voice as he sat for hours in our backyard, casting quail feathers attached to a fishing pole. He would drag them across the yard, watching his dog follow and hold point.

My mom once gave me some advice about hunting. She told me never to learn to clean quail or fish. I never saw her take part in the cleaning process, but she could cook up whatever game was brought home. My four-year-old buddy is just beginning to create those kinds of memories. Next on his list is t-ball, which to me is better than Saturday morning cartoons. In the adventures to come, he will pass a mount of turkey feathers on his wall. He will probably have his tongue stuck out, which he is known to do when concentrating, and tell his story of shooting his first turkey. Good job, Joe!


RAIN? COLD? PFFT. NOT EVEN CLOSE TO STOPPING HENNESSEY
