SHELLEY BURCH APPOINTED HENNESSEY TOWN CLERK



The Hennessey Board of Trustees appointed longtime town employee Shelley Burch as the new town clerk during its regular meeting on Thursday, June 13th. Burch fills the position left vacant by Kelley Vaverka's resignation and will serve the remainder of the unexpired term. Vaverka, the former Clerk, was recently elected as the Treasurer, leaving the Clerk position vacant.

Burch brings a wealth of experience to the role, currently serving as the Town Hall office manager,

court clerk, and code enforcement officer. She has worked for the Town of Hennessey for the past 12 years and served as treasurer from 2021 until May of this year.

In other business, the board voted to officially compensate Deputy Town Clerk Kati Walters, who has served in the role for several years without pay. Trustee members praised Walters for her dedication, noting that she often stepped in to assist during meetings and perform essential duties, including signing checks and attending special sessions, frequently during her personal time or work hours at another job.

Trustee Bert Gritz said, "I feel like we need to establish a rate of pay and compensate her." Walters spoke briefly, sharing that she had attended a recent budget hearing from 8 a.m. to 10:15 a.m. without compensation, both from the town and her regular employer.

Wheat Harvest Delayed Again

The 2025 wheat harvest was expected to finally get underway last Friday, June 14th, as weather conditions looked promising. Scotty Hajek and his crew began cutting that afternoon on the north end of town, with several combines rolling. Other harvest crews were also spotted across northern Kingfisher County.

However, the momentum was short-lived. Rain returned early Saturday morning, and again on Sunday, bringing the harvest to a halt once again. Muddy fields and high humidity have continued to plague the start of harvest season, pushing progress further into June.

LATE-NIGHT STORMS CAUSE DAMAGE IN HENNESSEY AREA

Heavy thunderstorms swept through the Hennessey area early Sunday morning, June 15th, bringing strong winds and torrential rain that caused damage in the northeast part of town.

At approximately 3:25 a.m., the National Weather Service issued a Severe Thunderstorm Warning for northern Kingfisher County. Shortly after, reports of storm-related damage began to come in. At 525 N. Oak, a large tree broke off and fell, narrowly missing the home. Fortunately, no injuries were reported.

A commercial building located at 416 E. Jack Choate Avenue (Highway 51), owned by Mike and Megan Wren, sustained significant damage when high winds peeled back a portion of the roof. Little Eagles Win EJRT Tournament in Walk-Off Fashion Thanks to Luca Martinez Clutch Hit

The 6U Little Eagles capped off a stellar season with a walk-off victory to claim the EJRT Postseason Tournament Championship in Enid. Finishing league play with a strong 7-3 record, the Little Eagles soared through the postseason undefeated, bringing home gold on Saturday, June 14.

Their season began with a runner-up finish in the preseason tournament on March 23 and ended on a high note as champions. Over the course of the regular season, the team racked up an impressive 179 runs, adding another 58 in the postseason tournament alone.

Four players stood out at the plate throughout the season, each finishing with a batting average over .950: Kinzlie Nelson, Olive Cassel, Makenna McFeeters, and Blaire Lott. Kinzlie led the team in hits with 44, Makenna crushed 2 home runs, and Olive tallied a team-best 7 doubles.

The postseason tournament was full of energy, drawing attention from fans on surrounding fields. The action began with a 20-16 win over the WolfPack to advance in the winner's bracket. The Little Eagles then faced the top-seeded Honeybadgers, holding them to just 6 runs and securing a dominant 19-6 win. Defensive highlights included Kinzlie Nelson recording 6 putouts and an assist from the pitcher's mound, Aliah Hernandez making 3 sliding outs at shortstop, and Makenna McFeeters locking down first base with key stretches and digs.

In the championship rematch against the WolfPack, emotions ran high. With the game tied 18-18 going into the bottom of the fourth, the Little Eagles had the last at-bat. Jessica Perez led off with a single, followed by a hard-hit single from Olive Cassel. With runners on the corners, Luisa "Luca" Martinez stepped up and delivered a clutch double to walk it off and crown the Little Eagles tournament champions.

The Little Eagles will return to the diamond on June 22, hoping to add another ring to their growing collection.

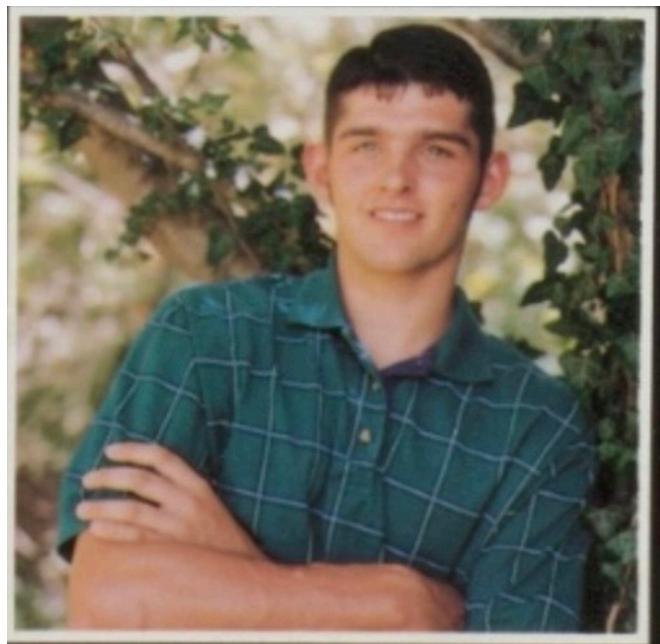

Here Fishy, Fishy

Summer at my parents' house during their retirement years meant one thing: fishing! They would load up their fifth wheel and head to the Canadian campgrounds at Canton Lake. My boys loved spending time at the lake with PaPa and Granny. It was a time for fishing, feeding squirrels, and plenty of exploring. My parents would volunteer to clean up limbs and paint the facilities. After their volunteer work was done, it was time to fish.

My dad fished for crappie and seemed to know exactly where to find them in the lake. He also ran jug lines, and there are stories my brothers will tell you about not wanting to mess with his jug lines. There are tales we still laugh about, but I probably shouldn't share all of them! If you were at the Canadian campgrounds, you could often hear my dad, his sidekick Bob, and the camp's mascot, Floppy the basset hound, who was smarter than most humans, coming across the lake.

Floppy had his place in the front of the boat, ears flying back in the wind, barking and sounding the alarm as they approached the shore. Floppy was louder than any foghorn and even had his own life jacket, which Bob complained cost more than any human's! Floppy ruled the camp; when he barked, humans listened and obeyed his commands.

I have plenty of Floppy stories, but today we're focusing on fishing. My parents had a small box freezer they kept in the pickup bed. When it was full of crappie, they would drive home to transfer the fish to the big freezer, ensuring nothing went to waste. Daddy donated fish to various groups holding fish fries, and we always had our share to eat.



One notable fish fry my parents hosted had Mom going around the neighborhood inviting everyone to come share the fish. Not only did she have fish thawing out in her bathtub, but she also recruited some neighbors' bathtubs for the same purpose. We counted 250 people at one time in their front yard, despite a misty rain falling. Everybody lined up under the eaves of my parents' house, enjoying every bite. I remember my fourth-grade teacher, Mrs. Fulmer, had her spot in the garage, watching the controlled chaos of cooking unfold.

Mom even had me take a plate to our friend Clayton, who strolled down the street pushing his lawnmower. She bagged up some fried fish for him to take home. Tragically, we lost Clayton a couple of weeks later in a car accident. I guess that was the last time our family saw him, and it will forever stay in my memory.

The memories of my dad fishing and the stories told are part of his legacy. One cold day in early March, Daddy was at the lake fishing with his friend Don. He decided it was time to check the prop, but when he did, he fell into the lake. Don was a bit nervous, not knowing whether to jump in after Daddy or scream for help. As Don stood there in shock, debating what to do, my dad's head bobbed up. He climbed back into the boat and changed into some dry clothes he kept on board. Then he simply kept on fishing!

When my dad passed away, it was time to decide what to put on his headstone. My mom requested a crappie fish, but the representative suggested that a bass would look better. In a determined voice, my sweet mom insisted, "He didn't fish for bass; he fished for crappie!" I'm sure my parents' headstone is the only one in the cemetery with a crappie fish on it.

My older brother inherited my dad's fishing boat. It was restored, likely spending more money than it was worth, but you can't put a price on the memories that were made in that boat and the new memories that are continuing to be made with family. As a side note, I had to call my brother to verify a couple of stories I wanted to add, and we both agreed that even though most of the characters in them have passed, it hasn't been long enough for us to write about it yet! But we had some laughs walking down memory lane. I'm just glad that boat can't take those memories away!

Major Thomas James Cain was a retired United States Air Force veteran. His career of twenty years stretched from The Cold War in the 1950's to The Vietnam War in the 1970's. He was awarded a Distinguished Flying Cross for his service.

He traveled the far corners of the World during his time in the Air Force and later as a civilian. An Australia/New Zealand trip with friends Skip and Joyce Martin was a favorite, as was a trip to Israel.

He married Coralen Marshall Murray in Hennessey on March 10, 1984. Tom and Coralen lived in Yukon, Oklahoma from 1984–1999 and were members of the United Methodist Church of the Good Shepherd and were active in Missionary Ministries. 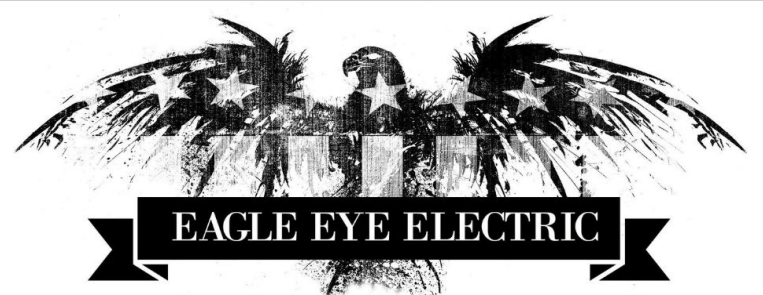

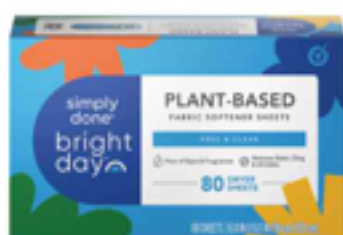

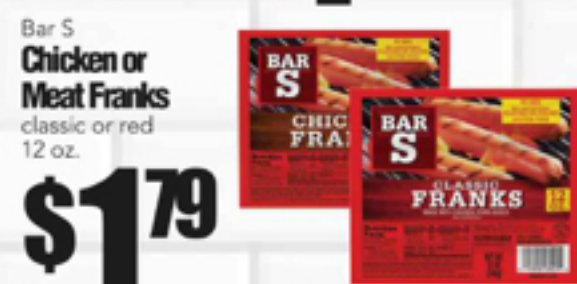
