HOMEGROWN HOSPITALITY: 4T'S CARVED OUT IT'S PLACE IN TOWN

4T's Family Market founder John Taylor discovered he liked being a grocer while working for Bill's IGA in Kingfisher. So, when one of the grocery stores in downtown Hennessey two doors down from the post office went up for sale in 1963, he bought it and set up 4T's IGA. He, his wife Bonnie, and their four young children—the 4T's: Tammy, Tim, Terry, and Tracy—relocated that summer to Hennessey. Not only did John butchered meat and stocked shelves, but he mopped floors too.

Twenty years in, 4T's strategically relocated to its current location on the eastern edge of town. At that time, it was the busiest intersection in the state: Oklahoma 51 and U.S. 81.

A shopping center was proposed across the highway where Hennessey Public Schools' ball fields are today; that plan never came to fruition. Instead, in 1986, ODOT repositioned the intersection farther west to where it is now, leaving 4T's off the beaten path.

Nevertheless, Hennessey has supported 4T's over six decades now. Tim, 66, and Terry, 65, have tirelessly worked, much like their father before them, to maintain the quality of customer service and food their customers have come to expect.

The brothers have co-owned 4T's since 1998 when John retired and moved to Oklahoma City. Shortly after assuming the reins, the Taylor boys changed wholesalers and dropped IGA from the store name, rebranding it as 4T's Discount Foods.

The Hennessey Police Department traded badges for bikes on Thursday, June 5th, during their first "Fun with the Fuzz" event held at the Hennessey First Christian Church parking lot.

Strong winds and a quick rain shower caused a few delays, but once the weather cleared, the event went on as planned.

Kids took part in hula hoop contests, sack races, throwing contests, balloon stomping, a dunk tank, bike races, and a bouncy house. A foam party added to the fun, and hot dogs were served throughout the day.

Over a dozen bikes were given away as prizes, along with free helmets.

Inside the building, a bike safety video helped kids learn a few safety tips before heading out to ride provided by Oklahoma Farm Bureau.

"This was all about giving back to the kids," said Chief Solis. "We wanted to show we're part of the community."

The event was put together by officers and their families, with help from local businesses, groups, and individuals who donated time, supplies, and support.

"We couldn't have done it without the community," Solis said.

The department plans to bring the event back next year and hopes to make it a yearly tradition.

THREE DETAINED AT LOVE'S TRAVEL STOP; ONE ARRESTED, ONE HOSPITALIZED

Things got intense at the Love's on South Main Saturday night, June 7, when police were called to check out three people acting suspiciously. According to Hennessey Police reports, two of them allegedly went into the men's restroom together, while another kept circling the parking lot.

Officer Robert Cancemi with the Hennessey Police Department pulled into the lot around 8:45 p.m. and quickly spotted the vehicle in question, a silver Nissan; He blocked it in and identified the driver as Autumn Pitts of Enid. Outside the car, a man and woman appeared to be arguing. When the man saw police, he ducked back into the store.



More backup arrived from the Kingfisher County Sheriff's Office, and the man, later identified as Christian Easter, from Enid, was taken into custody after officers discovered he had an outstanding warrant out of Garfield County.

Inside the store, employees told officers that Christian and another woman, Mali Slater, had both gone into the men's room. Later, Christian reappeared without a shirt and went into the women's room. A search of the restrooms turned up two pieces of foil, one with a burnt residue and another containing white powder that field-tested positive for fentanyl. Deputies seized the drugs.

While Officer Cancemi was speaking with Pitts, she suddenly became unresponsive and suffered a series of three seizures. Officers administered multiple doses of Narcan until EMS arrived and transported her to Saint Mary's Hospital in Enid. The investigation is ongoing.

"Being in my hometown is the best reward," Tim said. "We've always lived here, graduated from here, invested our lives here."

His open-air office is located right next to the checkout stands. Many patrons will stop and talk with him, wave at him, or haggle with him about products they want to see in the store.

"They know us and they trust us," Tim said. "They've known me all my life and are genuinely glad we're still here."

John returned to Hennessey in 2013, and while technically retired, the 86-year-old helps his sons with the weekly ads.

They try to source locally, like buying Hansen's Eggs from Hitchcock and stocking Hennessey's own "Turner Me On" wines. 4T's also carries Certified Hereford Beef, an alliance of local Hereford ranchers including fourth-generation Hennessey rancher Cindy Pribil. Beginning in 2019, 4T's began partnering with the Hennessey Public Library to provide the pumpkins for the library's annual fall fundraising pumpkin patch.

"Our personal touch is what sets us apart," Tim said.

LOWEST STRAWBERRY MOON UNTIL 2043 ROSE TUESDAY NIGHT

If you looked up Tuesday night, you might have caught a rare sight: the lowest full moon we'll see until 2043.

The Strawberry Moon rose on Tuesday, June 10 and reached its full phase at 3:44 a.m. this morning Wednesday, June 11. But the real show was at sunset Tuesday, when the moon skimmed the southern horizon in a dramatic display.



This unusually low moonrise was caused by the effect of a major lunar standstill, a phenomenon that only happens every 18.6 years. It gave the moon a shallow angle in the sky, creating a striking visual against the landscape.

Despite its name, the Strawberry Moon didn't turn pink, but it did glow with a soft, warm tone as it hovered low near the horizon. The name comes from Native American traditions that tied the June full moon to the peak of strawberry harvest season.

Local skywatchers suggested heading to open areas with a clear southern view no telescope needed, just a good spot and a few minutes to take it all in.

If you missed it, you'll have to wait until June 2043 to catch the next one this low in the sky.

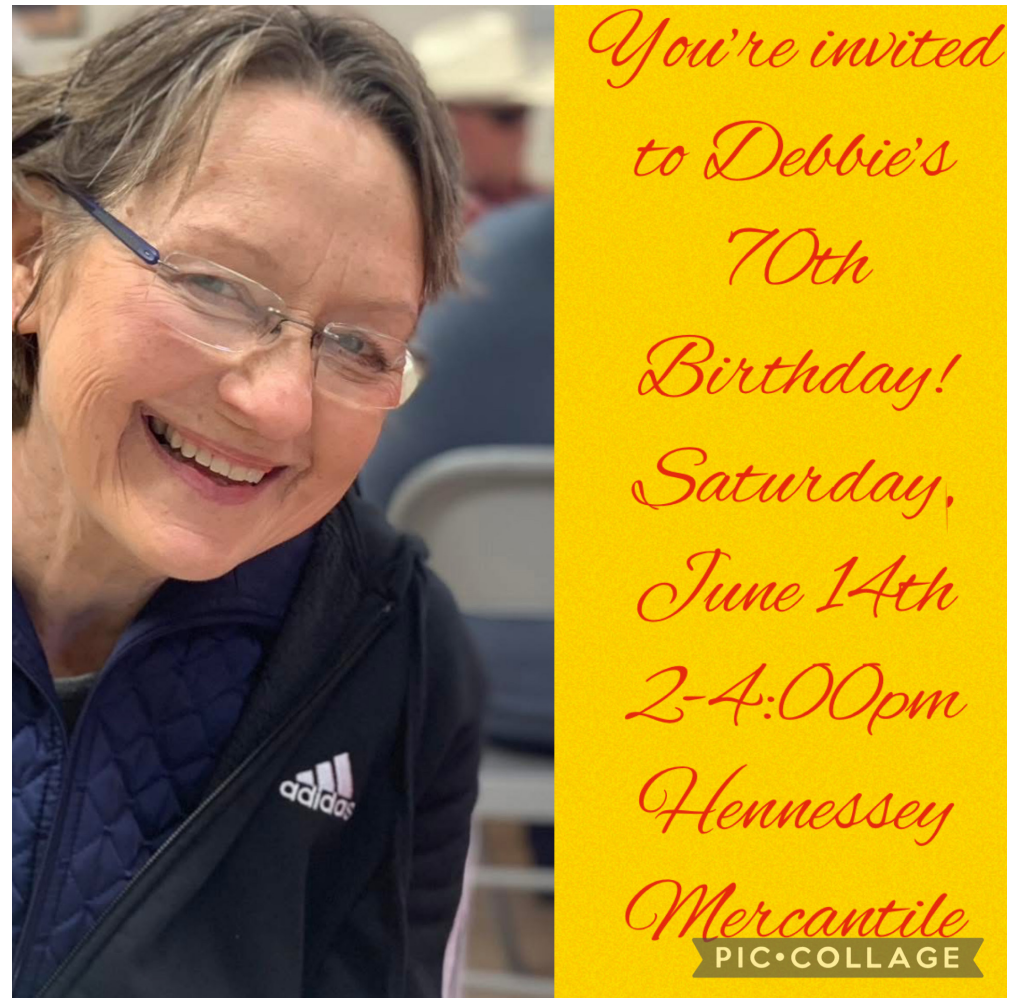

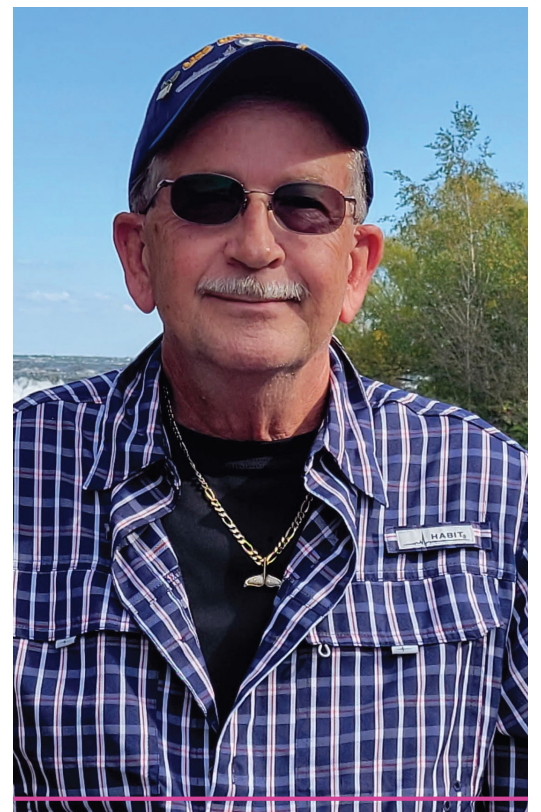

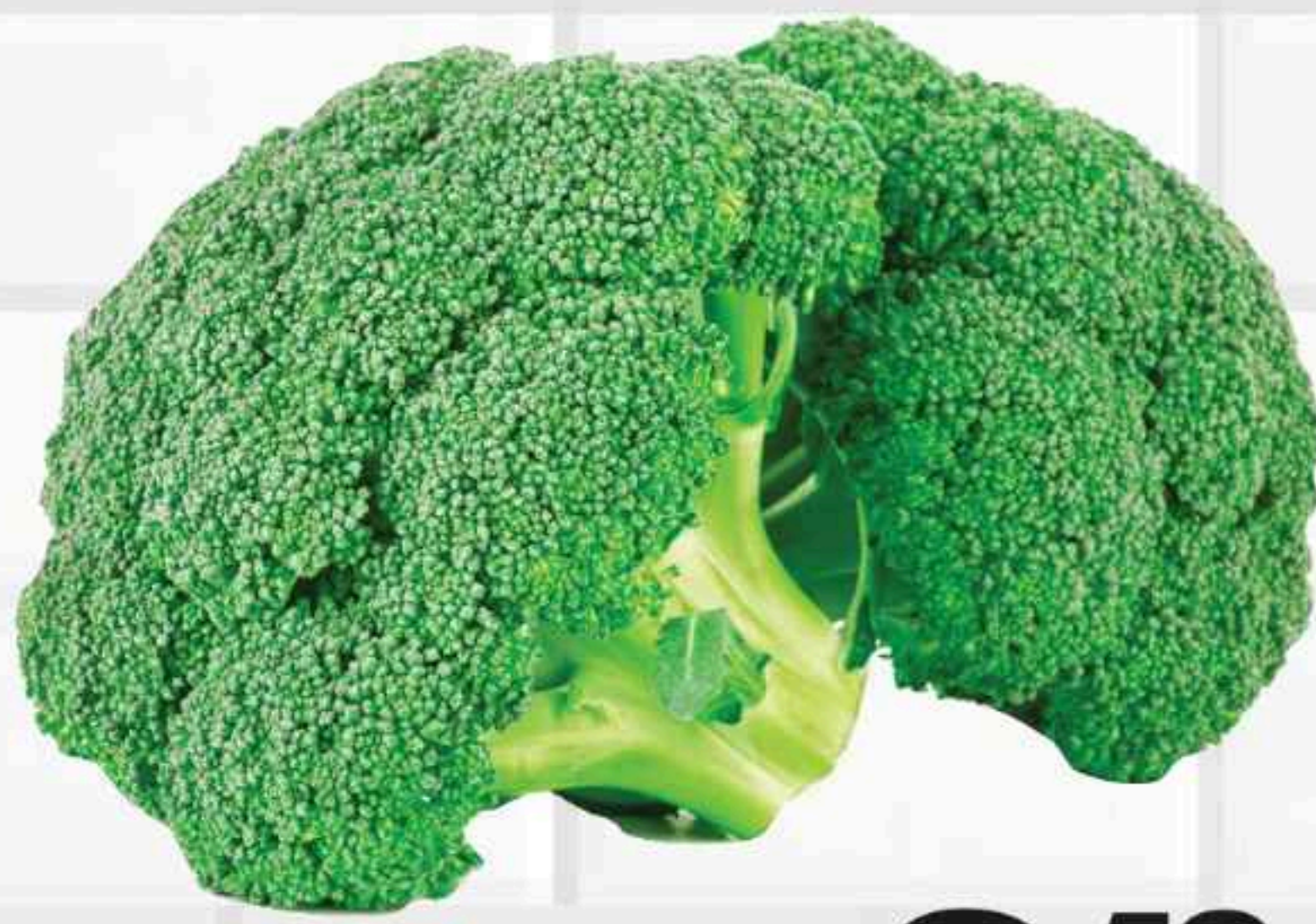
