

HENNESSEY SCHOOL BOARD EYES FUTURE BOND ISSUE FOR FACILITY UPGRADES



Community input sought as "The Dome" nears payoff.

At its regular meeting on July 14th, the Hennessey Board of Education began early discussions about a possible new bond issue that could fund facility upgrades across the district once the Eagle Event Center, known as "The Dome", is paid off.

Superintendent Jason Sternberger informed board members that the district's net assessed valuation has grown faster than expected in recent years. This growth has allowed the district to make accelerated payments on existing bonds while maintaining the current millage rate, potentially opening the door to a new small bond issue without increasing the tax burden on residents.

Several project ideas were presented, with a focus on athletic facilities. Among the top priorities mentioned were a new softball locker room, additional locker rooms and restrooms, and a redesign of the baseball area. Storage and dressing room needs were also highlighted as ongoing concerns.

Sternberger stressed the importance of community involvement before moving forward. "We want to hear from the public," he said. "We need to know what projects they see as important and what they would support."

No official decisions have been made, but the board is expected to continue exploring options and gathering feedback in the coming months.

2025 WHEAT HARVEST CHALLENGES

This year's wheat harvest, which officially began on May 23rd, has been unusually difficult and drawn out due to persistent rains. Although the first load was delivered on June 10th, storms on July 3rd, 6th, and 8th created major delays. Normally, a 3-4 week process, the harvest stretched well beyond two months, with muddy conditions and rampant weeds forcing some farmers to spray twice before cutting. As of Monday, two farmers are still finishing up, one battling through mud holes.

Debbie Gaither at CHS in Hennessey stated that the crop quality this year was mixed, ranging from poor to decent depending on the field. Test weights varied from 53 to 62 pounds, with later cuts falling around 55, below the preferred 60+. Protein content also fluctuated between 8.2% and 14%. Yields were mostly below the desired 50 bushels per acre.

So far, 297,000 bushels have been received as of Monday at the CHS Elevator in Hennessey, putting 2025 in the "okay" category. For comparison: 433,980 bushels came in 2023, 127,000 in 2022, and 674,000 in 2016. In a good year with ideal weather, harvests can top 400,000 bushels in just one month, as seen in 2020.

Hennessey Schools are thrilled to welcome these talented educators to their team and look forward to the positive impact they will have on the students and the community.




