This past weekend was one for the books in Hennessey, something the town has never quite seen before. Race cars, car show, and fireworks! (Check out related articles for details on each.)

Events of this scale usually take a year or more to plan, but thanks to Hennessey's incredible volunteers, this one came together in just a few short months.



In the past, the Cruisin Oklahoma car shows, led by Hennessey's own Tony Blackburn, brought hundreds of cars and spectators to town. This year, Tony stepped back due to other commitments, prompting several community leaders to step in to keep the tradition alive.

A planning meeting was held on March 4th at the All About Hennessey office. Since spring was too soon to organize, June 29th was selected, and the event was rebranded as the Hennessey Rev Up and Roll Out Car, Truck, and Bike Expo.

Committees quickly formed to handle every aspect, traffic and parking, vendors, special vehicles, the burnout and go-stop-go races, and marketing.

Then came a curveball from Mother Nature. Rain delayed the wheat harvest, meaning the grain elevator had to stay open, right where

Last Saturday night, June 28th, Hennessey turned up in a big way to see what all the buzz was about at the rodeo grounds! The grandstands were packed with hundreds of fans who came out to watch nearly 100 lightning-fast go-karts tear up the dirt.



Outlaw Motorsports, the event operator, arrived a few days earlier and quickly transformed the Hennessey Rodeo Arena into a high-banked dirt track. It looked like an army of ants at work as they installed safety barricades, a status light system, a flagman's platform, computerized timing systems, and more.

The pit area resembled a mini-NASCAR event, with families from all over the region rolling in with full racecar transport rigs. The newly expanded parking area, built by Kingfisher County District 2, was packed and put to good use.

Drivers of all ages, boys, girls, men, and women hit the track, all racing for bragging rights and big prize money at Hennessey's first-ever professional dirt track go-kart race.

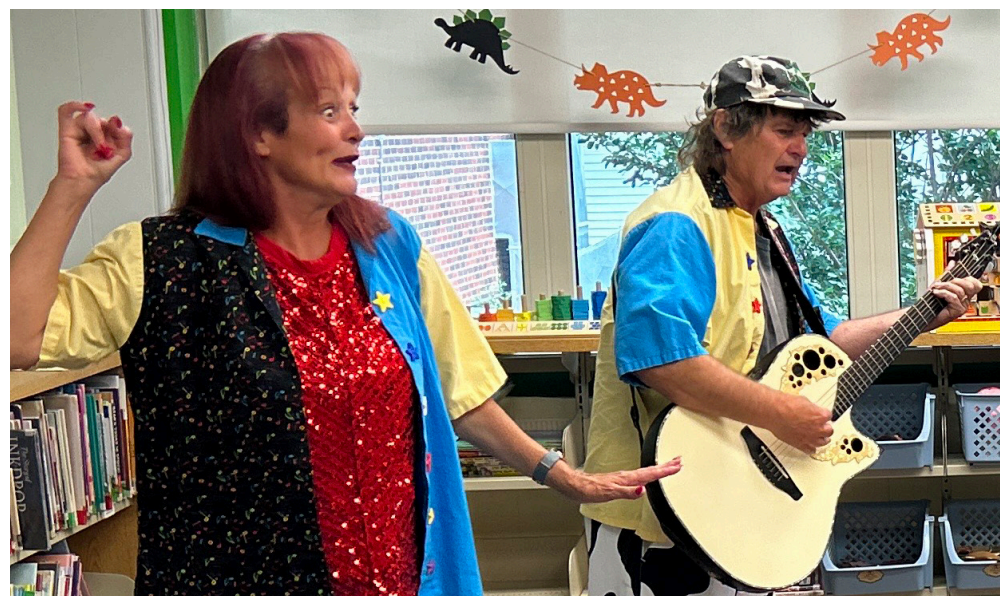

**COUNTY HOSTS STORM SHELTER REBATE MEETING
FOR KINGFISHER RESIDENTS REBATES AVAILABLE
FOR UP TO 150 SHELTERS ACROSS THE COUNTY**

A large crowd gathered at the Kingfisher County Fairgrounds on Tuesday, June 24, to learn about a rare and potentially life-saving opportunity, the Storm Shelter Rebate Program. The meeting, hosted by Kingfisher County Emergency Management, was mandatory for those interested in applying for FEMA-backed rebate funding.

Ryan Deatherage, Kingfisher County Emergency Manager, and Melissa Moore, Hazard Mitigation Specialist with the State of Oklahoma, led the presentation. They walked residents through the rebate application process, eligibility guidelines, and the key rules involved in participating.

The program offers a rebate covering 75 % of the cost of an approved storm shelter, up to \$3,000, leaving homeowners responsible for the remaining 25%. To qualify, applicants must be legal homeowners and must install the shelter within 100 feet of their home's foundation. Homes located in floodplains require shelters to be installed outside those zones to meet eligibility.

Applications are categorized into two groups: primary and alternate. Primary recipients can proceed with installation right away. Alternates will be moved up if a primary applicant withdraws or becomes ineligible. Additionally, permits are required for those living within the city limits of Kingfisher, Hennessey, Okarche, and Cashion.

While the program does not promote specific vendors, officials strongly encouraged applicants to get at least three quotes before making a decision. All shelters must meet FEMA ICC 500-2014 standards and pass debris impact testing to be approved. Only traceable payment methods are accepted, cash payments are not eligible for reimbursement, and participants must submit proof of payment.

Deatherage noted that participants should expect a reimbursement timeline of up to 120 days after submission of documentation. Before leaving the meeting, attendees were required to sign a form confirming their understanding of the program terms.

Officials emphasized the importance of acting quickly and selecting quality shelters, pointing out that opportunities like this don't come often. With only 150 rebates available, demand is expected to be high.

On the afternoon of June 23, an officer with the Hennessey Police Department responded to a call about a pole being removed from the ground at a home on West 7th. The resident said the pole marked their property line and they were upset it had been dug up.

The officer spoke with the person who moved it, who said they didn't realize the pole had any importance and thought they were just doing a favor. They offered to put it back and asked the resident to reach out so they could make it right. The resident requested a report be filed, and the officer left the scene shortly after.

On the evening of June 25, a Hennessey Police officer was monitoring traffic at the intersection of Highways 81 and 51 when a gray Chevrolet van caught their attention due to an expired January 2025 tag. After confirming the tag was indeed expired, the officer initiated a traffic stop.

The driver, who didn't speak English, indicated through a translator that he didn't have a driver's license and was in the country illegally. A records check confirmed he had no valid license in Oklahoma, Kansas, or Texas.

The driver was asked to exit the vehicle and was searched before being taken into custody for driving without a license and failure to pay taxes due to the state. The van had five adult male occupants, none of whom had a valid license, and with the vehicle tag being five months out of date, it was impounded.

An inventory was completed, and the vehicle was towed. The driver was transported to the Kingfisher County Jail, booked, and the officer returned to patrol duty.

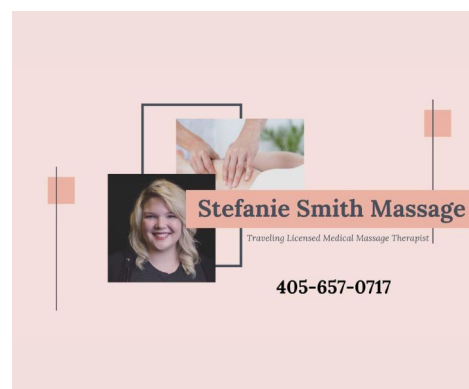

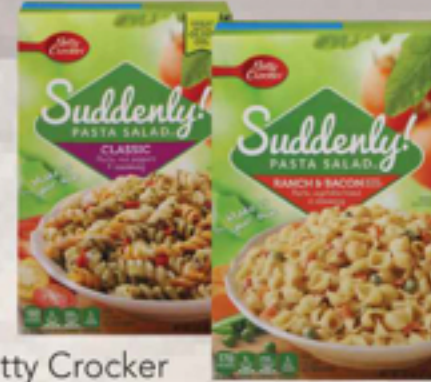
