THE PERFECT SHOT!

Back in the 1970s, basketball was a significant event in Kingfisher County. People would fill local gyms to watch their favorite teams compete on the court. Most games were recorded, allowing fans to relive the action later. One memorable game involved Hennessey during the district playoffs, which went into four overtimes. For years, the players believed that the video of that remarkable game was lost. Recently, after one of the players lost her mother, several teammates gathered to help her sift through years of memorabilia. They came across a reel labeled "4 overtimes." The discovery brought forth screams and tears of joy as they celebrated a moment from their high school careers that they thought had been lost forever.




Fast forward to the 1990s at Kingfisher High School, where Levi Ellyson, the son of Jimmy and Glenda Ellyson, was a sophomore. Like many young men, Levi struggled academically. He enrolled in a photography class taught by Dr. Johnson. Levi began helping his underclassmen in a multimedia class and spent his time at sporting events capturing memories, later working in the darkroom to develop the photos. After high school, he pursued photography further at the OSU Institute of Technology in Okmulgee, Oklahoma. Upon graduating, Levi worked for Blunk Studios, traveling across the state to photograph students. He built an impressive resume and portfolio.

After several months, Levi decided to make a big move to Las Vegas, where he lived with family to advance his photography career. In 2011, he established 501 Studios. Levi shared stories about working with celebrities like Clint Eastwood and how he refined his photo shoots for commercial businesses. Throughout our conversation, he emphasized the importance of his team, attributing his ability to capture perfect shots to their collaboration. He recounted thrilling experiences, including hanging out of helicopters and C-130 planes, which reminded me of a scene from a Mission Impossible movie with Tom Cruise.

I asked Levi what advice he would give to the next generation of photographers. He stressed the importance of education and explained that fine-tuning people skills is equally vital. He mentioned the need to direct subjects and take control of the shoot while also ensuring that everyone involved has fun, as this enjoyment will shine through in the final work. Although Levi and his team have received numerous awards, he particularly noted winning Best Architectural Photography in Nevada for four consecutive years. We discussed how photography has evolved from spending hours in a darkroom to using small drones today.

I also reached out to Levi's mentor, Dr. Johnson, at Kingfisher High School for a comment. He responded that despite facing challenges, Levi worked diligently to overcome obstacles and honed his skills through advanced training, leading him to become the professional photographer he is today.

You may spot the next generation of photographers from Dr. Johnson's class throughout the school year. Their photos could become treasured artifacts, placed in a time capsule to be discovered and appreciated many years from now. For someone, these images will serve as cherished memories of fleeting moments in time. I'd like to thank Levi for our insightful phone conversation and wish him continued success in his team's pursuit of the perfect shot!




Where are they now?


Laryn was preceded in death by her brother Bradyn Fuksa, her maternal grandfather Don Cosper, and paternal grandmother Ruth Fuksa.



COUNTY ROAD IMPROVEMENTS UNDER-WAY SOUTHEAST OF HENNESSEY

Kingfisher County District 2 crews were hard at work Thursday, July 24, near the intersection of E680 Road and N2900 Road, southeast of Hennessey, tackling a persistent problem: dust and rocks kicked up by passing traffic on white limestone roads.

County Commissioner Mike Sparks explained that the white limestone commonly used in the area creates a significant nuisance for nearby residents. "When trucks go by, they kick up a great deal of white dust and rocks," Sparks said. "Houses get completely dusted, and the yards end up full of rocks."

To address the issue, Sparks' crew is laying down milled asphalt in residential areas to help keep the dust under control. This asphalt, recycled from road resurfacing projects, is a cost-effective solution that offers better dust suppression than limestone.

"We're going the extra mile with this to make sure it lays down properly and stays smooth," said Sparks. After grading the surface, crews are applying water, compacting it with a vibrating roller, and then watering it again to ensure proper settling.
