GARAGE SALE WEEKEND BRINGS TREASURE HUNTERS TO HENNESSEY

The 15th Annual Hennessey United Town-Wide Garage Sale turned quiet streets into bargain battlegrounds on Saturday, September 20th, as hundreds of shoppers descended in search of treasure (and probably a few things they didn't even know they needed).

Traffic jams, normally rarer than a winning lottery ticket in Hennessey, suddenly became the norm, with cars wedged into every available spot. Residents dug deep, clearing closets, garages, and even that dreaded "junk drawer" and proudly displaying their finds on lawns and driveways.

New this year was the Hennessey Mercantile's Main Street Market, giving out-of-towners a chance to join the fun by setting up along W. Oklahoma Street. Before sunrise, eager shoppers were already circling like hawks, waiting for the deals to drop.

With Discover Hennessey's interactive map in hand, bargain hunters navigated to 53 sales scattered around town. Coordinated by Renee Curry, the map sales raised funds for Hennessey United.

Several Kingfisher County Roads Completed, More Projects Underway

Kingfisher County District 2 Commissioner Mike Sparks announced Friday, September 19, that several long-awaited road projects are now complete and open to traffic. These include the Dover Crescent Road (E730), Beard Blacktop (E700), and Sheridan Blacktop (N2970).



Sparks said additional work is planned, including two miles of overlay from the Cimarron River Bridge into Dover. This project, part of the county's CED program, is funded 90 percent by federal and state grants, with taxpayers covering the remaining 10 percent.

The county will also launch several grinding and double-chip-seal projects, which take only a day or two of road closure compared to a month for overlays. Planned work includes a loop from Highway 81 and Conoco Road east to Mitchell Road, south to Exxon Blacktop, and back east to Highway 81. Two other projects include Cemetery Road and Exxon Blacktop north to 7th Street, and on E2840 north from Exxon Road.

Boundary Street, Dover's easternmost street, will be the final mile completed. The county also intends to repair city-owned sections such as the north half of Conoco Road and the first two blocks of Boundary Street.

Looking ahead, Sparks confirmed a new bridge is approved for Beard Blacktop, three-quarters of a mile west of Banner Road. The 2027 project will replace washed-out pipes that damaged the road years ago. Beard Blacktop will also receive new chip-sealing this fall, though traffic will be limited to one lane during the work. Photos by AAN Jack Quirk

Where are they now?

Cathy Sturgeon Howard

Cathy Sturgeon Howard was born in Enid and grew up on a family beef and dairy farm in Lacey, Oklahoma. Her parents, Jack and Midge (Craddock) Sturgeon, raised three children on the farm: Cathy, Tom, and Nora. Cathy graduated from Lacy School in 1967 and went on to attend Northwestern Oklahoma State University in Alva, where she obtained her B.S. in Elementary Education. She taught for 38 years before retiring in 2011, with her career including positions at Smith Center Public School in Kansas and Deer Creek/Lamont Public School (DCLA) in Deer Creek, Oklahoma. The last 33 years of her teaching career were spent at Dover Public School, during which time she also earned a M.S. in Educational Administration from Oklahoma State University in 1992. Cathy served as the elementary principal at Dover for several years and treasures the friendships she formed with students and parents throughout her career.

Horse racing has always been another passion of Cathy's. Coming from a long-time horse family, she has worked various jobs at racetracks across the country for over 30 years. Her most recent position was as a license clerk for the Oklahoma Horse Racing Association. After the approval of pari-mutuel racing in Oklahoma, Cathy became the first female paddock judge, serving at Midway Downs in Stroud from 1987 to 1989. She has also worked as an outrider, pony person, and hot walker.

Volunteerism plays a significant role in Cathy's life. She has been an active member of the Hennessey First Baptist Church, Hennessey United, Hennessey Friends of the Library, Kingfisher County Retired Educators Association, and the Cimarron Valley Cemetery Association. Cathy organized the Hennessey Hometown Hootenanny, which ran from 2004 to 2017. After retirement, in order to continue serving the children of the state, Cathy became a CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate). CASA volunteers are appointed by judges to advocate for the best interests of abused and neglected children in court and foster care. Cathy is also an avid traveler, having visited 46 states and six continents. She has ridden an elephant

in Thailand and a camel in the Sahara Desert. She owns and operates a "Centennial Farm" in Lacey. Undoubtedly, her most fulfilling accomplishment in life has been motherhood. She has one son, Justin Howard, who lives in the Woodward area. Cathy always has a warm smile, just like her mother did! She loves her family and neighbors and is always willing to help others. Cathy is an inspiration to many, exemplifying how to treat people with kindness and advocate for what is right. She is a beautiful person, inside and out!

- 1 can evaporated milk
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 3 eggs
- 3 tsp pumpkin pie spice
- 1 box yellow cake mix
- 1 cup (2 sticks) butter, melted
- 1 cup coarsely crushed graham crackers (or pecans)
- ½ cup toffee bits (optional)

Cool whip or vanilla ice cream, for serving

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350°F. Lightly spray a 9x13-inch pan. Mix pumpkin, evaporated milk, sugar, eggs, and pumpkin pie spice. Pour into the pan.

Sprinkle cake mix over pumpkin mixture, then top with graham crackers (or pecans) and toffee bits.

Drizzle melted butter evenly over the top.

Bake 45–50 minutes, until center is set and edges are lightly browned.

Serve warm with cool whip or vanilla ice cream.

Chalk doodles scatter across the sidewalk, a testament to afternoons spent in imagination before the rain comes and washes them away. In its clutter, charm, and constant change, the front porch holds the heartbeat of a home. It reminds us that life is not made of perfect moments, but of passing seasons and small, fleeting details- chalk that fades, bikes that rust, toys that are eventually outgrown.

Hennessey Lions Club Reports on Events

Tim Riddle, Hennessey Lions Club President, announced at the September 18th meeting that the club received \$2,500 from the Roundup Club for the rodeo concession stand. This makes the scholarship fund sufficient for eight years of scholarships at \$500 each.

The circus is scheduled for September 26. The club earns 50% on pre-sold tickets and 10% on day-of sales. Pre-sold adult tickets are \$13, increasing to \$16 on the day of; children's tickets are \$8 pre-sold but increase to \$9 on the day of the event.

A motion was passed to give a \$500 monetary donation to the Farm Bureau coat drive, which benefits Kingfisher County or potentially all 77 counties. The donation will be used to purchase new coats, particularly for little kids, where they are most needed.

The club will hold its pumpkin decorating contest again, with entries displayed at Town Hall. Participants can carve or paint pumpkins, but carved pumpkins should use battery-operated lights instead of real flames. The ultimate goal is to have enough decorated pumpkins to spread throughout businesses on Main Street.

Additionally, the business trick-or-treat event is set for October 31, from 3:00 PM to 4:30 PM, coinciding with the school's Halloween parties.

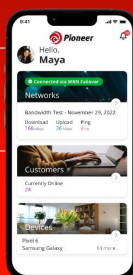
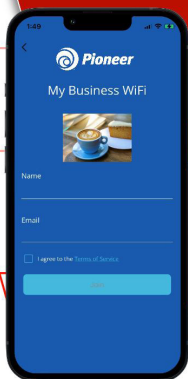
