SAVING SINCLAIR

Military History Preservation and the
Hennessey Sinclair Station Restoration

At Main and 3rd Street, Hennessey's old Sinclair station is beginning a new chapter. Once a fuel stop and repair shop, the landmark was recently sold by Richard Simunek to David Webster of Tennessee, a retired aircraft inspector with a lifelong passion for WWII history.



The Hennessey Sinclair Station is sold and will be converted into a museum.

Even the original air compressor will be revived for free tire air.

For Simunek, the sale fulfills his dream: the Sinclair station will be preserved as both a local landmark and a memorial to America's heroes. Webster's interest began at 15, inspired by the 1943 B-24 raid on Romanian oil fields. Over the years, he collected uniforms, photos, and artifacts, sharing them with veterans' groups. There, Webster became friends with Kim Hobbs. During visits to Hennessey, he admired the station's 1930s Art Deco design and saw an opportunity.

He plans to restore the 2,000-square-foot building into a living museum with rotating exhibits, mannequins in uniform, and his own restored vehicles, including a WWII jeep.

The kindergartners explored fire engines, checked out the hoses, and learned about the gear firefighters use to keep the community safe. Wide-eyed and smiling, the children got to see up close how firefighters are ready to jump into action when called.

The morning proved to be both fun and educational, leaving the Kindergartners with memories and maybe even future career dreams of serving their community in uniform.

HENNESSEY TRUSTEES APPROVE PROJECTS, HEAR TOURISM UPDATE



At the latest meeting Monday, September 9th, the Hennessey Board of Trustees approved several items and heard an update on the Discover Hennessey tourism initiative.

Pavilion Concrete Project

The board accepted a low bid from Premier Utility Services of Kingfisher to install a 5-inch concrete floor in the John Deutschendorf Memorial Pavilion. Four bids were submitted, ranging from \$34,302 to \$65,500.

Discover Hennessey Update

Jack Quirk presented an update on the Discover Hennessey project, the town's Convention and Visitors Bureau program funded through the 3% hotel-motel tax. Managed by Quirk's KJ Filmworks, the program has delivered new branding and signage across town, supported local events, and launched the Discover Hennessey website and QR code system, which draws tens of thousands of monthly views. He highlighted the pavilion project, largely built with donated services, and emphasized the program's role in boosting tourism, ensuring transparency in funding and the need for more volunteers and long-term planning.

Vehicle Purchases

Trustees also approved the purchase of two new Chevrolet Colorado pickups from Carter Chevrolet. Trustee David Jones questioned whether leasing might be a better option for public works vehicles, noting nearby towns use leases to replace vehicles every three years. Town Administrator Tiffany Rowen explained that while leasing has been used in some communities, it was often due to a lack of funds to purchase outright, and that leasing police vehicles would nearly double costs compared to buying. Jones cast the lone 'no' vote, but the motion carried.
