The first annual Hennessey Hood & Hydraulics Show bounced into town Saturday, September 13th, literally, and turned the event into a rolling car carnival.

A total of 52 cars and 9 hoppers rumbled into the show just north of 4Ts Market on Mitchell Rd. from Oklahoma, Kansas, Colorado, and Texas, each shinier and more tricked out than the last. Promoters Harold Shaw and Ashley Zielny pulled together a show like Hennessey has never seen, with rides ranging from a classic 1938 Chevrolet to lowriders so detailed they looked like rolling works of art.

But the real jaw-dropper? The hopper competition. Picture cars flinging themselves skyward like caffeinated kangaroos while officials stood by with what might be the world's biggest ruler, measuring each bounce to crown a champion. The higher the hop, the louder the crowd—and the more people wondered how those suspensions survived.

Several hundred spectators packed the area, grazing through food trucks and shopping vendors, and grooving to the DJ's playlist. Hennessey native **Ramon Renteria-Lara** spoke at the September KCREA meeting on Sept. 3, 2025, at the Kingfisher Memorial Library. Renteria-Lara, Director of Sponsorship and Sales at the Oklahoma Department of Tourism, was recently named to the list Top 40 Hispanic Leaders in Oklahoma.

He reported that Oklahoma tourism is booming, with **TravelOK.com** receiving 6–8 million hits annually, fueled by the upcoming 100th anniversary of Route 66 in **2026**. Visitors are especially drawn to murals, oversized landmarks, and towns along the route. Locally, the large metal cowboy hat north of Hennessey will soon be painted with the town's name, which Renteria-Lara predicted will become a popular photo spot. He also promoted Oklahoma's 38 state parks and urged attendees to request a Route 66 passport online.

Following his talk, KCREA

President Deborah Maehs opened the meeting. Kadavy Secretary Kathy approved read and the minutes, and Treasurer Dana Golbek reported a balance \$774.80. Membership Chair LaRita Sipe announced 21 paid memberships after mailing 67 letters to county Scholarship retirees. Cathy Howard noted that scholarships were awarded to Ashley Winans and Grace Ann Sinclair. Publicity Chair Maehs said the group's Facebook page will become public this fall. Cards and Memorials Chair Jneanne Kadavy shared updates on member outreach and condolences for the family of former superintendent C. Jack Harrel of Stillwater.

Discussion included plans for **National Education Week** in November, with a suggestion to revive the nickname "The Rockers." The next meeting will be Nov. 5, 2025, featuring **Sen. Darcy Jech** and **Rep. Mike Dobrinski.**

BIDDING BEYOND BORDERS

Chris Cameron of Lippard Real Estate & Auction has built his career on helping families, businesses, and landowners navigate one of the fastest-changing industries in Oklahoma: the auction world.

Cameron's path wasn't a straight one. He first worked in the insurance field but always carried an early fascination with auctions. Auctions that once meant setting up tents, lining out tables, and waiting on the weather now reach far wider audiences through online platforms. "We used to hope for a few hundred people at a live sale," Cameron said. "Now, we can have thousands watching and bidding from across the country." The COVID-19 pandemic only accelerated that change, making online auctions a staple rather than a supplement.

But Cameron is quick to correct one of the biggest misconceptions: that auctions are only for distressed properties or "fire sales." In reality, competitive bidding often pushes values above traditional listing prices. "Auctions create energy and urgency," he explained. "That's good for sellers—and it gives buyers a clear shot at fair market value." His advice to newcomers? Watch a few sales before jumping in, so the rhythm and pace feel familiar.

Cameron credits Lippard's team in Enid for the company's strong reputation across Oklahoma. Their adaptability, teamwork, and commitment to customer service, he said, are what keep the business thriving in a world where auctions now run year-round and rarely slow down. 




