After a full day of tasting and judging, local wineries took home top honors for their creations. The four judges, Brady Barnes, Cara Barnes, Lezlie Hardin, and Richard Bohnstedt, sampled wines from each vendor and picked winners in several categories.

In the Dry Wine category, Vernost Wine Co. claimed first place with Dagan Hardin leading the way, while Put-a-Cork-in-it Winery and Karen Clark earned a strong second.

For those with a sweet tooth, Wildhorse Canyon Farms represented by Brandon Schabew, earned first place, and Backyard Winery with Roger Smith followed closely in second.

The prestigious Curtis Turner Memorial Best of Show Award went to Wildhorse Canyon Farms, once again proving their mastery of the craft.

Mrs. Kingfisher County, Valentina Insignares, presented the honors alongside Head Judge Brooklyn Harris, who oversaw the judging process.

## COUNTERFEIT BILLS DETECTED AT LOCAL BANK

Several counterfeit ten-dollar bills were discovered this week at Community State Bank in Hennessey after the bank's automated bill checker flagged multiple deposits.

According to bank staff, the fake notes appear convincing at first glance but show clear differences under closer inspection. The discovery has prompted a reminder for businesses and residents to check their cash carefully, especially during the busy fall season.

How to spot a counterfeit:

- Use a detection marker: Genuine bills stay clear, while counterfeits turn dark brown.
- Check for a watermark: Hold the bill up to the light (for \$5 bills and larger) and look for the security portrait on the right side.

Community State Bank officials said counterfeit incidents are uncommon but not unheard of. "Our machines caught these quickly, but we always encourage customers to double-check any cash they receive," said Tim Riddle.

If you suspect you have received a counterfeit bill or have questions about currency verification, contact your bank for guidance.

## The Monarch Migration: A Fluttering Sign of Fall in Oklahoma

If you've looked up lately, you've probably seen the monarchs making their yearly migration through Oklahoma. These bright orange-and-black butterflies, delicate yet determined, are on one of the most remarkable journeys in the natural world. Every fall, millions of monarchs travel thousands of miles from Canada and the northern United States down to the mountains of central Mexico, where they spend the winter clustered together for warmth and survival.

Oklahoma sits right in the heart of their central flyway, making our skies a critical part of their journey. During September and October, it's common to spot clusters of monarchs gathering on wildflowers, trees, or even backyard gardens as they fuel up for the long trip south. Nectar sources such as goldenrod, sunflowers, and native asters provide the energy they need to complete their migration.

This annual migration isn't just beautiful, it's also important. Monarch populations have declined in recent decades due to habitat loss, pesticide use, and climate change. By planting native milkweed (the only plant monarchs lay eggs on) and nectar-rich flowers, Oklahomans can play a role in supporting these pollinators during their long journey.

The sight of monarchs filling the autumn sky is more than just a seasonal wonder - it's a reminder of resilience, connection, and the cycles of nature that tie Oklahoma to the rest of the continent. So next time you're outside, pause for a moment and watch: those fluttering wings are part of a story much bigger than our backyards.
