Hennessey Fire Department Halloween Fun


The Hennessey Fire Department will be at 1st and Main after school for the business trick or treat and then will have hot dogs and candy at the station later that evening!

HENNESSEY BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING – OCTOBER 14, 2025

The Hennessey Board of Trustees met on October 14 to address a packed agenda that included legal action against a proposed waste management facility, issues surrounding the Senior Center's operations, road and equipment updates, and community infrastructure projects.

Town to Protest Proposed Waste Management Facility



The board spent a portion of the meeting discussing an application by Centennial Solids Control LLC to develop a commercial waste management facility NE of Hennessey, located within three miles of Hennessey town limits. Because of the proximity, state law gives the town standing to formally protest the application

before the Oklahoma Corporation Commission (OCC).

The proposed site falls under regulations that restrict such facilities within three miles of towns with populations under 20,000 unless a waiver is granted. The application process seeks both operational approval and this waiver.

Citizens expressed concern about the facility's potential to handle oil-based mud, contaminated soils, high-chloride and caustic materials, amine, glycol, and other industrial waste. Of particular concern was a request for a waiver allowing "unlimited" chloride levels, exceeding the state's normal 5,000 mg/L limit. Residents also raised questions about possible odor and environmental impacts.

The board unanimously voted to hire legal counsel to protest the application and coordinate efforts with local landowners who have already retained attorney Michael Booz. The OCC hearing was scheduled for October 21, 2025, at 8:30 a.m.

DISCOVER HENNESSEY PRESENTATION

KJ FilmWorks CEO Jack Quirk presented an update on recent Discover Hennessey activities, highlighting public engagement and support for community events.

In September Discover Hennessey logged 60 hours

on community projects related to convention and visitor efforts. These included town branding, the Wine Festival, general event coordination, the Hood & Hydraulics Car Show, the Town-Wide Garage Sale, the Lions Club Circus, and continued work on the pavilion.

Quirk also noted that his other company, All About Hennessey, donated \$2,025 in free advertising during the month, bringing the year-to-date total of free advertising for local organizations and events to \$11,155.

Looking ahead, Discover Hennessey plans to secure the new pavilion floor to prevent damage and is now focusing on planning the town's upcoming Christmas activities.

Solids Control LLC to develop a commercial waste management facility NE of On Hennessey Operations

HENNESSEY – Town Administrator Tiffany Rowen provided several operational updates during her recent report to the Board of Trustees.

Rowen announced that the annual audit is currently underway.

Water Meter MXU installations are expected to be completed shortly, and repairs and repainting at the town swimming pool have been finished.

A new utility disconnection notice policy has gone into effect, requiring a 24-hour advance notice before service is disconnected.

Rowen also recognized Director of Public Works Alyssa Kubat, who recently passed her wastewater certification exam.

Three town water meters were sent for testing and were confirmed to be compliant.

Plans are also underway to provide board training on adding items to digital agendas.

Rowen said no update has been received from the state forensic auditors at this time.

HENNESSEY SENIOR CENTER OPERATIONS

During the Hennessey Board of Trustees Meeting October 14th there was a discussion focused on the Hennessey Senior Center following public complaints about management and staffing.

Town Administrator Tiffany Rowen clarified that no town employees are working at the center while on the town clock, though one may have volunteered on personal time. The Senior Center's board is currently inactive, and efforts are underway to form a new one.

Director LaVonna O'Brien, age 90, is retiring due to health concerns. Conflicting accounts were presented about her departure, with one speaker alleging she was being pressured to leave and another citing medical necessity. The cook's position also came under scrutiny amid reports of conflict and low morale.

Financially, the center is struggling, serving an average of ten people daily. To remain operational, the plan is to combine the director and cook positions into one paid role, with volunteer support from community dietitians for menu planning and purchasing. Applications are now open for the new combined position.

Board members emphasized that the town's only involvement is ownership of the building and that the center's operations remain an independent matter.



ROAD AND STREET MAINTENANCE PROJECTS

During the Hennessey Board of Trustees Meeting, October 14th several road improvement projects were discussed.

A joint town-county effort is planned to grind and double-chip seal the road from Highway 81 at Conoco Rd. south to Exxon Rd. Hennessev Town Administrator Tiffanv Rowen and District 2 County Commissioner Mike Sparks addressed how this joint work would evolve.

This work will connect with the town's existing project that includes paving a 1,700-foot Phase 1 project on S Mitchell Rd, from 7th St. To prevent overlap, the county will pave up to the 1,700-foot mark. The county will then double chip and Board Member David Jones proposed seal from the 1,700 foot mark, south to the intersection of S Mitchell Rd. and Conoco Rd.

Sparks said a separate proposal calls for paving Cemetery Rd from 7th St north to Highway 51 using a double-chip seal method.



ADDITIONAL TOWN **MEETING TOPICS:** STREET SWEEPER REPLACEMENT

The town's 25-year-old street sweeper, purchased used, is no longer operational due to extensive mechanical failures, including hydraulic and brake issues and a rusted hopper. Attempts to repair it have failed.

A new sweeper was demonstrated recently at an estimated cost of \$205,000, and a second, smaller model priced around \$130,000 will be evaluated at a future meeting. Contracted sweeping was ruled out after estimates exceeded \$5,000 per service. The issue will be revisited once demonstrations are complete.

The board agreed to gather community input through an All About Hennessey survey before making a decision.

THE SEASON THAT SHAPED ME: AN HONEST LOOK AT POSTPARTUM

When I pictured life after having a baby, I imagined soft blankets, sleepy cuddles, and quiet mornings filled with joy. And while there's truth in that picture, the reality of postpartum is far more layered- a season of beauty, exhaustion, and transformation that no one can truly prepare you for.

There's a stillness that settles in after the whirlwind of birth. Visitors go home. The congratulatory messages slow down. And suddenly, it's just you and this tiny human who needs you completely. The world feels softer, quieter, but also heavier. Postpartum is often described as a time of healing, and it is, but it's also a time of unraveling and rebuilding. Your body is recovering, your hormones are shifting, and your heart is trying to catch up. For some of us, that shift comes with more than exhaustion. It comes with anxiety, sadness, or fear we didn't expect.

If you're in that season right now, please know you're not alone. It's okay to ask for help. It's okay to talk about how you really feel. Healing takes time, and it doesn't always look pretty, but it's happening, even on the days it doesn't feel like it.

The more we share our stories, the more we remind other mothers that they are seen, that they are enough, and that this hard, beautiful season will soften with time.

Motherhood isn't about bouncing back. It's about moving forward - slowly, gently, and with grace. In the quiet moments between the chaos, that's where you'll find your strength.

And in time, you'll look back and realize: you weren't just surviving those early days- you were being shaped into a stronger version of yourself.

FIRE CIDER

"An apple a day keeps the doctor away" (source unknown). Quite possibly you have heard this saying before. Perhaps when you were young to encourage

you to eat your fruit. While it is most likely not inherently true, it implies that what we put in our bodies impacts our health. And this is undeniably true! There is much to discuss on this topic, but today we're going to tell you about Fire Cider, the health-boosting drink that has a kick! Even Martha Stewart has shared a recipe for Fire Cider.

Summer first learned about Fire Cider when she started learning more about herbs and the medicinal properties of plants. You can follow her on Instagram, TikTok, or Podcasts! She is a wealth of knowledge and a great jumping off point to help you learn.

(This isn't so much a recipe as it is a method for combining nutritious foods into one powerful tonic.)

- Fresh ginger, chopped (or dried if needed; fresh is best)
- Onion, chopped
- Fresh garlic, chopped
- Orange, chopped (unpeeled but washed)
- Lemon, chopped (unpeeled but washed)
- Jalapeño, chopped
- Turmeric
- Whole peppercorns
- Pinch of cayenne pepper
- Thyme
- Rosemary
- Oregano
- Cinnamon • Whole cloves

Prepare these ingredients and place

them into mason jars (Summer uses one large ½ gallon jar). Pour raw apple cider vinegar over all until covered. Let sit 4-6 weeks, occasionally shaking it gently. The apple cider vinegar will extract the medicinal/nutritional properties from the foods. After 4-6 weeks, strain out the liquid and save it in a jar (a dark jar is preferable.) You can add raw honey to sweeten, as desired. This Fire Cider will be shelf stable for at least a year.

To use: You can take a tablespoon every day in the winter to boost your health, or you can take it only when you feel run down or feel like you are getting sick. Give that immune system a boost! Some people even use this as a salad dressing or as a marinade. The benefits are there! This information is not intended to treat or cure medical problems. 


