HENNESSEY'S NEW EXTREME FIRE TRUCK TEAM TOMMY STRONG

The Hennessey Fire Department has added a serious piece of equipment to its fleet, a fully outfitted brush fire truck built for tough terrain and big jobs.

Delivered in February, the truck spent several months at Myder Fire Support Services in Chickasha, where it was converted from a 1990 BMV 932A2 6x6 cargo truck into an "extreme" brush rig. Kingfisher County District 2 Commissioner Mike Sparks arranged for a county crew to bring it home on October 28, noting, "Getting this equipment at no cost to the town using county tax funds is a great deal."

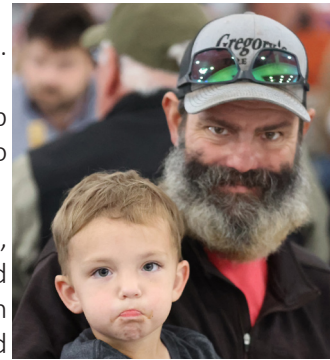
The upgraded truck features a 1,200-gallon water tank, triple the capacity of smaller brush units, a joystick-controlled remote water monitor, four front bumper nozzles, whip lines for spraying while moving, multiple booster hoses, LED lighting, sirens, and a backup camera. It was also given a fresh coat of fire-engine red paint, with graphics to be added soon by Royal Signs.

The event raised more than \$36,000, and that's before counting shirt sales, raffles, and additional donations. To say Tommy and his family are loved, would be an understatement.

Hennessey and neighboring towns have wrapped their arms around the Bohnstedts, proving once again that no one fights alone.



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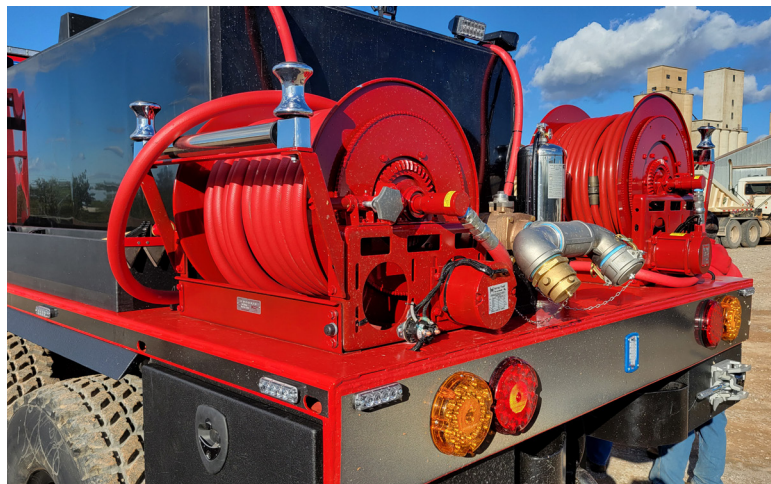

New fire truck continued

Fire Chief Brandon Scott said the six-wheel-drive truck will allow firefighters to reach areas smaller rigs can't, similar to those used by Dover, Loyal, Okeene, and Drummond departments.

A committee of firefighters, Dustin Grellner, Cris Pribyl, Jake Streck, Levi Copeland, and James Matousek, researched, inspected, and planned the build. Singer Oil played a key role, generously donating the use of their airplane to fly the team to Dallas to inspect the vehicle before purchase. In appreciation, the truck will carry the call sign "RT-22," matching the tail number of Singer Oil's plane.

The project was fully funded through Kingfisher County sales tax, with no town funds used. The new truck will be put into service soon, giving Hennessey firefighters a powerful new tool for battling brush and grass fires. Story and Photos by AAH Jack Quirk.



HELP FOR THE HENNESSEY FOOD BANK SHELVES AMID GROWING NEED

The Hennessey Food Bank, located across from the First United Methodist Church, is asking for the community's help as they work to restock their shelves for the coming months.

With recent changes and delays in the SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program), many families are finding themselves short on grocery funds. Local food banks across the region have seen an increase in demand, and Hennessey is no exception.

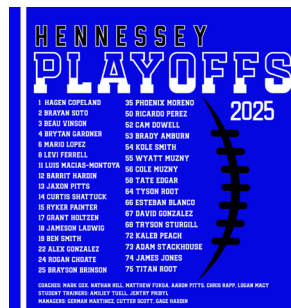
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FOOTBALL PLAYOFF FUNDRAISER

COPPER THEFT ARREST MADE IN HENNESSEY

Copper Theft Suspects Caught Thanks to OVINTIV Camera Alert

On Wednesday, October 22, 2025, between 9 and 10 a.m., the Kingfisher County Sheriff's Office responded to a theft in progress after an OVINTIV camera system alerted deputies to a red and white 1990s Ford pickup on one of the company's oil pads in northwest Kingfisher County—a vehicle previously linked to area thefts.

Before deputies arrived, OVINTIV reported a spool of copper wire, encased in green sheathing, had been stolen and was being moved. Deputies tracked the wire to a residence at 216 S. Cimarron in Hennessey, where they found the same pickup backing from the driveway.

The driver, Kory Lara, was detained after deputies spotted the stolen wire in the truck bed. OVINTIV representatives later confirmed it matched the wire taken from their site.

Deputies also discovered more copper wire inside the open garage and a woman hiding nearby. She was identified as Wendy Kuehn, wanted on three outstanding warrants, and was taken into custody.

Lara was booked into the Kingfisher County Detention Facility on charges related to theft from critical infrastructure.

The Sheriff's Office credited the quick coordination between deputies and OVINTIV's camera system for the arrests.

Both individuals are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

NEW OKLAHOMA LAW STARTS NOVEMBER 1

Heads up, Hennessey and Kingfisher — starting November 1, it's against the law to hold or use a handheld cell phone or electronic device while driving through active school zones or construction zones in Oklahoma.

What you CAN do:

- Use hands-free options like Bluetooth, Apple CarPlay, or Android Auto.
- Make emergency calls to first responders or medical personnel.

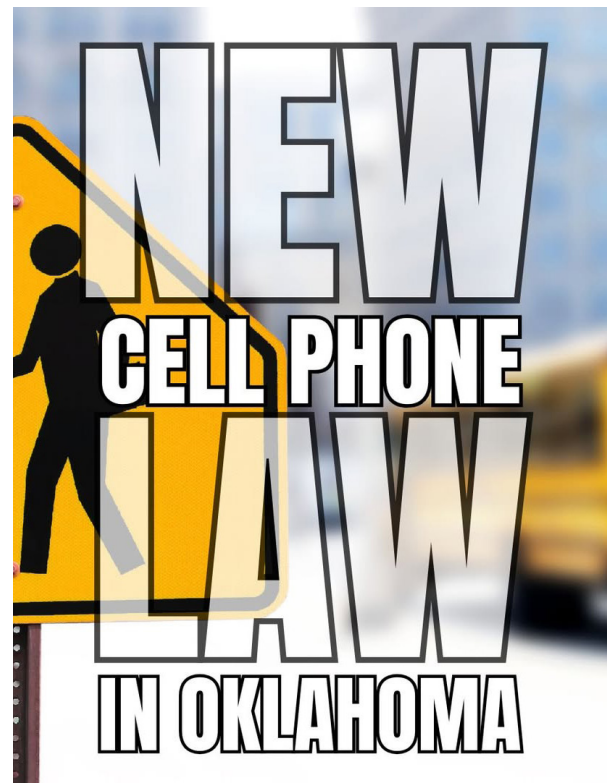
What you CANNOT do:

- Hold, touch, or scroll your phone, even for navigation, while driving through these zones.
- This only applies when the school or construction zone is active and posted.

Penalty:

- Fines up to \$100 for violations.

Stay alert and keep our roads safe for students, workers, and families.

MILES AND MILES OF NEW ROADS UNDERWAY

Kingfisher County District 2 Commissioner Mike Sparks is making good on his promise to deliver major road improvements in the Hennessey area. This week, work began on Cemetery Road, marking the start of a large-scale resurfacing project.

Crews are moving quickly, first grinding up the old asphalt, grading it smooth, and compacting it to form a new road base. After that, chip-and-seal crews follow with a sealing coat and a layer of ¾-inch stone, topped with a finer layer of smaller rock to create a durable finished surface.

Over the past several months, Sparks and his team have been working to upgrade roughly 14 miles of county roads, with about 9 miles located in and around Hennessey. Roads included in the project are Cemetery, Mitchell, Conoco, and Exxon Roads.

At times, these roads may be temporarily closed, and residents are asked to limit use to local traffic only. Work is expected to be completed, weather permitting, by November 11.

The Quiet Sound of Honor Soup Weather

Veterans Day is November 11th, and I want to personally thank those who serve — our military veterans, firefighters, and police officers. Your courage and sacrifice allow us to live free, and I'll always be indebted to you and your families.

True honor is often quiet. I've watched the guards at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier — 21 steps, 21 seconds, repeated in solemn precision. No words are spoken, yet the message is powerful.

My Navy veteran son once served in the Honor Guard at Pearl Harbor. I've seen him fold flags, salute the wall of the Arizona, and present a flag to a Vietnam veteran who never received the thanks he deserved. He also presented my mother with a flag honoring my father's Marine service — that same flag once flew over the Korean War Memorial.

Those memories came rushing back as I stood silently on Main Street in Kingfisher, watching a motorcade escort a fallen police officer. The town went still as a massive flag waved in the wind — a quiet salute felt by everyone there.

My son always says, *"Tell them thanks while they can still hear it."* So today, and every day, thank you for your service.



Soup weather on the horizon. Or maybe Crockpot weather. Let's just say both!

As we all know, the foundation of a good soup is a good broth. And of course, the best broth is homemade, and it's so easy to do! If you have an instant pot, then it's even easier. Instant pots are not required, though: you can make broth the good old-fashioned way on the stove top, just make sure that you keep the water level above the bones in the pot.

Bone broth is excellent for both the soul and the body, as it is full of collagen and good-for-you nutrients, and it's super simple to make at home. When you buy a rotisserie chicken at the grocery store for your dinner recipe, you already have what you need to start making bone broth! After you take off all the meat from that rotisserie chicken for your supper, save those bones. Or, bring home your bones from dinner at Rooster's, it's okay to be weird! Your soup will thank you when your broth is delicious and nutritious. You can also cook your own bone-in chicken at home to use the shredded meat in so many recipes, throw the bones back in the instant pot, and you are well on your way to the best fall soup starter.

Broth has long since been hailed as a healing food and is often reached for when people are sick. Take that to the next level and give your family the very best with this nutrient rich, delicious homemade broth.

Homemade Bone Broth

- reserved bones
- water to cover the bones
- 1 Tbsp apple cider vinegar
- favorite seasonings (such as Italian seasonings)
- salt (homemade broth is way less salty than store bought)
- veggies, as desired (this is where you can throw in the peelings from carrots, tops of celery, etc)

Cook this broth on high pressure soup function for 3-4 hours, allow to slow-release.

Strain the broth out and store in clean glass jars. You may pressure seal these jars if you so desire, but Summer has found that they will last for a month in the refrigerator, even without officially "canning" them.

Use your homemade broth in all your favorite recipes for a more flavorful and nutrient dense base. Just remember that you will need to add salt to your recipes to account for the fact that the homemade broth is not nearly as salty as store-bought, and most recipes are based on the assumption that you are using the store-bought variety. The apple cider vinegar that you are adding helps to draw out the collagen from inside the bones. It's so good for you!

Play around with this base recipe and see what you like.

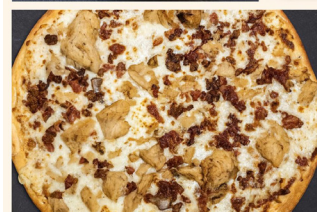
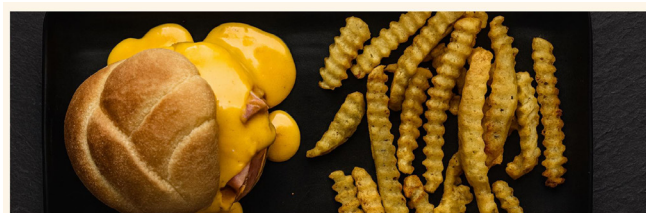
