That was evident as friends, family, and neighbors gathered to celebrate both the ribbon-cutting for **Turner Collision** and the retirements of **Bobby and Michael Wood**.

Laughter and smiles filled the air. Hugs and handshakes were exchanged. There were even jokes that this might become the town's newest coffee stop, even for those who don't drink coffee, a fitting tribute to the conversations that have always happened inside those walls. And then just like that, the ribbon was cut. And just as quickly as one chapter officially opened, another gently closed.

However, before hanging their own sign in 1981, Bobby and Michael were learning the trade at RC Chevrolet. Those early years laid the groundwork for what would become something of their own. Over the next four decades, Wood's Body Shop grew into a legacy built on skill, service, and trust.

As they step into retirement, Bobby and Michael do so with gratitude, knowing that hanging up a trade you've poured your blood, sweat, and tears into is bittersweet. A business like that becomes part of you. It shapes your days, your conversations, even your identity. Some things, however, won't change.

### HENNESSEY TRUSTEES APPROVE ROAD FUNDING, EMPLOYEE POLICY UPDATES

The Hennessey Board of Trustees met Tuesday, February 10, 2026, at Town Hall, approving several financial and policy items, including major funding for road improvements and updates to employee benefits.

Trustees approved more than \$21,000 in general fund claims and transferred \$280,993.22 from CDBG funds to the town's money market account to properly allocate previously reimbursed street improvement funds.

The board awarded a \$558,321.50 bid to Rudy Construction for Phase I of the Mitchell Road improvement project through the MRDAF program. Later in the meeting, trustees also approved an agreement with the Oklahoma Department of Transportation for Phase II of the project, securing an additional \$500,000 grant. In total, the town will receive approximately \$1 million in grant funding for Mitchell Road, with the town responsible for a 25 percent match.

Trustees approved changes to the town's vacation policy, allowing employees to begin using accrued vacation after 90 days of employment rather than waiting a full year. Vacation accrual will now be calculated in hours to better align with varying employee schedules.

Discussion regarding replacing public works clothing and boot vouchers with pay adjustments was tabled pending further review of PPE requirements.

The board accepted the town's FY 2024-2025 annual audit, which reported no findings.

During the Utility Authority meeting, trustees approved a \$200 stipend for employees who worked extended hours repairing a major water line break during the January 24 snowstorm. Board members praised town employees for their dedication during extreme weather conditions.

The meeting adjourned following routine business.

## EARL MARSHALL HONORED WITH A QUILT OF VALOR



## PIONEER HOSTS INTERNET SAFETY SEMINAR IN HENNESSEY

**Pioneer Telephone Cooperative** held an Internet Safety Seminar in Hennessey on Tuesday, February 10, offering residents practical tips to protect themselves from online scams and data breaches.

The event featured a three-part senior safety series presented by James Martis of Plus Smart, a member of NTCA. Attendees learned how to create strong passwords, recognize phishing attempts, respond to data breaches, and use multi-factor authentication, also known as two-factor authentication.

Statistics shared during the seminar highlighted the growing threat of cybercrime. Thousands of data breaches are reported each year in the United States, with stolen usernames and passwords involved in most cases. Seniors, in particular, are frequently targeted through romance scams, tech support scams, grandparent scams, fake charities, and government impersonation schemes.

Speakers emphasized the importance of using unique passwords for each account and enabling security features such as account alerts and two-factor authentication. Residents were also introduced to free tools like HaveIBeenPwned.com to check whether their email addresses have been exposed in known breaches.

Pioneer representatives remained after the presentation to answer questions and assist customers with account security, encouraging everyone to stay informed and proactive in protecting their personal information. Photos by AAH Jack Quirk

## POT ROAST

Have you, like us, tried out multiple recipes and methods for making a pot roast? Some are too bland, some are still too tough at the end of the cooking time. Well, hear us out...we have another recipe to offer you. But this one comes with a caveat. The length of time that your roast needs to cook is heavily influenced by the kind of cut and how big the roast is. Other factors come into play as well, including if this is a store-bought roast or a farm fresh one. Farm fresh tends to be leaner so you will need more cooking time...always on low.

This method is using a 3-5lb roast. Your choice of cut.

- 1 stick butter
- 1 pkt au jus gravy
- 1 pkt brown gravy
- 1 pkt onion soup mix
- Yellow potatoes, cut up uniformly
- Carrots (we prefer whole carrots- peeled and diced)

To begin, preheat a big skillet so you can sear your roast. We use a large cast iron skillet. Always preheat it so it sizzles as soon as the meat touches the skillet. Generously season your roast while searing it. We use salt, pepper, garlic powder, & onion powder. Sear all sides and then move it to a crockpot.

Add in the chopped potatoes and carrots (you can add onion here too if you like and garlic cloves.)

Place the stick of butter on top of the roast.

Add in the seasoning packets, sprinkling all around.

Pour in some water to reach about a third of the way up the roast. Be sure you pour it over the top to get the seasonings all wet.

Cover and cook on low until the meat falls apart when you stir it around with a fork.

This is the kicker! It may be hard to plan for when this will be ready so always err on the side of caution and allow extra time. The roast will only get better as it sits and you don't want it to be tough from being undercooked.

The roast we cooked most recently was probably a 4-5 lb farm fresh chuck roast and needed about 10 hours on low before it was tender. But boy howdy was it so tender and juicy and flavorful! It is worth the patience!

Be warned, your roast is going to start smelling delicious and ready to eat in as little as 4ish hours but do not be deceived, haha! Let it cook until it is so tender that it falls apart.

It just might be the best roast recipe there is!

Punxsutawney Phil saw his shadow back on groundhog's day and predicted 6 more weeks of winter. Do we believe him?! 
