Hennessey Named One of Oklahoma's Safest Towns

Hennessey has earned statewide recognition for something many locals already knew: it's a pretty safe place to call home.

According to a new report from SafeWise, Hennessey ranks 3rd safest town in Oklahoma, landing just behind Elgin and Hooker and ahead of communities like Hinton, Piedmont, Union City, and Weatherford.

SafeWise bases its rankings on crime data and an annual national survey of more than 5,000 people, measuring how safe Americans feel in their states and communities. While safety concerns across the country continue to shift, Hennessey's strong showing highlights the benefits of small-town living and local engagement.

Oklahoma stood out in a good way. The state tied for 9th least worried in the nation, with just 39 percent of residents expressing concern about safety, placing it alongside states like Idaho, Minnesota, and Alaska, and far below high-anxiety states like California and Alabama.

For Hennessey, the ranking reflects a combination of community involvement, local law enforcement, and neighbors looking out for neighbors. It's another reminder that while national headlines can feel heavy, life in Hennessey remains steady, connected, and safe. In other words, not a bad place to hang your hat.



HENNESSEY FINISHES FISCAL YEAR WITH POSITIVE AUDIT REPORT

The Town of Hennessey received a clean audit following its annual financial review for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, according to independent auditors. The audit found the town's financial statements to be fairly presented, with no material issues identified.

Overall, the town's net position increased by \$47,315, ending the year with approximately \$4.96 million in assets exceeding liabilities. Governmental funds closed the year with a combined fund balance of \$3.7 million, while the General Fund maintained an unassigned balance of \$387,308, representing nearly 28 percent of annual General Fund revenues.

Auditors also reported no findings related to internal controls or compliance with state and federal requirements. Town officials noted continued investment in infrastructure projects, including water line replacements and reverse osmosis treatment improvements, with most budgeted operations remaining consistent going into the next fiscal year.

HOME DESTROYED BY FIRE

Dover firefighters responded to a house fire at 20717 E. 700 Road, also known as Beard Blacktop, northeast of Dover at approximately 1:40 a.m. Sunday, February 8.

Upon arrival, firefighters found the brick residence fully engulfed in flames. Homeowner Simon Gracey was awakened by smoke inside the house, discovered the garage was on fire, and was able to evacuate safely. Gracey was the only person in the home at the time, and no injuries were reported.



Fire crews remained on scene for several hours and returned to the station at approximately 5:20 a.m. The home was declared a total loss. No additional information was available at the time of this report.

Assisting agencies included the Hennessey Fire Department, the Kingfisher County Sheriff's Office, and Kingfisher County Emergency Management.

Hennessey Fire Station Gets Lined Out

The entire fleet of Hennessey Fire Department trucks enjoyed a rare spa day this week, outside soaking up the sunshine.

While the trucks were out, the Town of Hennessey crew members Jamie Keel and Kyle Watkins spent the day lining out the fire station, and yes, we mean literally lining it out.

For the first time ever, the fire station now has official parking lines. That's right, after years of eyeballing it, "close enough," and firefighter-style creative parking, the bays and parking areas finally got measured, marked, and painted.

Keel and Watkins carefully measured everything before spraying the lines using the same durable paint used for street parking, which means these lines aren't going anywhere anytime soon.

The result? Clean lines, organized parking, and fire trucks that now know exactly where they belong. It may not stop a fire, but it definitely makes the station look sharper, more organized, and just a little more official.

SENATE MINUTES WITH CHUCK HALL

OKLAHOMA CITY – Senate Appropriations Chairman Chuck Hall, R-Perry, has advanced legislation to ease the transition for Oklahoma’s foster children as they move placements.

The Senate Health and Human Services Committee on Monday unanimously passed Senate Bill 1377, which would require the Oklahoma Department of Human Services to provide a duffel bag to foster children who lack luggage for their personal belongings.

Hall, a former foster parent, said this issue is near and dear to his heart.

“Too often, children in the foster care system are forced to pack everything they own into a garbage bag as they move between foster homes,” Hall said. “That experience can take a toll on a child’s self-worth and mental well-being, and it sends the wrong message about how our system treats vulnerable kids.”

To make the transitions between homes easier, each duffel bag would include personal hygiene items and other basic necessities. Hall said that while many foster parents provide these items, some moves happen unexpectedly, or on short notice, and giving a child a duffel bag with essential items ensures they have what they need to feel at home in their new placement.

“No child should feel like their well-being is an afterthought,” Hall said. “As the state works toward reuniting children with their parents, this legislation aims to provide kids stability and comfort during what can be an incredibly challenging transition.”

SB 1377 passed the Health and Human Services Committee in an 11-0 vote. This bill now awaits a hearing before the Senate Appropriations Committee.




