THREAT CLOSES HENNESSEY SCHOOLS

According to statements from Hennessey Public Schools and the Hennessey Police Department dated March 1, 2026, the Hennessey Police Department was made aware of a potential bomb threat involving Hennessey School.

School administration sent out a notice to all students' parents, teachers, and staff stating that district administrators were notified of a potential school threat through their anonymous reporting system, STOPit, and that school and all activities would be canceled Monday, March 2.

STOPit is an online, 100% anonymous reporting platform used by schools, businesses, and organizations to report, detect, and prevent inappropriate or unsafe behavior. Users can submit tips via an app or website to notify administrators of issues like bullying, threats, or harassment.

According to the police statement, HPD officers immediately initiated an investigation and were able to quickly identify the juvenile responsible for making the threat. As a precautionary measure, they requested assistance from the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Bomb Squad, which responded and conducted a thorough search of the school campus. After completing their assessment, no devices or threats were located.

The statement noted that appropriate action has been taken regarding the juvenile involved. Due to state laws and protections governing juvenile matters, the identity of the individual will not be released. Chief Christian K. Solis said, "The Hennessey Police Department takes all threats, especially those involving our schools, extremely seriously. Every threat is fully investigated to ensure the safety of our students, staff, and community. We will continue to act swiftly and decisively in any situation that could place our community at risk."

Agencies assisting the Hennessey Police included the Oklahoma Highway Patrol, the Kingfisher County District Attorney's Office, the Oklahoma Office of Juvenile Affairs, and Hennessey Public Schools.



WRECK CLOSSES HIGHWAY

Sunday afternoon, March 1, at approximately 12:15 p.m., emergency crews responded to a two-vehicle collision involving a semi-truck and a pickup. The crash occurred in front of Taggart's Garden Center at 8490 U.S. Highway 81.

The southbound lane of Highway 81 was closed, and traffic was detoured. Northbound traffic was reduced to one lane for about an hour while crews worked the scene.

According to a report from the Oklahoma Highway Patrol, the pickup was driven by Johnny Rains of Hennessey. Rains was transported to Integris Hospital in Enid with undisclosed injuries. The driver of the semi, Francisco Carranza of Enid, was not injured.

Assisting agencies included the Oklahoma Highway Patrol, Hennessey Police and Fire, Mercy EMS, and the Kingfisher County Sheriff's Office.



Disease Pressure Among Us

It may feel too early to talk about wheat diseases... but in reality, now is exactly the right time.

With above-average temperatures this winter (and let's be honest, it hasn't really felt like winter), conditions have been favorable for early development of leaf diseases. As we head toward spring, those conditions can allow problems to escalate quickly.

We're already seeing diseases like leaf rust, Septoria blotch, tan spot, and powdery mildew showing up in several fields across our area.

That's why scouting is critical.

Knowing what you're dealing with ensures the right fungicide is applied, whether that's a preventative, curative, or combination product.

For example, leaf rust can be especially problematic in our region, as spores often travel north on air currents from the south. It typically appears as small orange pustules on the leaf surface. Catching it early can make all the difference.

Hot pockets are still present in some fields, so don't assume you're in the clear. Stay vigilant, keep scouting, and be proactive. If you have questions about identification or treatment options, the team at Heinen Brothers is here to help.

HENNESSEY'S MAILEY SCOTT COMPLETES CLEET ACADEMY

Mailey Scott, a Hennessey High School graduate, has successfully completed the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET) Academy through the Edmond Police Department, earning her certification as a peace officer in the state of Oklahoma.

Scott said her decision to pursue law enforcement was years in the making.

"I've known since my freshman year of high school," she said. "My dad was a big motivator in my life with him being on the fire department. I knew I wanted to help people, but I didn't really want to go into firefighting. It's more medical, and I'm not a medical person. I really like the investigative side of police work."

While police work inevitably includes some medical response, Scott said she feels prepared. A former lifeguard, she is certified in CPR and comfortable with basic emergency response procedures.

That interest in investigations led Scott to pursue higher education while waiting to meet age requirements for law enforcement. She double majored in forensic science and criminal justice at UCO, graduating in December, while simultaneously completing the academy.

Currently living in Guthrie, "I'm hoping to get on with the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation," she said.

Now engaged and planning to settle in the Guthrie area, Scott says she enjoys being close enough to commute to the city while still remaining near her family in Hennessey. Photos Provided

HENNESSEY TESTS STORM SIREN SYSTEM

Last Thursday, February 26, the Town of Hennessey conducted a full test of its storm siren system, spending about an hour making sure each unit was operating properly.

The sirens were originally installed in April 2024 and could be activated through the Fire Department's two-way radio system. They were put to the test just weeks later on May 8, 2024, when a tornado tracked along the north edge of Hennessey, causing damage near Highway 51.

About a year ago, the town added a backup activation system that allows sirens to be sounded

through a secure cell phone app. During last week's test, Fire Chief Brandon Scott, several firefighters, and Hennessey Emergency Manager Tiffany Rowen positioned themselves at each siren location to verify that every unit was working correctly. Each authorized user tested both the radio and app activation methods to ensure the system is fully operational. The test was scheduled for 6 p.m. on a clear day to avoid confusion or panic and to give residents the opportunity to hear what the sirens sound like inside their homes.

Hennessey currently has six new siren locations. On the west side of town, sirens are located at 625 N. Arapaho, at the town shop, at West 2nd Street near Pavilion Park, and in Bull Foot Park. On the east side, sirens are positioned at the playground behind the Early Education School building, on East 2nd Street at the Senior Citizen Center property, and in Ike's Acres east of Oakwood Drive. In addition to full-scale tests, the sirens perform silent automatic self-tests daily. The siren at Pavilion Park also sounds a brief noon chime each day. Photos by AAH Jack Quirk

VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE APPROACHES

March 13, 2026, is the last day to apply for voter registration in order to be eligible to vote in the April 7, 2026, Board of Education General: Okarche School I-105, Municipal General and Special Election: City of Kingfisher and City of Piedmont, Kingfisher County Election Board Secretary Shawna Fulks said today.

Shawna Fulks said that persons who are United States Citizens, residents of Oklahoma, and at least 17 ½ years old are eligible to apply for voter registration. However, you must be at least 18 years old to vote.

Applications must be received by the County Election Board or postmarked no later than midnight, March 13, 2026. Applications postmarked after that time will be accepted, but will not be processed until after the April 7, 2026, Election. Applications may also be submitted to any motor vehicle agency that is also an official voter registration agency by the submission deadline.

Applicants will be notified in writing when their application has been processed. Approved voters will receive a Voter Identification Card in the mail. Some may receive a letter that explains the reason or reasons the application was not approved. Shawna Fulks said those who do not receive a response within 30 days of submitting their application should contact the County Election Board office immediately.

The Kingfisher County Election Board reminds voters that applications must be approved by the County Election Board Secretary in order to vote.

Registered voters who have moved to Kingfisher County from a different county or state will need to complete a new Voter Registration Application in order to be eligible for elections in Kingfisher County. If you have moved within the county and need to update your address, you may make changes online using the OK Voter Portal at oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp or complete a Voter Registration Application.

Voter Registration Applications can be downloaded from the State Election Board website at oklahoma.gov/elections. You may also complete a form at your County Election Board. Most post offices, tag agencies, and public libraries have applications available upon request.

The Kingfisher County Election Board is located at 101 S Main St., Room#8 and is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. For questions, please contact the Election Board at 405-375-3895 or kingfishercounty@elections.ok.gov.


