WILD WEATHER WEEK BRINGS HAIL, HIGH WINDS, AND MULTIPLE FIRES TO KINGFISHER COUNTY

This past week brought a little bit of everything when it comes to Oklahoma weather.

On Tuesday, March 10, a severe thunderstorm passed over Hennessey, dropping hail up to tennis ball size.

Then on Sunday, March 15, temperatures started in the 70s before plunging into the 20s overnight. A strong cold front moved through with wind gusts exceeding 50 mph, reducing visibility on some east-west roads in Kingfisher County due to blowing sand.

The strong winds also helped spark and spread several fires across the county Sunday morning, keeping firefighters from multiple departments busy for much of the day.

Hennessey Working Toward Long-Term EMS Funding

The Town of Hennessey is taking steps to stabilize local ambulance service after approving a temporary contract with Mercy Regional EMS and beginning the process to create a new funding district.

At its March 10th meeting, trustees approved a six-month agreement with Mercy Regional EMS, which recently acquired Life EMS and inherited the Hennessey operation. The temporary contract will cost the town \$25,000 per month. Town Administrator Tiffany Rowen said the town previously paid about \$16,000 to \$17,000 per month for ambulance service.

Mercy Regional owner Duke Dixon said low call volume is a major challenge for rural EMS providers. The Hennessey ambulance transported 18 patients in January and nine in February.

Ambulance services generally only bill when a patient is transported to a hospital or care facility, meaning many calls generate no direct revenue. Officials say rising costs and low call volume make operating a dedicated ambulance service increasingly difficult

Hail, High Winds continued...

The morning began with Hennessey firefighters responding to a grass fire west of town near Highway 51 and NS2770 Road. Within minutes, another call came in for a stubborn silage fire about a mile farther west.

While crews were working those fires, the Ames Fire Department requested mutual aid for a large grass fire east of Ames.

Shortly afterward, another call reported a large grass fire at the intersection of Highway 51 and NS2740 Road. Hennessey firefighters were assisted by departments already headed toward the Ames fire, including Big 4, Dover, Loyal, and Cashion.

Kingfisher County District 2 also responded with a semi water tanker and the county's former Hennessey tanker truck to supply water to crews battling the flames.

Winds exceeding 50 mph pushed heavy smoke across Highway 51, reducing visibility to near zero in some areas. Because of the smoke, a car collided with a semi-truck, temporarily closing the highway.

The driver of the car was transported by Mercy Regional EMS to an Enid hospital with undisclosed injuries. Authorities have not released the driver's name. The semi driver was not injured. Despite the challenging conditions, no structures were reported damaged. The Oklahoma Highway Patrol reopened Highway 51 around 2:30 p.m.

Assisting agencies included the Big 4, Dover, Loyal, and Cashion fire departments, along with Kingfisher County Emergency Management, Kingfisher County District 2, the Oklahoma Highway Patrol, Mercy Regional EMS, and the Kingfisher County Sheriff's Office.

Hennessey's Brandon Mendoza Named 2026 Oklahoma State Champion Auctioneer

Hennessey graduate Brandon Mendoza has added another major title to his growing list of accomplishments after being named the 2026 Oklahoma State Champion Auctioneer, becoming the youngest person in state history to earn the honor.

Mendoza, 21, graduated from Hennessey High School in 2023 and has been working toward the goal for nearly a decade. As the 2026 titleholder, he will serve as the state ambassador for Oklahoma's auctioneering industry, representing auctioneers across the state and promoting the profession throughout the coming year.



At 18 years old, Mendoza returned to the competition and was crowned the 2023 International Junior Auctioneer Champion, also held in Jacksonville, Florida.

His interest in auctioneering began at just 12 years old after attending cattle auctions with his father, Eleazar Valles. As a teenager, he later connected with Hennessey auctioneer Justin Choate, who became an important mentor and helped him gain experience behind the microphone while developing his own chant.

Mendoza first gained national recognition in 2018 when he finished second at the International Junior Auctioneer Championship. He returned to the stage in 2023 and captured the International Junior Auctioneer Champion title.

Fluent in both English and Spanish auction chants, Mendoza continues building a career that began at local cattle auctions.

"It's an extremely big honor," Mendoza said. "I'm proud to represent Oklahoma and serve as the state ambassador this year."


Letter to the Editor

Bree Yost Crowned 2027 Miss Kingfisher County By AAK Maitland Woody

The 2027 Miss Kingfisher County Pageant brought scholarship, talent, and poise to the stage Sunday, March 15 at the Hennessey High School auditorium as three young women competed for the county title.



At the end of the evening, Bree Yost of Lomega High School was crowned Miss Kingfisher County 2027. Reagan Johnston of Kingfisher High School was named first runner-up, and Makayla Hines of Cashion High School was named second runner-up.

Scholarships awarded during the event included \$1,000 to Yost, \$750 to Johnston, and \$500 to Hines. Johnston also earned the People's Choice Award after raising \$455. The Miss Congeniality Award, determined by a vote of the contestants, ended in a three-way tie, with the \$300 scholarship split evenly among the delegates.

Long Term EMS continued... without additional funding.

Town Administrator Tiffany Rowen said the community will likely need a new revenue source. "We've got to have more money from somewhere to make this happen," Rowen said.

Trustees also voted to recommend a special election to create a 522 EMS district covering the Hennessey School District. If approved by voters, the district would levy a 3-mill property tax expected to generate about \$240,000 annually to help fund ambulance service.

Even with that funding, town leaders said the 522 district likely would not cover the entire cost of ambulance service. The town would probably still contribute funding from its existing half-cent sales tax.

Trustees noted that Hennessey is currently the only school district in Kingfisher County without a 522 EMS district. If approved, the district could begin receiving funds in January 2027.

HOUSE ADVANCING BILLS TO SENATE

In the state Legislature, we are pressing toward the third-reading deadline for bills to be heard in their chamber of origin. March 26 is the date by which all House bills must be advanced to the Senate and all Senate bills to the House. We considered 173 bills on the House floor this past week and have about 300 still eligible.

House Bill 2988 passed in the House. This would add \$2.5 million to expand the Terry Peach Act to help us continue our efforts to eradicate harmful woody species, such as eastern red cedars, that consume massive amounts of water and present a fire danger.

We've made progress in our area after previous passage of bills to establish and fund this program. With lingering drought and persistent wildfire conditions throughout Oklahoma, we cannot stop until we have a consistent statewide plan to reverse the threat of these invasive species. I look forward to the Senate quickly approving this bill and sending to Gov. Stitt to be signed into law.

House Bill 3277 also passed. This request from the salvage industry would cleanup language related to inspections of Vehicle Identification Numbers (VIN) on salvaged vehicles.

Another bill that passed this week was House Bill 3151, which would increase the minimum number of instructional days in Oklahoma public schools. I appreciate all of the work and the amendment offered by House Speaker Kyle Hilbert on this bill. His efforts gained the approval of the major education groups.

Although I supported the amended proposal, I still am concerned and will continue watching our public school funding to ensure our rural schools are not affected adversely, especially those not reliant upon funding formula dollars.

The bill, as amended, would make no changes to professional development or parent teacher conferences counting towards instructional days, consistent with current statute. The legislation would only go into effect if the State Department of Education budget is \$175 million greater in Fiscal Year 2028 than it is in the current budget year FY26.

Research is clear that adding instructional time helps children learn, but we're well aware we have to provide funding for this and ensure our educators are part of the conversation.

With our focus on improving literacy, I am looking forward to passing House Bill 3016 that would create a two-year pilot program to expand vision screening for early childcare students. Improving vision is a lifesaver in helping with reading and other learning. I hope to present this to the full House in the next few days.

It is exciting to think of U.S. Sen. Markwayne Mullins being in charge of Homeland Security, pending U.S. Senate approval. With all the current international tension, I believe he will do a great job at protecting our homeland from terrorism by regimes that have oppressed and massacred since 1979. His potential open seat already has created a cascade of openings throughout our state offices that will make for a historic election cycle.

Plan Ahead, Hwy 51 Railroad Crossing Closing April 3

After years of driver's complaining, bouncing, and possibly checking their tires after crossing the tracks, Union Pacific Railroad is finally planning repairs to the railroad crossing near the intersection of Hwy 51 and Hwy 81 in Hennessey.

Union Pacific has posted signs stating the crossing will be closed April 3 from 6 a.m. to 5 p.m. while crews work to repair the long-troubled stretch of track and pavement.

Motorists should plan alternate routes during the closure and allow a little extra travel time getting across town.

With a little luck, the temporary inconvenience will result in a much smoother ride, and fewer coffee spills, when crossing the tracks in the future.



DEADLINE TO CHANGE PARTY AFFILIATION APPROACHES

Oklahomans who want to change their party affiliation must submit their change no later than March

31, (NAME OF COUNTY) County Election Board Secretary (FULL NAME) said today. Voters may change their party affiliation online using the OK Voter Portal at oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp or by completing a new Voter Registration Application. (LAST NAME) reminds voters that no party affiliation changes are allowed from April 1 through August 31 during an even-numbered year. "If we receive your request after March 31, we are required by law to hold that request and process it in September," (LAST NAME) said. Oklahoma has three recognized parties: Democratic, Republican, and Libertarian.

In Oklahoma, a voter must be a registered member of a party in order to vote in that party's primary election. Independents are permitted to participate in primary elections, only if a party officially requests its elections be opened to Independent voters. Currently, no party allows Independent voters to participate in its party's primary elections. More information about primary elections can be found on the State Election Board website at oklahoma.gov/elections.

All registered voters, regardless of political affiliation, may vote for any candidate during a General Election. Voter Registration Applications can be downloaded from the State Election Board website at oklahoma.gov/elections. Applications are also available at the (NAME OF COUNTY) County Election Board located at (PHYSICAL ADDRESS) . Office hours are (TIME) a.m. to (TIME) p.m., (DAY) through (DAY) .

Hennessey Eagles Claim Championship at "Warm Up the Bats" Tournament in Enid



New Book Return Box Installed

The Hennessey town crew installed a brand-new library book return box Friday, March 13, replacing the previous one that met an untimely (and rather dramatic) end last fall.

The original box was totaled on September 2, 2025, when an SUV traveling south crossed two northbound lanes of Highway 81/Main Street and struck the library's outdoor book return. After the unexpected literary collision, the driver continued south for about two miles before finally stopping near the intersection of Highway 81 and Exxon Road (E650 Road). The books, thankfully, were innocent bystanders. Friday morning, Jamie Keel and Blaze Shimanek set the new return box into place and anchored it firmly to the concrete, with hopes this one will stick around a little longer and avoid any future "drive-through in returns."

The Bruner family has faced immense health challenges over the past few years.

Brent was diagnosed with ulcerative colitis at just 12 years old. For years, he endured constant pain that prevented him from attending traditional high school. After countless medications failed, doctors determined he would need three major surgeries to remove his colon and rebuild his digestive system. His first surgery took place in January 2025, and his final procedure was completed in January 2026. Just before this last surgery, Brent developed a serious intestinal blockage and had to be rushed by ambulance to Integris in Oklahoma City. Doctors successfully removed the blockage and completed his final surgery, giving the family hope that he may finally experience relief.

While Brent was still in the midst of surgeries and recovery, the family received another devastating blow. In June 2025, Mark was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. He underwent a Whipple procedure at MD Anderson in Houston in August 2025 and continues to travel every three months for testing while receiving chemotherapy in Enid.

Through it all, Angela has worked full-time while caring for both Brent and Mark, managing hospital stays, treatments, and the day-to-day needs of the family. Their oldest son, Matthew, has also been a pillar of strength during this challenging time.

To support the Bruner family with medical bills and immediate expenses, the Hennessey CAT Team will host a fundraiser at the Hennessey Mercantile on Saturday, March 28, at 5:00 PM. Donations can be made at Community State Bank to CAT, with "Bruner Family" noted in the memo.

A special raffle is underway to help support the Bruner family, with a generous donation from Breckenridge Arms making it possible. Kenny at Breckenridge Arms has donated a beautiful Henry rifle that will be raffled as part of the fundraiser to benefit the Bruner family. Community members now have the opportunity to purchase raffle tickets for a chance to win the rifle while also helping a local family in need.




