ROOF COLLAPSE ON SOUTH MAIN

A long-troubled building at 220 S. Main St. appears to have finally reached its breaking point this week, as much of the building has collapsed.

Part of the roof had already given way a few months ago, but recent storms and heavy winds finished the job, sending the remaining structure down. While the front portion of the building is still standing, roughly the rear two-thirds has caved in.

The property, easily recognized by its large garage door, sits just south of the former Buck's Place Bar and just north of the Champlain Apartments, directly across from the Hennessey Post Office.

After years of visible wear and tear, it seems this old building has officially waved the white flag.

Now the big question becomes, what's next? Early discussions are underway about the future of this site and the surrounding properties, leaving the door open for potential new life along South Main. For now, though, this one has gone from "needs work" to "no coming back."

DETOUR AT THE TRACKS

Hennessey drivers took the scenic route Friday, April 3, and for once, nobody could blame GPS.

Union Pacific Railroad crews shut down the crossing just west of the U.S. 51 & U.S. 81 intersection to tackle some much-needed repairs. Crews replaced the entire track section and added a new concrete approach, smoothing out what had become a bone-rattling experience for drivers.

The crossing remained closed most of the day, with traffic detoured from Cemetery Rd to Oklahoma Street until around 6 p.m.

Sure, it was a bit of a hassle... but your suspension, your coffee, and probably your dentist all agree, it was worth it.

KOFM'S ALAN CLEPPER SHARES HIS BROADCASTING JOURNEY



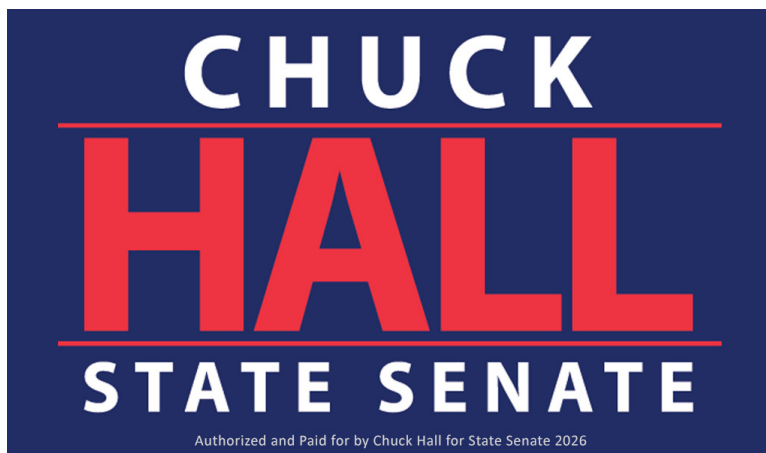
On April 5th, The All About Show featured longtime radio personality **Alan Clepper, host on KOFM**, in a conversation centered around his career and impact in Northwest Oklahoma. With more than 40 years in broadcasting, Clepper shared the story of how an unexpected path led him into a profession that would define much of his life.

Originally studying architecture at Oklahoma State University, Clepper shifted directions after discovering radio and quickly realized it was where he belonged. What began as a temporary decision turned into a lifelong career, eventually leading him to work at nearly every major station in the Enid market. He spent more than 26 years, across multiple periods, with KOFM, becoming a familiar voice to listeners across the region.

During the episode, Clepper reflected on the wide range of experiences radio brought him, from broadcasting underwater in a scuba tank to traveling overseas to assist broadcasters in Poland. While those moments highlighted the creativity of the industry, he also spoke on how broadcasting has changed over time, particularly with advances in technology that have reshaped how stations operate.

A key takeaway from the conversation was Clepper's focus on authenticity. He emphasized that despite changes in media, radio continues to offer a genuine connection with its audience. That perspective was strengthened during the COVID-19 era, where he saw firsthand how important real human interaction is.

KNOW YOUR LOCATION: SHARING STORM SHELTER COORDINATES COULD SAVE LIVES IN HENNESSEY

When severe weather strikes in Oklahoma, every second matters. In a town like Hennessey, where storms can develop quickly and unpredictably, local officials are encouraging residents to take a simple but potentially life-saving step: share the exact location of your storm shelter.

Many homes in the area have underground shelters or safe rooms that may not be easily visible from the street. In the aftermath of a tornado or major storm, first responders often face the difficult task of searching damaged properties where landmarks may be gone and debris can cover entrances.

That is where latitude and longitude coordinates come in.

By providing precise GPS coordinates of your storm shelter to local emergency management or town officials, you give responders a clear, accurate location to check if disaster strikes. Instead of guessing where a shelter might be located on a property, they can go directly to the right spot.

This can be especially critical in situations where:

- Homes are heavily damaged or completely destroyed
- Shelter entrances are blocked by debris
- Residents are unable to call for help

Emergency responders say that having this information ahead of time can significantly reduce search time and improve rescue outcomes.

Providing your coordinates is simple. Most smartphones allow you to drop a pin or view your exact latitude and longitude through map apps. Once you have that information, it can be shared with local authorities, often through a form, email, or by contacting city offices.

Residents are also encouraged to:

- Make sure shelter entrances are clearly marked if possible
- Keep pathways to shelters clear
- Inform family members and neighbors of shelter locations

In a region where severe weather is part of life, preparation is key. Taking a few minutes to share your storm shelter's location could make all the difference when it matters most.

As storm season approaches, Hennessey officials remind residents that safety starts with planning ahead and sometimes, the smallest details can have the biggest impact.

BURN BAN LIFTED AFTER MUCH-NEEDED RAINFALL

KINGFISHER COUNTY — A countywide burn ban that had been in place since March 30 has officially been lifted following recent rainfall that improved local conditions.

Kingfisher County Emergency Manager Randy Poindexter confirmed on April 2 that moisture from two rounds of storms helped ease the fire danger across the area. Rain totals ranged from approximately 1 to 2.5 inches throughout the county, providing critical relief after a stretch of dry and fire-prone weather.

The burn ban had been enacted by county officials in response to heightened wildfire risk, but those concerns were reduced significantly after the storms moved through. According to Poindexter, the rainfall was enough to effectively end the temporary restrictions.

County fire chiefs were in agreement that conditions had improved and supported the decision to lift the ban, allowing residents to resume normal outdoor burning activities.

Officials still encourage residents to use caution when burning, as weather conditions can change quickly, especially during Oklahoma's active spring season.



ROAD CLOSURE ANNOUNCED FOR BRIDGE REPAIRS IN KINGFISHER COUNTY DISTRICT 2


Kingfisher County District 2 has announced a temporary road closure beginning Thursday, April 2, 2026, to allow for bridge repair work.

The closure will impact NS 2890, approximately 2½ miles east of the U.S. 51 and U.S. 81 junction, then 1-1/2 miles north. The affected stretch runs for one mile between EW 610 and EW 600.

Crews will be working to repair the approaches on both sides of Bridge #244. The road will remain closed throughout construction.

Motorists are reminded not to drive around barricades for any reason.

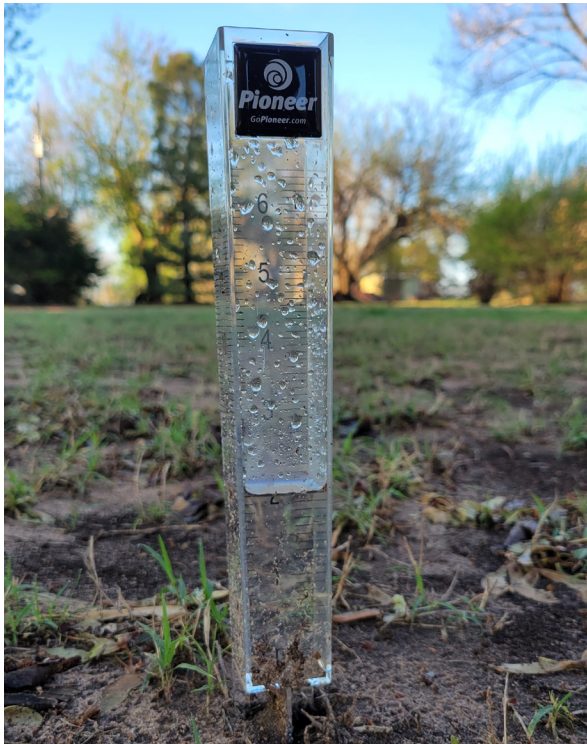

HOMEMADE BREAD

-in under 2 hours

This is by far the easiest bread that Summer has ever made. And it is delicious! Autumn's idea of "making bread" is opening a pack of crescent rolls but even she's tempted to try this recipe! You can use this for sandwich bread or for dessert with butter and honey or jelly. It's simple, fast and it will make you feel like you're a real big time home baker.

In a large bowl, combine:
2 cups warm water (not hot)
2 tsp active yeast

Allow to sit for a minute or two then add:
2 Tbsp honey or sugar
1 egg
¼ c heavy cream

Stir all together then add:
4 cups unbleached flour
1 tsp salt

Mix all together until the flour is mixed in and you have dough. It's okay to really mix it here but you don't need to go overboard. Cover the bowl and allow the dough to sit for 30 minutes in a warmish spot. Butter a bread pan and after the 30 minute rest, pour the dough into the bread pan.

Preheat your oven to 350°F and bake the bread for no more than an hour. Check it at 45 minutes. You want it browned and to sound hollow when you thump it. Allow it to cool for 5-10 minutes and then take it out of the pan to cool the rest of the way. If you leave it in the pan to cool all the way, it'll get a little soggy. You don't want soggy bread.

Enjoy this super easy and yet still delicious bread recipe! And thank you to megforit on TikTok for sharing this recipe with us.
