KANSAS WOMAN KILLED IN CRASH WEST OF HENNESSEY



Thursday, May 7, at approximately 8:15 p.m., the Hennessey Fire Department responded to a serious two-vehicle collision just east of the intersection of Hwy. 51 and Hwy. 132 in Kingfisher County, west of Hennessey.

According to an Oklahoma Highway Patrol report, a semi-truck and trailer operated by Abduselam Hassan, of Illinois, was traveling eastbound on Hwy. 51 when a collision occurred with a westbound SUV operated by Dian Phillips, of Kansas.

Authorities reported that Phillips was pronounced deceased at the scene. A minor passenger of the SUV was transported by LifeFlight helicopter to OU Children's Hospital in Oklahoma City and was reported to be in stable condition. The name of the minor has not been released.

The driver of the semi-truck was not seriously injured.

Hwy. 51 remained closed for more than seven hours while crews worked to clear the scene. The roadway reopened at approximately 3:30 a.m. Friday morning.

Emergency personnel assisting at the scene included the Hennessey Fire Department, Hennessey Police Department, Oklahoma Highway Patrol, Mercy Regional EMS, Kingfisher County Sheriff's Office, and M6 Wrecker Service.

According to the OHP, the crash investigation is ongoing.

Hennessey Ambulance 522 District Vote Set for June 16

Kingfisher County Commissioners took an important step Monday, March 23rd, toward creating a dedicated ambulance district for the Hennessey area. The question of how to fund emergency medical services will now be put to voters.

Commissioners approved a plan to hold an election for residents living within the Hennessey Public Schools district. Voters will be asked to approve a 3-mill property tax to fund ambulance services, a funding structure known as an Emergency Medical Service (EMS) District. If passed, the tax is expected to generate about \$240,000 annually.



The move follows the Hennessey Town Board's approval of a six-month contract on March 10th with Mercy Regional EMS to keep service running in the interim. At that meeting, Mercy owner Duke Dixon explained that small communities like Hennessey often struggle to sustain ambulance service because call volume alone is not enough to cover operating costs. The Hennessey ambulance transported only 18 patients in January and 9 in February, and since services typically only bill when a patient is transported to a hospital or care facility, many calls generate no direct revenue at all.

DOBRINSKI PASSES BILL PROHIBITING SOLAR, BATTERY TAX EXEMPTIONS

OKLAHOMA CITY – The House on Monday passed a bill that would prohibit solar generation facilities and battery energy storage systems (BESS) from qualifying for the five-year manufacturer ad valorem tax exemption beginning in January 2028.

Rep. Mike Dobrinski, R-Okeene, is the House author of Senate Bill 237.

“Huge international energy developers do not need to be subsidized by Oklahoma tax dollars,” Dobrinski said. “Oklahoma has 30 more days of sunshine than the average U.S. state. Our land prices, even with recent significant hikes, are still some of the lowest in the nation. We’ve removed similar exemptions for wind energy and data centers. It’s past time for Oklahoma to treat solar and battery storage the same.”

Dobrinski explained this tax exemption was eliminated for wind in 2015 with Senate Bill 498. In 2021, the Legislature recognized data centers were costing the state \$46 million annually through the exemption, he said. Their eligibility was removed with Senate Bill 609.

“As lawmakers, we have the authority to add or remove categories of qualifying manufacturers through statute when these exemptions are no longer needed to promote investment in various industries,” he said.

Dobrinski said most in the state embrace an all-of-the-above approach to energy, and the state enjoys some of the lowest costs for power because of it.

“Oklahoma is a net exporter of energy because of our abundance. Each new energy project should be based on the market opportunity and the return on investment,” he said.

Dobrinski pointed to a recent project in his House district as a reason the bill is needed. In March, NextEra Energy applied to the Oklahoma Tax Commission for a manufacturing exemption of ad valorem taxes for the \$655 million Skeleton Creek 250Mw solar/200Mw BESS project in Garfield County.

“Located in the geographic center of our country with low costs and low regulation, Oklahoma already makes sense for investments like these. We do not need to be paying property taxes or infrastructure costs on top of our already favorable business climate and our natural resources.”

The Five-Year Ad Valorem Exemption for Manufacturers applies to real and personal property used in the manufacturing of a product, as well as property used in research and development activities. Because electric power generation is considered manufacturing, as it converts raw materials (fuel, wind, water) into electricity, the wind and solar industry have been able to claim the exemption.

Applications are filed with the county assessor where the facility is located. If approved, the state reimburses the county for the exempted property tax for up to five years. Since the program began, more than \$2 billion in property taxes have been exempted through this mechanism.

The bill was amended in the House, so it will return to the Senate for final passage before moving to the governor for his consideration of signing it into law.

Ambulance Vote continued.



Town Administrator Tiffany Rowen summed it up plainly: the community will need a new revenue source to make this work.

Mercy took over operations from Enid LIFE EMS in December, ending a partnership with the community that had lasted nearly 25 years. Under the current arrangement, the town is paying \$25,000 per month, but leaders agree that is not a permanent fix. The long-term solution will be left to voters.

The election is scheduled for June 16, with polls open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. The proposed district would span the entire Hennessey school district boundary, roughly 243 square miles, covering much of northern Kingfisher County and portions of southern Garfield County. Garfield County Commissioners have already signed off on the plan, allowing residents on their side of the line to participate in the vote.

If passed, the district would establish a reliable, ongoing funding source to keep ambulance service available to the Hennessey area for years to come.

Senate Minutes with Senator Chuck Hall May 4, 2026

With the state budget approved, the Senate is now focused on remaining policy issues, including home insurance reform aimed at lowering rising costs while keeping Oklahoma's insurance market competitive. Lawmakers also advanced Senate Joint Resolution 39, a proposal that would limit property tax increases and expand relief for seniors if approved by voters in November.



Governor Kevin Stitt signed Senate Bill 1377, authored by Senator Hall, creating a program through the Oklahoma Department of Human Services to provide foster children with duffel bags containing hygiene items and basic necessities during placement transitions. Hall also helped advance legislation increasing penalties for fraud and identity theft crimes.

In addition, the Senate confirmed several District 20 residents to state boards and commissions, including Traci Richardson-McVicker and Michelle Redus to the State Textbook Committee, Duane Helmberger to the State Fire Marshal Commission, Barry Anderson to the Commission on Consumer Credit, and Richard Willoughby to the State Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors.
