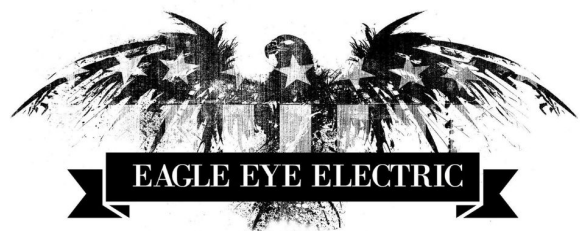
Oklahoma State University Extension experts recommend planting warm-season crops after the final frost and keeping gardens well watered as summer heat approaches.

Memorial Day Ceremony Recognizes Hennessey Veteran

A Memorial Day ceremony held Monday, May 25, at the Enid Woodring Wall of Honor recognized Oklahoma veterans from the Navy, Army, and Air Force, culminating with the induction of **Charles Hobbs** into the Oklahoma Heroes Wall of Fame.

Hobbs served as a captain in the Army Air Corps during World War II as a B-24 pilot. During his service, he flew 311 combat hours on 50 missions targeting Axis shipping ports and military sites across North Africa and Italy.

In August 1943, Hobbs volunteered for Operation Tidal Wave, the daring low-level bombing mission launched from Libya against German oil refineries at Ploiesti, Romania. The operation became one of the costliest Allied air raids of World War II, with 53 aircraft destroyed and more than 500 aircrew members killed, wounded or captured.

Hobbs was the father of Kim, Michael and Sid Hobbs of Hennessey. Kim Hobbs, along with brother Michael Hobbs and cousin Tom O'Hern, accepted the honor on behalf of the family during the ceremony. Photo by AAN Michael Noak.

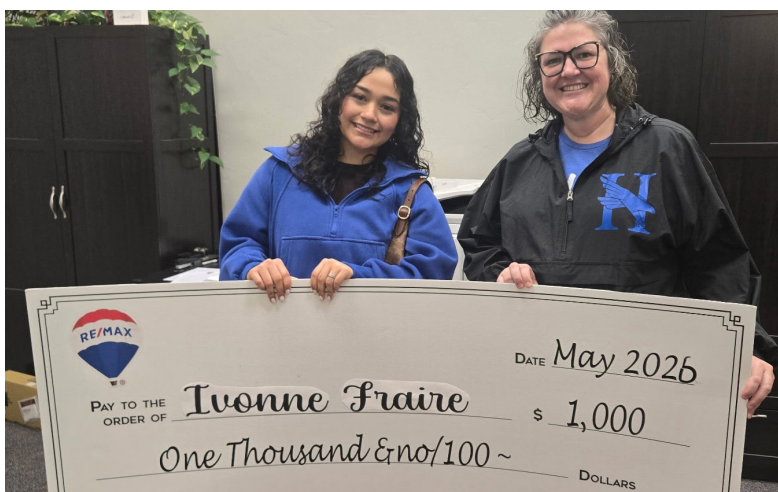

OKLAHOMA VOTERS PREPARE FOR JUNE 16 PRIMARY ELECTION

Oklahoma voters will head to the polls on Tuesday, June 16, for a statewide election that includes primary races, **State Question 832**, and several local issues across the state.

Election officials are reminding voters that all primary elections on the **June 16** ballot are closed primaries. **This means voters may only vote in the primary election for the political party with which they are registered.** Oklahoma law also prohibits voters from changing party affiliation between April 1 and August 31 during even-numbered years. Any party changes submitted during that time will not take effect until after August 31.

Voters are encouraged to verify their registration information and review sample ballots before Election Day. Instructions for registering to vote or updating voter registration can be found on the Oklahoma State Election Board website. HENNESSEY EMS DISTRICT VOTE SCHEDULED FOR JUNE 16

Voters within the Hennessey School District will head to the polls June 16 to decide whether to approve the creation of an Emergency Medical Services district funded through a 3-mill property tax levy. The proposal is commonly referred to as the "522 District."

Earlier this year, Garfield and Kingfisher County commissioners approved calling the election, allowing the issue to appear on the June ballot.

If approved, the district would provide funding dedicated solely to ambulance and emergency medical services for residents throughout the Hennessey School District, including rural areas outside town limits.

Supporters of the proposal say the measure is designed to help stabilize ambulance funding at a time when many rural communities across Oklahoma are facing rising operational costs, staffing shortages, and increasing pressure on emergency medical services.

Under the proposal, property taxes would increase by 3 mills. For many homeowners, that would amount to only a few dollars per month depending on property value.

Community leaders have said maintaining reliable ambulance coverage for both town and rural residents remains the primary goal of the proposed district.

The election will be held Tuesday, June 16, for all registered voters living within the Hennessey School District boundaries.

STATE QUESTION 832

Oklahoma voters will decide State Question 832 during the June 16 election. The proposal would gradually raise Oklahoma's minimum wage from the current \$7.25 per hour to \$15 per hour by 2029, with future increases tied to inflation.

Supporters Say SQ 832

- Help workers keep up with rising costs for groceries, housing, gas, and utilities.
- Increase pay for thousands of Oklahoma workers, especially in retail, food service, and other lower-paying jobs.
- Reduce dependence on government assistance by helping families become more financially stable.
- Keep Oklahoma competitive with neighboring states that already have higher minimum wages.
- Give businesses time to adjust because the increases would happen gradually over several years.

Opponents Say SQ 832

- Hurt small businesses, farms, and rural employers struggling with rising costs already.
- Lead to higher prices as businesses try to cover increased payroll expenses.
- Reduce jobs or employee hours, especially for younger or entry-level workers.
- Remove future wage decisions from Oklahoma lawmakers by automatically tying increases to inflation.
- Impact agriculture and seasonal industries by removing some current exemptions.

Critics also argue the inflation increases are tied to national economic data that can be heavily influenced by large, high-cost cities such as New York and Los Angeles. They say Oklahoma's lower cost of living and rural economy are very different from those larger cities.

Proposed Wage Schedule Under SQ 832

- * \$9.00 per hour in 2025
- * \$10.50 per hour in 2026
- * \$12.00 per hour in 2027
- * \$13.50 per hour in 2028
- * \$15.00 per hour in 2029

After 2029, future increases would be tied to inflation.

Supporters view SQ 832 as needed wage relief for working families, while opponents see it as a costly mandate that could strain small businesses and rural communities.
