## NEW TOWN MUNICIPAL CENTER DISCUSSED

At a recent budget planning meeting, Hennessey Town Trustees heard presentations from several departments regarding the condition of their facilities. Multiple departments reported challenges that have left them operating in less-than-ideal conditions, including the Police Department, Water Department, and the Library.

Hennessey Police Chief Christian Solis said the department has outgrown its current building and lacks adequate space for meetings and training. Officers currently use the school auditorium seminar room for training, but certain sensitive topics cannot be addressed in a school setting.

Town Administrator Tiffany Rowen introduced the idea of combining several departments into a new municipal center. Rowen noted that the town's swimming pool project will soon be paid off, and the existing sales tax could potentially be extended to fund construction of a new facility.

No formal plans were presented, but officials discussed the possibility of building the new center south of the current library. Rowen added that consolidating departments into one location could result in cost savings for the town.

Nationally, many communities are moving toward centralized municipal facilities. Supporters say this approach can improve access to services for residents while reducing the costs associated with maintaining multiple buildings.

## PIONEER TEAM TAKES RURAL BROADBAND MESSAGE TO WASHINGTON, D.C.

Members of Pioneer's leadership team recently traveled to Washington, D.C., where they spent several days sharing their story and advocating for the importance of rural broadband during the NTCA – The Rural Broadband Association Legislative and Policy Conference.

Leaders emphasized that broadband is more than just a convenience. It plays a vital role in supporting economic growth across rural Oklahoma, helping local businesses operate, expanding access to education and healthcare, and creating new opportunities for communities to grow and thrive.

Pioneer board member Stacy Cline said the group met with Oklahoma's elected officials to push for faster permitting processes, allowing fiber expansion projects to move forward more quickly.

"We talked to Oklahoma's elected officials to expedite permitting so that we could get fiber to customers that are still waiting," Cline said. "I got to help tell the story of how connectivity is changing our rural areas."

Funny thing though, nowhere in all that reading did it mention gossiping with a four-year-old. There's probably a good reason for that.

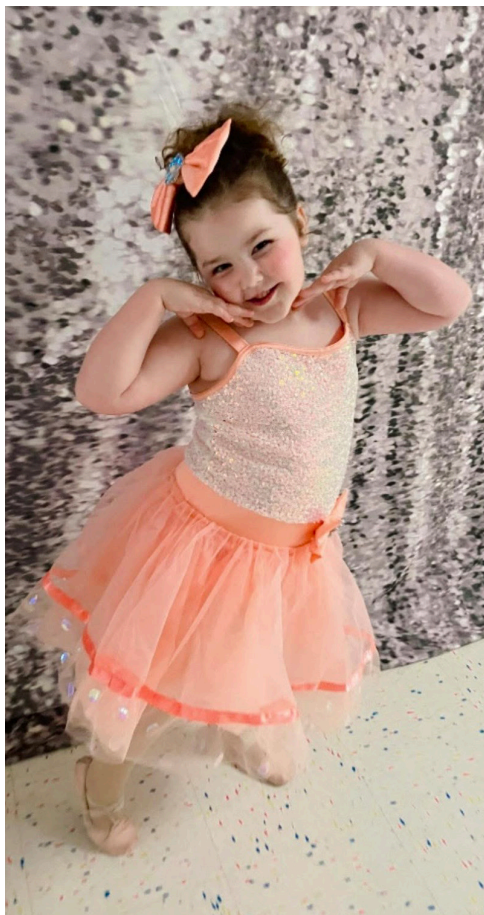

The Hennessey Varsity Eagles saw their season come to a close on April 29 with an 11-0 loss to Oklahoma Christian Varsity Saints, a game that was decided by a big fourth inning.

Oklahoma Christian got on the board early, using a pair of singles in the second inning to take a 1-0 lead. The Saints then broke things open in the fourth, scoring nine runs on a mix of timely hits, walks, and a couple of costly errors. That inning proved to be the difference, as Hennessey was unable to recover.

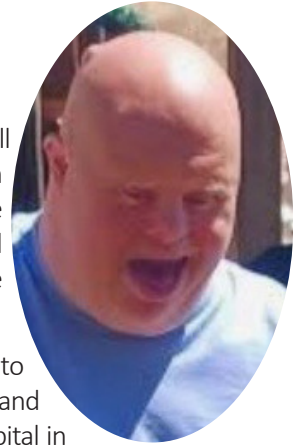

## VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE APPROACHES

May 22, 2026, is the last day to apply for voter registration in order to be eligible to vote in the June 16, 2026, Primary Election and Special Election: Kingfisher Co EMS (Hennessey School District), Kingfisher County Election Board Secretary Shawna Fulks said today.

Shawna Fulks said that persons who are United States Citizens, residents of Oklahoma, and at least 17 ½ years old are eligible to apply for voter registration. However, you must be at least 18 years old to vote.

Applications must be received by the County Election Board or postmarked no later than midnight, May 22, 2026. Applications postmarked after that time will be accepted, but will not be processed until after the June 16, 2026, Election. Applications may also be submitted to any motor vehicle agency that is also an official voter registration agency by the submission deadline.

Applicants will be notified in writing when their application has been processed. Approved voters will receive a Voter Identification Card in the mail. Some may receive a letter that explains the reason or reasons the application was not approved. Shawna Fulks said those who do not receive a response within 30 days of submitting their application should contact the County Election Board office immediately.

The Kingfisher County Election Board reminds voters that applications must be approved by the County Election Board Secretary in order to vote.

Registered voters who have moved to Kingfisher County from a different county or state will need to complete a new Voter Registration Application in order to be eligible for elections in Kingfisher County. If you have moved within the county and need to update your address, you may make changes online using the OK Voter Portal at [oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp](http://oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp) or complete a Voter Registration Application.

Voter Registration Applications can be downloaded from the State Election Board website at [oklahoma.gov/elections](http://oklahoma.gov/elections). You may also complete a form at your County Election Board. Most post offices, tag agencies, and public libraries have applications available upon request. The Kingfisher County Election Board is located at 101 S Main St., Room#8 and is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. 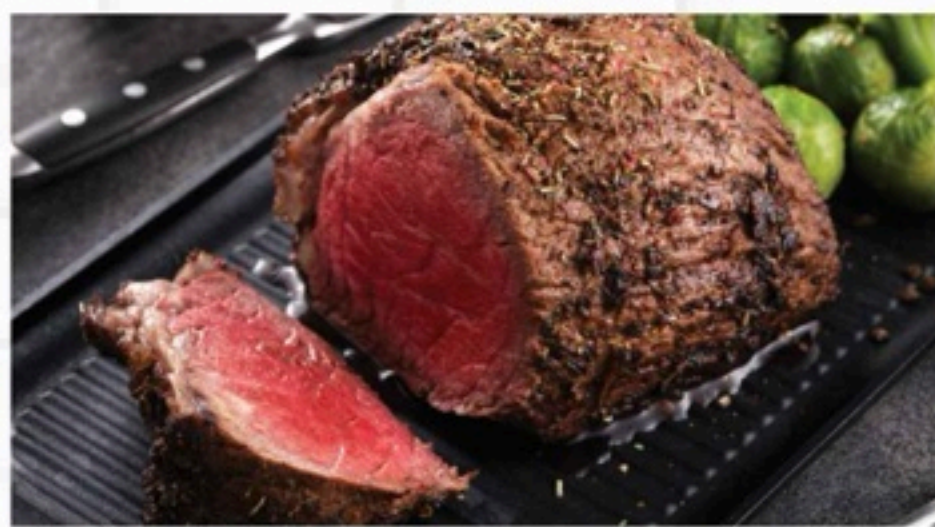

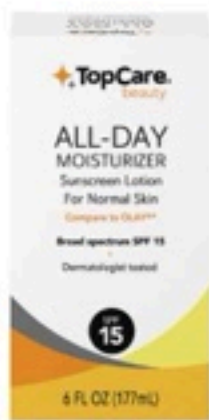
