HENNESSEY HIRES HELP WITH CODE ENFORCEMENT

The Hennessey Board of Trustees has voted to hire Henry Code Enforcement of Enid to help the town address code compliance issues involving weeds, trash, abandoned vehicles, dilapidated structures and other property maintenance concerns.

At the July 14 Board of Trustees meeting, Brian Henry, owner of Henry Code Enforcement, presented a proposal to assist the town with nuisance complaints and code violations.

Town Administrator Tiffany Rowen said using a third-party company helps remove the perception of favoritism that can arise in a small community when local employees are responsible for enforcing code violations involving friends, neighbors or other residents.

Henry explained that his company currently provides code enforcement services to numerous Oklahoma communities. He said the company's approach is to first work with property owners through courtesy notices and give them an opportunity to correct violations before stronger enforcement measures are pursued.

Code enforcement continued

During the August 11 Board of Trustees meeting, trustees voted unanimously to hire Henry Code Enforcement.

According to Town Hall, three of the most common code enforcement issues in Hennessey are weeds and trash, dilapidated buildings and abandoned motor vehicles.

Weeds and Trash

Under Hennessey's town code, "trash" includes refuse, litter, ashes, leaves, debris, paper, combustible materials, rubbish, waste and other unused or uncared-for materials.

Weeds include vegetation exceeding 12 inches in height, with exceptions for healthy trees, shrubs and tended gardens. Vegetation may also be considered a violation, regardless of height, if it harbors trash, rodents or vermin, gives off unpleasant odors, creates a fire or traffic hazard, or is dead or diseased.

Dilapidated Buildings

Under Oklahoma state law, a dilapidated building can include a structure that has fallen into decay or partial ruin to the point that it poses a hazard to public health, safety or welfare.

The definition can also include a structure that is unfit for human occupancy because of a lack of necessary repairs, has repeatedly been determined to be unsecured, has been boarded and secured for more than six consecutive months, or has been declared a public nuisance by the municipality.

Abandoned Motor Vehicles

Hennessey's code defines an abandoned motor vehicle as a vehicle that does not have insurance verification and an unexpired license plate, and is in disrepair, wrecked, dismantled, partially dismantled, inoperative, abandoned or discarded and incapable of being moved under its own power.

At the end of the night, all of the crews gathered in the school parking lot for a group photo. While the trucks were being arranged, things quickly turned into an all-out water fight between the departments.

That battle also included this photographer, who had somehow managed to stay dry most of the night. That winning streak came to an abrupt end.

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SENIOR SUNRISE KICKS OFF A SPECIAL YEAR

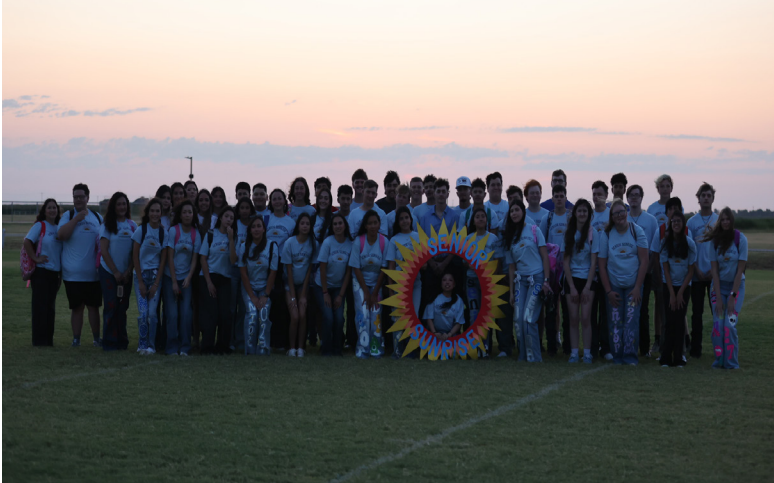


The Hennessey High School seniors started their final year together with a Senior Sunrise at the football field.

on the field. The Hennessey Fire Department was also there grilling up their famous ribeye steak sandwiches, making a hot evening a whole lot tastier.



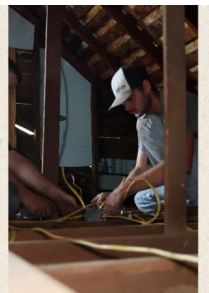

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FROM AMES TO BONNEVILLE: BRENT HAJEK'S WILD RIDE THROUGH MOTORSPORTS HISTORY

What started with a love of fast cars has taken Brent Hajek from a small Oklahoma town to Bonneville, Talladega and some of the biggest names in American motorsports.

There aren't many places where you can find nearly 100 historic race cars tucked inside an old school building in a town of fewer than 200 people.

Then again, there aren't many people quite like Brent Hajek. All About Network's Jack Quirk recently sat down with longtime friend Hajek to talk about how a kid growing up around Hennessey, Oklahoma, became a collector, racer and caretaker of some of the most significant cars in American motorsports history.

For Hajek, it started during the car-crazy 1960s. His uncle came home with a 1965 Shelby GT350 and proudly told young Brent it had more horsepower than three tractors. Around the same time, cousins and neighbors were driving big-block Fords and Dodges around the area.

"For a small town, there were quite a few cool cars and pickups around here," Hajek recalled. His own first car wasn't exactly a beginner model, either, a 1969 428 Mustang. Even better, he still owns it today. The collecting came almost by accident.

Hajek wanted to build a faster drag car but discovered it would actually be cheaper to buy an old Ford Thunderbolt Fairlane than build a Camaro or Mustang from scratch.

Today, a genuine Thunderbolt can easily be a six-figure collector car. Hajek remembers paying about \$2,000 for his. He didn't buy it as an investment. He bought it because it was fast. When he began taking the old car to drag strips, however, something unexpected happened. People recognized it.

That led to other historic cars, including one raced by legendary

drag racer "Dyno Don" Nicholson. Before long, people were approaching Hajek at tracks with tips about where other forgotten race cars were sitting.

The collection grew, and so did Hajek's connection with the National Hot Rod Association.

NHRA founder Wally Parks took an interest in what Hajek was doing and began having him bring historic cars to major events around the country. Hajek later learned Parks had Oklahoma roots of his own, growing up in Goltry and even knowing Hajek's grandfather. Through those events, Hajek began meeting the men whose names he had grown up reading about, including Bob Glidden, Gas Ronda, Jack Roush and others.

"The thing that really blew my mind," Hajek said, was watching his childhood heroes eventually become his friends.

What began with a handful of cars stored at home eventually outgrew Hajek's garage and shop. Then came an unusual opportunity, the former Ames school.

After the school consolidated with Lahoma to form Cimarron Schools, the building eventually went up for auction.

Hajek showed up. So did nobody else. He bought it.

Today, the former school houses the Hajek Motorsports Museum and more than 80 cars, although Hajek jokingly warned Quirk, "Don't ask how many are running."

The museum's collection expanded beyond drag racing into NASCAR, with cars connected to racing legends including Richard Petty, Bobby Allison, Junior Johnson, Ned Jarrett and Bill Elliott. Hajek said three cars from his collection are currently displayed at the NASCAR Hall of Fame. Quirk's friendship with Hajek has led to some adventures of its own.

Years ago, Hajek called Quirk on Thanksgiving Day with an idea involving a Mustang, a dirt road and a rapidly approaching meeting with Ford executives.

Quirk soon learned that when Brent calls with an idea, you may only get half the story. The rest becomes clear somewhere along the way.

The resulting video helped Hajek land a deal with Ford and launched a years-long adventure involving the Bonneville Salt Flats, Talladega Superspeedway, SEMA, wind-tunnel testing and land-speed records.

The Mustang eventually topped 250 mph at Bonneville with Danny Thompson driving and later went to Talladega with NASCAR legend Bill Elliott behind the wheel.

At more than 200 mph, Elliott even introduced the Mustang to the Talladega wall.

"He scraped the wall a little bit," Hajek said with considerable understatement.

For Quirk, one of the most personal surprises came the first time Hajek showed him the museum.

Growing up in Rhode Island, Quirk lived near the famous Tasca family and grew up with the three Tasca boys. Tasca was one of the most influential Ford dealerships in the country, responsible for many of the Ford muscle cars that became famous.

Quirk recalled, "I remember standing at the bus stop watching the parade of cool Fords driving by on their way to work or school each day. On several occasions, I missed the bus and recall riding to school in the legendary Tasca Street Boss Mustang." Decades later and roughly 1,600 miles away, Quirk walked into Hajek's museum in Ames and found that very car. "What the hell's it doing in Ames?" Quirk remembered thinking. It was one more example of how a little Oklahoma town somehow became a crossroads for racing history.

And that history isn't just parked in rows. One of the things that makes Hajek's museum unusual is the documentation surrounding the cars. Visitors can see old magazines, photographs, posters and memorabilia that tell the stories of the vehicles and the people who raced them. Hajek continues taking historic cars around the country to major racing events, doing for NASCAR much of what he began doing with NHRA decades ago, keeping the sport's history in front of new generations of fans.

As Hajek put it, without the past, you don't have a future. The Hajek Motorsports Museum is normally available by appointment, although Hajek has his own description of the schedule.

"We're never open," Quirk joked. "But we're never closed," Hajek quickly replied. And that may be the best description of the museum, and Brent Hajek himself.

Somewhere inside an old school in tiny Ames, Oklahoma, sits a remarkable collection of American racing history, assembled by a guy who never really set out to build a museum.

He just liked fast cars. Things got a little out of hand. Watch the full video at AllAboutHennessey.com.

tearing out the old. "We'll see floors that are 50 years old and in desperate need of updating. Once they're removed, seeing the bones of the house is almost cathartic. It's the beginning of the healing process." Greyson said.
